FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

An essential theme of the Old Testament could be described as "holy remembering": a deliberate exercise in recalling the events of the past in order to understand the present. Over and over God tells the people of Israel to remember what He has done for them, and how this must form their present actions. A failure to do so always gets them in trouble.

The most important work of God was the deliverance from slavery in Egypt, the giving of the Law, and the entrance into the Promised Land. That defining action is constantly being returned to as the template of God's faithfulness. It is an inexhaustible gift that continues to form the people. That experience of liberation is not part of the distant past but is the lens to view everything that follows.

How should Israel respond to aliens and foreigners in their midst? By remembering they too were once strangers in a strange land. They cannot forget their own experience of hardship and injustice. God treated them with compassion and mercy. They are to do the same for the vulnerable among them.

Holy remembering enables us to see God at work in our lives. It helps us understand the presence of the Spirit. Remembrance leads to gratitude. What is true and good is always so. When it comes to salvation history, the past is prologue.

Openings on the SFX Pastoral Council

The St. Francis Xavier (College) Church Pastoral Council is a group composed of the pastor and twelve active, adult parishioners who meet regularly to deliberate, reflect, and make decisions on a variety of issues related to the operations, programming, and spiritual life of the parish. The Pastoral Council provides support and direction to the various parish Commissions and Committees, and is generally charged with making sure that all activities support the parish's Mission. There will be four openings on the Pastoral Council starting in January 2020. Council members serve for a three-year term with the option to serve a second term. The group meets one Saturday morning per month, and also participates actively in various special events throughout the year. A parishioner may nominate another parishioner or nominate himself/herself.

PROCESS

Nominees will be asked to submit a short statement explaining their interest in serving on the Council answering the following three questions: (1) What has drawn you to SFX College Church, and what are your hopes for the future of the parish? (2) What background and experience, either professional, personal, or as a parishioner, would you bring to the Council and how would you apply it? (3) Can you commit to regular attendance and participation at Council meetings and, from time to time, assisting with special projects or events?

Fr. Dan will meet with each nominee to discern whether or not the nominee would be a good fit for the council.

Sales of fair trade products have resumed **online only** to benefit St. Peter Claver in Punta Gorda, Belize. Because of the pandemic, as well as a series of fires which destroyed farms in the community, unemployment in the area has increased dramatically. All the proceeds from our Fair Trade sales go directly to St. Peter Claver.

Pick-up at College Church (orders of any value): Pick-ups at the College Church will be pre-collected into bags with the buyer’s name displayed on the outside of the bag, available from 9-10:15am outside of the Ballroom (below the church) on the designated Sundays. We ask that parishioners wear a face mask and continue to practice social distancing during pick-up.

This week’s tip:

Week 48 (October 25-31): Attempt to create zero food waste this week. Food waste makes up 22 percent of the solid waste in U.S. landfills and it can take years to break down because there’s not usually enough air in landfills to aid in food decomposition. And according to the USDA, 30 to 40 percent of the food we produce in the U.S. often goes uneaten. Your challenge for the week is to stop contributing to those food waste numbers; use every bit of food you have in your fridge and pantry before it goes bad.

Faith and Civic Engagement

College Church is a member congregation of Metropolitan Congregations United (MCU), which “puts faith into action by developing leaders who move their congregations, organizations, and communities to change public policy for the common good.” Their work addresses issues and systems that disadvantage people who are marginalized.
