This will be the first in-person version we've hosted in several years. This is an opportunity for all of us to get to know about the rich variety of ministries, commissions and teams that make this such a vibrant church. ### The State of Identification Documents in Missouri

As the Birth Certificate and Identification Program continues to grow, a core group of parishioners and community leaders have come together to envision ways to bring this essential service beyond the walls of College Church, into more organizations across St. Louis and throughout the whole state. Lessons learned from the experience of the Mobile Outreach Coordinator from August 2021-July 2022 have informed a new strategy aimed at regional access to government issued identification.



Our weekly Tuesday onsite programming remains an essential need and will continue under the leadership of Outreach Coordinator, Jasmine Brown. As new Regional Access Coordinator, I have continued to develop training and support materials to share with partner organizations in St. Louis and across the state of Missouri who are interested in starting similar state ID and birth certificate assistance programming. The relationships built through our regional access efforts, in addition to the recent passage of a photo ID requirement for voting in Missouri, have galvanized all kinds of groups statewide.

Since the beginning of August, the College Church Outreach Program has held nearly a dozen sessions to train at least 118 people across the state of Missouri. Fifty eight people are committed to meeting more regularly to continue developing their programs, as well as make regional connections. In our first monthly meeting we had thirty energized individuals present. These individuals represent 68 different organizations from every corner of the state. We are excited to see these efforts grow so that we can work toward a state where everyone has access to the official identification they need, regardless of income level, housing status, geographic location, or any other factor.

### All Things New

*All Things New* is the Archdiocesan planning process to develop evangelizing and vibrant parishes throughout the Archdiocese. Many parishioners completed the Disciple Maker Index during Lent. In late summer and September, priests, deacons, parish life coordinators, and parish leadership gathered to hear some proposed models for parish reconfiguration. In October, parishioners are invited to learn about these models at either of two listening sessions. Each are on Saturday mornings from 9:00 until 11:00 and they are both the same presentation.

## Antiracism at College Church

At College Church, antiracism is an expression of our recognition that all are created in the image of God. As such, we respond—personally and collectively—to the call to identify, and to actively challenge, structures and systems that devalue people on the basis of race, and to practice restoration in the pursuit of justice.

### Join the Fight for Immigration Justice with IFCLA!

The Interfaith Committee on Latin America (IFCLA) is a pro-immigrant rights organization that works in the St. Louis area. Our mission consists of convening an interfaith community to walk side by side with the people of Latin America in their work for human rights and social justice through education, organizing, and accompaniment. Most of the people that we work with are undocumented immigrants, and we build relationships among allies and directly impacted communities to effect change in the United States’ policies and laws. We prioritize human connection and center immigrant leadership in order to abolish destructive systems, all under an antiracist and intersectional commitment that believes that immigrant justice cannot be achieved without also fighting racism, sexism, and all forms of oppression.



IFCLA was formed by an interreligious group of individuals who wanted to practice their faith by supporting Central American refugees and social justice activists during the armed conflict in the 1970s and 1980s. The US was heavily responsible, on the one hand, for the violence and repression in this conflict, which produced a massive amount of devastation and migration in the region, and on the other for the domestic anti-immigrant rhetoric and policy that continues to this day. Officially since 1982, after 40 years advocating for a more inclusive and just Missouri, we continue to fight for equality, declaring that no one is illegal.

We have three main programs. First, the Accompaniment Program in which we help immigrants navigate the immigration system with our ICE accompaniment project, Pro Se Asylum Clinics, and Work Authorization (and Renewal) clinics; serve as a point of contact throughout duration of asylum cases; support the immigrant led anti-detention Migrant<sup>es</sup> Unidos group; and assist *compas* (friends) to the immigration court in Kansas City or consulates in Chicago. Second, the Organizing Program through which we arrange Advocacy days in Jefferson City; protests as necessary; and virtual advocacy opportunities. Finally, the Education Program which offers Immigration 101 workshops; Conociendo La Migra (Knowing Migration) workshops for Spanish speaking immigrants; Advocacy 101 opportunities; and our book club.

Our programs do not receive economic assistance from the government, due to our unapologetic choice to serve the undocumented community, nor do we accept money from private institutions or congregations that limit our capacity to practice our principles or intend to censor our work for justice. Over the last five years our programs have primarily supported low-income Latine/x immigrant and mixed-status families in the St. Louis region, where women and children are the majority served. Our work has seen incredible outcomes in the last years. In February 2021 Alex García left sanctuary and was reunited with his family after living in a church for 1,252 days; the Immigrant Family Emergency Response (IFER) Fund has raised and redistributed more than \$440,000 in direct cash assistance to immigrant and mixed-status families in the region who suffered financially during the pandemic; IFCLA has trained 367 Christian, Jewish, and non-religious volunteers to accompany 262 immigrants to over 800 check-ins at local immigration offices in an effort to humanize and decriminalize our neighbors; and, we supported over 171 individuals’ asylum applications through our Pro Se Clinics. Additionally, in 2020 we helped launch Migrant<sup>es</sup> Unidos (MU), a paid leadership team of asylum seekers who develop strategies to eliminate the criminalizing surveillance tactics used against them. In fall 2021, we were awarded a substantial multi-year grant from the Henry Luce Foundation to support the development of similar hubs across the Midwest.

Thanks to the success of these programs, partnerships,

and IFCLA's 40-year history, we are growing into a statewide, immigrant-led organization, guided by our community's collective vision of a more welcoming and dignity filled Missouri. Our work depends on the economic support and volunteer work of committed social justice individuals and organizations that believe in the power of radical inclusion and uncompromising collective liberation. ### National Indigenous Peoples' Day

Tomorrow, October 10, 2022, many communities around the United States will celebrate National Indigenous Peoples Day. The holiday acknowledges the histories, cultures, and contributions of Native American people and recognizes Indigenous communities that have lived on the land we now know as the United States for thousands of years.



The idea of Indigenous Peoples' Day was initially put forward in 1977 at a U.N. international conference on discrimination. South Dakota, in 1989, was the first state to recognize the day. In 1992, Berkeley, CA, designated the day as an alternative to the 500th anniversary of Columbus landing on American shores which, from the perspective of many Indigenous groups, marks the introduction of violent colonization in the Western hemisphere.

In 2021, President Biden formally honored the day with a proclamation, stating, "Today, we recognize Indigenous peoples' resilience and strength as well as the immeasurable positive impact that they have made on every aspect of American society." Supporters of the day say it may help bring attention to some of the ways Indigenous peoples have been disproportionately affected by climate change, gender violence, health issues such as Covid, and the appropriation of Indigenous lands for mining and drilling projects. Alannah Hurley, executive director of a consortium of Indigenous communities in Southwest Alaska, says that the holiday may help to counter their struggle with invisibility, enabling others to realize that "we are not just in history books." Approximately, 80,000 Native Americans currently reside in Missouri. While fourteen states, the District of Columbia, and more than 130 cities in the U.S. celebrate Indigenous Peoples Day, congressional legislation is required to make it a federal holiday. Similar commemorative days exist under other names, both within the United States and around the world.

## Our Parish Racial History: Past As Prelude

Focusing on the period from the late nineteenth through the mid-twentieth centuries, presenters will introduce the Jesuits who were in active ministry with Black Catholics at that time; will celebrate the faithfulness and resilience of St. Elizabeth of Hungary Catholic Church—the designated Black Catholic parish; and will examine the tensions between the Black leadership of the Federation of Colored Catholics and its Jesuit allies.

### Faithful Citizenship: Your Vote Matters

With a new voting law in effect, House Bill 1878, the newly formed SFX Advocacy Committee wants to ensure that College Church parishioners and our wider community can access the ballot this November and beyond. One of the most harmful aspects of HB1878 is the new requirement to produce a nonexpired photo ID in order to vote, which will greatly impact many Missourians who cannot readily obtain a State ID. These are the people that come to our parish's weekly Outreach Program for help with birth certificates and Missouri State IDs. Leading up to the November election, we will share reflections from volunteers and staff connected to our ID and Birth Certificate Program. Americorps VISTA Communications Development Member Brendan Underwood shared this:



*It is not an exaggeration to say that birth certificates and state IDs are some of the most fundamental documents that children and adults need to pursue fulfilling lives. At the Outreach Program, I hear the stories of people who spent weeks trying to navigate their local DMV and city hall for their critical documents for them to be told they lack the needed information without any guidance or next steps. While many are running around trying to figure out what documents they need, they are also losing money because they must take time off work, which can lead to even less money to pay for the ID or the Birth Certificate. Many of the guests rightly point out that they felt like they were going down a spiral fast. One young man left his abusive home at 20 years old and tried to rebuild his life, but he soon fell prey to that very same spiral. He could not get an apartment or find employment, because both needed official documentation. The young man felt the weight of being stuck come off his shoulders even though he knew still had a hard path. The Outreach Program has seen record numbers of people, but much more is needed. Birth certificates and state IDs should not be a barrier to your life and your rights.*

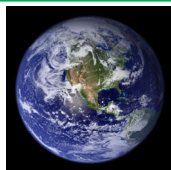
