FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



We are well into autumn here in Missouri. This is the traditional harvest time in the northern hemisphere. Most of us are far removed from our agrarian roots. When the local Schnucks is loaded with aisle after aisle of food, it is quite easy to take such super-abundance for granted. This is not normal, though. Throughout most of human history a good harvest was the difference between life and death. In fact, the harvest was perhaps the most significant annual event a society celebrated. Even today the Church has a mass setting for "After the Harvest" that expresses gratitude for the earth's fruits.

I suggest as the days grow shorter and cooler we reflect on God's gift of food. Most of us have never known true hunger in our lives. We do not give much thought to the farmers, harvesters, and laborers whose hard work and sweat enable us to enjoy our meals. Keep in mind, as well, many who help put food on our tables are undocumented migrants who have become the target of merciless outrage in this country.

I believe the true end of fall is not the winter solstice, but the celebration of Thanksgiving. It is the one time all year when we as a nation call to mind our blessings. We do so, of course, with a wonderful meal. Perhaps during these beautiful, autumn days we should be more magnanimous with our thanks, and not limit it to the last Thursday in November.

Our Leadership Transition: Becoming a more Synodal Church

A Call to Discernment

The transition in our leadership is a watershed moment in the history of our parish, and one that calls for new forms of engagement. Pope Francis has reminded us that we should be a Church whose members, clergy and laity both, are discerning our direction; a Church in which each person's potential is recognized and their contributions fully valued; a Church in which we all participate fully.

To that end, we are inviting everyone to consider attending a house meeting. In these meetings, we want to talk in more detail about what the transition means or may mean, to hear your honest reactions, and to gather input on how you and other parishioners can guide College Church through this transition. We hope by meeting as small groups, we can begin to be the Church we hope to become—one in which our lay members take an active role in discernment about our future.

We've had a number of house meetings already, and they have been an opportunity to engage in rich conversations. We welcome the chance to hear from everyone in the parish, and to also use this process to build relationships in our community. In addition to the in-person meetings, we will be offering some virtual meeting times soon.

From the Preparatory Document for the global Synod on Synodality:

The Church of God is convoked in Synod. The path entitled "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission" will solemnly open on the 9th – 10th of October 2021 in Rome and on the following 17th of October in each particular Church.

Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: "It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium." This journey, which follows in the wake of the Church's "renewal" proposed by the Second Vatican Council, is both a gift and a task: by journeying together and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through Her experience which processes can help Her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission. Our "journeying together" is, in fact, what most effectively enacts and manifests the nature of the Church as the pilgrim and missionary People of God.

Antiracism at College Church Racial Justice Vigils

Last May the Racism and Reconciliation Committee reinstated the Racial Justice Vigils in front of SFX College Church. Our gathering every Tuesday evening from 6-7pm is a way to witness to others that we seek to follow the Social Justice directive to love all people. We pray for those who experience racial injustice and for those who perpetrate it. Our weekly gathering allows people driving and walking by to know that our Catholic Church is committed to the dignity and safety of black and brown people as much as that of white people. We demonstrate that commitment by standing together for an hour to pray. The programs include excerpts from Scripture, litanies, Amanda Gorman's poems, Frederick Douglas's 1852 speech, and reflections on racism from Jesuits and other social justice advocates. The moments between our spoken prayer are filled with the silent prayer in our hearts.

In addition to members of our committee and College Church parishioners, this prayer community comprises Franciscan Sisters of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, some Jesuits, a few young people who work or go to school in the area, and a few passersby. Some weeks there were 20 and sometimes only 8, but always called by the Holy Spirit to "show up" for racial equity and justice.

As the drivers who passed tooted their horns in appreciation, rolled their windows down and took pictures, yelled "thank you," raised their fists in the air, or slowed their cars to see what we were about, we recognized they appreciated our efforts. They were little shouts of joy in their day and ours.

We will hold our last vigil for this year on October 26, due to weather and darkness. Even if not gathered in person, we continue to pray for racial justice and see what spring holds.

The Importance of Asian American Pacific Islander History



Earlier this year, Illinois became the first state to pass legislation requiring that the history of Asian Americans be

taught in all public elementary and secondary schools. The TEAACH Act amends a school code that already directs teachers to present the contributions of many racial and ethnic groups as part of the study of American History. Advocates praise this decision as a step toward more accurately understanding the full history of the United States and in so doing, better understand the challenges and opportunities we see today. Scheduled to take effect for the 2022-23 school year, the new law stipulates that instruction address the unjust treatment endured by Asian Americans, as well as the leadership they demonstrated and their many achievements that support our social, political, economic, and artistic development. Perhaps most noteworthy is the intention stated within the statute: "The studying of this material shall constitute an affirmation by students of their commitment to respect the dignity of all races and peoples and to forever eschew every form of discrimination in their lives and careers." That guiding principle will be essential as educators determine how to most effectively communicate the experience and contributions of people who represent 50 different ethnic groups and 100 different languages. People who identify as Chinese, Japanese, Vietnamese, Filipino, Laotian, Indian, Lebanese, Pakistani, Sri Lankan, and so many others each have unique stories and gifts to share.

In recent months we have been reminded of the bias, mistreatment, and violence against Asian-Americans, prompting this legislation with similar proposals under consideration in other states. Perhaps less widely recognized is the burden born by both the opportunity and sacrifice that comes with assimilation into US culture. Too seldom acknowledged is the effort and dedication spent in pursuit of success and the vast diversity of talents among people of Asian American descent.

As we continue to live into our vision of becoming an antiracist parish, we are called to an increasing understanding and compassion of all who desire to be part of this faith community. May we seek the grace to let no one feel they are foreign and let all know they belong.

SFX History Highlights

One of the activities associated with our upcoming parish racial equity review is an in-depth analysis of the history of College Church. Because of the age of our parish, its history is intimately interwoven with that of the City of St. Louis and the St. Louis Archdiocese. Consequently, over the course of nearly two centuries College Church has both influenced, and been affected by, the region's most significant historical events.

Our historical analysis is designed to identify the ways in which College Church, as an institution, has helped to construct and legitimize the systemic oppression of those who have been marginalized due to characteristics such as race, class, or nationality. But the study will also highlight those moments when our parish took a stance to resist such oppression. We will be assisted in this exploration by the Crossroads Antiracism and Training Organization, because an understanding of our history is considered foundational to the equity review process. As this exploration reveals the most notable and fascinating facts of our history, those details will be shared as a regularly appearing feature in this section of our bulletin. SFX history highlights—look for them soon!

The Winter Inn is run entirely by volunteers and provides hospitality on nights when temperatures drop below 20 degrees. We have hosted Winter Inn for nearly a decade and this will be our second year during the pandemic offering shelter in a COVID-safe environment for both volunteers and guests.
