#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



The Jesuits of the United States sponsor a terrific resource for your spiritual life, AMDG: A Jesuit Podcast. I recommend it highly. You can find it here: https://soundcloud.com/jesuitconference

I listened to an especially good one while on retreat last month. It was an interview with Dr. Mahri Leonard-Fleckman a scripture scholar at Holy Cross College. Her field is the Hebrew Scriptures. Dr. Leonard-Fleckman spoke about how very challenging texts from the Bible speak to us in our own troubled times. She describes how certain passages pull us into the muck of human life and grapple with the complexities of the world. One must go in and through the difficult to gain any sort of wisdom about God and ourselves.

Our usual way of proceeding is to search for a text that can console, or perhaps teach us something. Certain books of the Old Testament call us instead to sit with discomfort, suffering, and God's apparent absence. We are invited to engage with what is difficult rather than avoid it.

This is not what we prefer. As good Americans the quick and easy fix is always best. However, this year has taught us ignoring harsh truths does not change them. There is no spiritual growth that comes cheap. Change, for individuals and communities, requires honest reckoning with the muck.

Archbishop Rozanski has asked all parishes in the Archdiocese of St. Louis to participate in a **second collection this week for the Bishops' Emergency Disaster Fund.** Contributions will be used to support the efforts of Catholic Charities USA and/or Catholic Relief Services, the office relief agencies of the U.S. Catholic Church, and distributed where they are most needed.

If you are contributing by check, you can put a note in the memo line saying the contribution is for the Emergency Disaster Fund.

## Openings on the SFX Pastoral Council

The St. Francis Xavier (College) Church Pastoral Council is a group composed of the pastor and twelve active, adult parishioners who meet regularly to deliberate, reflect, and make decisions on a variety of issues related to the operations, programming, and spiritual life of the parish. The Pastoral Council provides support and direction to the various parish Commissions and Committees, and is generally charged with making sure that all activities support the parish's Mission. There will be four openings on the Pastoral Council starting in January 2020. Council members serve for a three-year term with the option to serve a second term. The group meets one Saturday morning per month, and also participates actively in various special events throughout the year. A parishioner may nominate another parishioner or nominate himself/herself.

#### **PROCESS**

Nominees will be asked to submit a short statement explaining their interest in serving on the Council answering the following three questions: (I) What has drawn you to SFX College Church, and what are your hopes for the future of the parish? (2) What background and experience, either professional, personal, or as a parishioner, would you bring to the Council and how would you apply it? (3) Can you commit to regular attendance and participation at Council meetings and, from time to time, assisting with special projects or events?

Fr. Dan will meet with each nominee to discern whether or not the nominee would be a good fit for the council.

Sales of fair trade products have resumed **online only** to benefit St. Peter Claver in Punta Gorda, Belize. Because of the pandemic, as well as a series of fires which destroyed farms in the community, unemployment in the area has increased dramatically. All the proceeds from our Fair Trade sales go directly to St. Peter Claver.

Hand Delivery (only for orders of \$20 or more): One of our volunteers will deliver your products to your porch or in front of your home. If requesting delivery of orders which contain chocolate, please plan for immediate retrieval of your package in order to protect chocolate from melting. Volunteers will ring your doorbell/buzzer or knock on your door when dropping off items.

<u>Pick-up at College Church (orders of any value):</u> Pick-ups at the College Church will be pre-collected into bags with the buyer's name displayed on the outside of the bag, available from 9-10:15am outside of the Ballroom (below the church) on the designated Sundays. We ask that parishioners wear a face mask and continue to practice social distancing during pick-up.

#### November - Month of Prayer for the Faithful Departed

On November I, Feast of All Saints we thank God for and celebrate all the saints, living and deceased, canonized and not, whose lives have borne witness to their discipleship and provide us with example and inspiration.

On Monday, November 2 we celebrate the Feast of All Souls. The Church has a long-standing and beautiful practice of praying for the dead. Jesus prayed that he "should not lose anything of what (the Father) gave me, but that I should raise it on the last day". Those who have died may still be in that process of purification that we have termed purgatory. Bolstered by our belief in the communion of saints, and as a way to keep them close to us, we surround them with our love and prayers as they transition into the fullness of life and love. Praying for the dead reminds us that death is not the end, but rather the beginning of a new life in God.

On November 2 we will have our annual Mass of Remembrance for those who have died in the past year. It will be held at 5:15 pm in the main church. All are welcome, especially those who have lost loved ones during the past year. For those unable to be physically present, the mass will be livestreamed.

We will continue our prayerful remembrance of our deceased loved ones throughout the month of November. We will again have a shrine area set up with pictures of our loved ones and candles. If you would like to bring a picture of your loved one to be placed in this area, please bring it by the weekend of Oct 25th. Be sure to have the name of the person as well as your name on the back so that we can return it to you at the end of the month. Our Book of Remembrance will be there as well, and you are welcome to add the names of those whom you would like us to pray for throughout the month.
