### Retirement Fund for Religious

Each November, we are invited to help support those women and men religious whose ministry has nourished our own faith, served our church, and strengthened our nation. Of 517 communities providing data, only 36 are adequately funded for retirement. Historically, Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious order priests received very little pay. Any surplus funds were reinvested in ministry and the education of younger members. As a result,

hundreds of US religious communities lack adequate retirement savings. Like many Americans, religious communities face the monumental challenge of funding eldercare. Currently, the average annual cost of care for women and men religious past age 70 is nearly \$51,000 per person. Skilled care is roughly \$78,000. The total cost of care for senior religious in the United States has exceeded \$1 billion annually for over a decade. Your donation will assist numerous religious communities in meeting the day-to-day needs and healthcare of their aging members and their health care expenses. Your gift makes a difference!

## Celebrating Black Catholic History Month at College Church

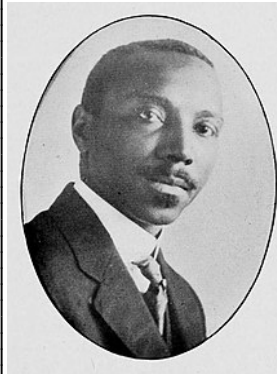
November is Black Catholic History Month. It was instituted by the National Black Clergy Caucus in 1990. For the last several years, our parish has participated in this celebration by highlighting the gifts and contributions of Black Catholics. We recognize the many black saints and holy people who are part of our Catholic heritage as well as the current Catholic community in St. Louis. We have shared their stories by displaying informational posters, articles in the bulletin, and video interviews.

This year our focus will be to tell the stories of those individuals whose lives are directly connected to our own parish history but have remained less well known. During the month of November posters will be displayed in church and these important stories will be included in our weekly bulletin. In addition, the final presentation of Our Parish Racial History on November 20th will provide further insight into the important role played by members of the black community in achieving greater equity and justice in our city, in the St. Louis Archdiocese, at St. Louis University, and in our own parish.

### Thomas Wyatt Turner

Thomas W. Turner was born in 1877 in southern Maryland where his family worked as sharecroppers. He was baptized Catholic as an infant and grew up celebrating Mass in a racially segregated gallery of the church. After being denied entry to Catholic schools, Turner completed his secondary educational in county schools and an Episcopal school. Offered a college scholarship if he converted to become Episcopalian, Turner chose to remain Catholic. His college education included a bachelor's and master's degrees in botany. He completed some graduate study in science at Catholic University before the initiation of Jim Crow segregation, however he soon ran out of funds. He went on to earn a Ph.D. from Cornell University, the first black person to do so in any field of study. He was also the first African American student to earn a Ph.D. in botany in the United States. During his career, he taught science at Tuskegee Institute and other secondary schools, including a high school in St. Louis. Later he served as professor of botany at Howard University and at Hampton Institute.

Throughout his career, Thomas Wyatt Turner advocated for justice in society and in the Catholic Church. In 1909 he became a founding member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored



People and served as the first secretary of the Baltimore branch. Dr. Turner frequently appealed to the Catholic University of America to accept black students, and he petitioned the U.S. bishops to provide better education for black children at all levels. In 1924 he founded an organization called the Federated Colored Catholics.

This group wrote letters to bishops protesting discrimination in Catholic churches, schools, hospitals, orphanages, seminaries, and convents. They worked to increase access to Catholic education, promote black vocations, especially to the priesthood, and to expand participation in the Church and in civic affairs. While the FCC disbanded in 1952, it laid a foundation for other national Black Catholic organizations such as the National Black Catholic Congress that continue today.

In May of 1976, the Catholic University of America awarded Turner an honorary Doctor of Science degree. He passed away in 1978 at the age of 101.

### Coming This Fall...!

On November 15, the Catholic Racial Justice Collaborative (CRJC) will release the first issue of its new bimonthly circular, VOCL, A Voice of Catholic Laity. The newsletter will contain a variety of features including timely articles, opinion pieces and guest editorials, book reviews, spotlighted parishes, and coming events. The publication is being created and produced by members of the CRJC, a multiracial group of Catholics from parishes and religious organizations throughout the archdiocese of St. Louis. The group works to acknowledge the history of racism and to challenge its perpetuation, to encourage meaningful interracial dialogue, and to compel action that leads to racial justice. [New \(Oct. 24, 2022\) Greenpeace Report](#) : **Plastic Recycling is a Dead-End Street**—Year After Year, Plastic Recycling Declines Even as Plastic Waste Increases. Paper, cardboard, and metals are all recycled at a higher rate, but plastic continues to be trash.



Even in November and December, the Open Space Council offers [opportunities](#) for service such as honeysuckle removal, tree planting, and willow staking.

Nordstrom stores (both the store at the Galleria and the one in Manchester) have a bin in the cosmetics department for **recycling empty cosmetics/personal care containers** (lipstick/lip balm tubes, pans from eyeshadow, eyeliner and mascara tubes, moisturizers or lotion tubes, powder compacts). There are some items that are not accepted: electronics, containers from nail products (such as nail polish, polish remover), and empty aerosol containers.
