FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



We all know people who think St. Louis is the greatest place in the world. Perhaps you are one of them. I am a public agnostic on the matter.

However, last Sunday made a very strong argument in favor. The weather was amazing, the trees were in full autumn glory, and not a cloud in the sky. After mass, I took a long bike ride which included Forest Park. The entire city seemed to be in the park. I was struck by the incredible diversity of people, something I do not often associate with St. Louis. Everyone was enjoying a perfect day in a perfect place.

I believe Forest Park's appeal is three-fold: it is beautiful, it is free, and it is ours. The park is a place held in common for the good of everyone. It costs nothing to visit and enjoy. Forest Park is a perfect example of the old-fashioned idea that a shared civic life is worth pursuing.

When the Jesuits began schools, the goal was to form good Christians and good citizens. Both were essential to the work of education. Forest Park is reminder of what good citizens can accomplish. A reminder that is sorely needed at a time when the very idea of a common good is under attack. A shared responsibility for the good of all people is not only possible, but can lead to something as delightful as one of the great public spaces in America.

As Fr. Dan mentioned above, **ignite** is the theme of our fall fundraising campaign, which takes the place of a gala this year.

Advent Materials

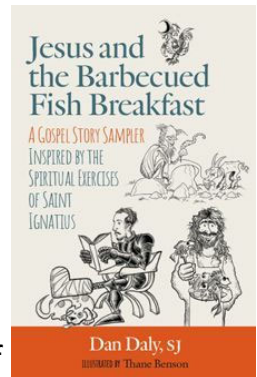
The season of Advent begins on Nov 28. Following the Sunday morning masses, there will be Advent reflection booklets, books, and calendars available in the ballroom.

Antiracism at College Church
Black Catholic History Month 2021
Celebrating Contemporary Black Catholic Leaders

In 1990, the National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus of the United States met at Fordham University in New York and voted to designate November as Black Catholic History Month. This celebration enriches the season when the Church prays for all saints and souls in loving remembrance. Two commemorative dates fall within this month: the birthday of Saint Augustine is November 13th and Saint Martin de Porres' Feast Day is November 3rd. Since its inception, Black Catholic History Month has been celebrated throughout the country and is recognized by the United States Council of Catholic Bishops. At College Church, portraits of Black Catholic saints and other holy men and women will be on display in the church during weekend liturgies.

This year, in addition to honoring the black ancestors of our faith through a rotation of posters that will be displayed for Masses each weekend, College Church will recognize some of the black Catholic leaders of our present day.

A special series of “Parish and Community” video interviews will highlight the contributions of Black Catholic leaders in the St. Louis area. Amanda Gorman

*When day comes we step out of the shade,
 aflame and unafraid
 the new dawn blooms as we free it
 For there is always light,
 If only we're brave enough to see it
 If only we're brave enough to be it.*

Did you realize that poet Amanda Gorman, who delivered her poem “The Hill We Climb” at President Biden’s inauguration, is a black Catholic and a member of St. Brigid Parish in Los Angeles? True.

She was born in 1998, and raised by a single mother who was an English teacher in Watts. Young Amanda attended private elementary and high schools. At age 16 she was selected to be a youth delegate to the United Nations. She graduated cum laude from Harvard University in 2020 where she majored in sociology.



Surprisingly, Miss Gorman has a hearing disorder making her overly sensitive to sounds and noises. Also, as a child she suffered with a speech impediment. Yet she sees both of these disabilities as strengths that forced her to become “really good at reading and writing.” (The Harvard Gazette, 2018)

She started writing as a very young child. In 2017 she became the first ever National Youth Poet Laureate – a program promoting young poets all over the country. She founded and serves as executive director of One Pen One Page, an organization offering free creative writing classes for underserved youth. She also serves on the board of 826 National, a youth writers’ network in the U.S.

Miss Gorman is the youngest person ever to be invited to read a poem of her own at a presidential inauguration ceremony. In February 2021, she was included in the “100 Next” list by Time magazine. She has become very popular as a speaker at events throughout the country, as well as on television. Her writings speak primarily about racial oppression, marginalization, and the African diaspora, as well as women’s issues.

She is truly paving the way for all young writers!

Parish Racial Equity Review: Update

Over the past month, members of the parish who are leading the racial equity review finalized our agreement with the Crossroads organization and moved forward with our first scheduled activity, a virtual orientation to the review process. The orientation, facilitated by two Crossroads representatives, took place on the evenings of November 3 and 4, and participants included not only SFX parishioners who've committed their time and talents to this process, but community partners from the Archdiocese of St. Louis, the Jesuit Central and Southern Province, and the North City Deanery.

Objectives of the orientation included: 1) to provide an overview of the review process; 2) to engage in community building and to prepare for the courageous conversations that will need to take place during the review; 3) to discuss the expectations and implications of the review; and 4) to begin to organize the work of the review process. Next steps include an historical analysis of our parish for use as a guide to the equity review; participation in an in-depth workshop on the topic of systemic racism; a period of data collection regarding our parish culture, offerings, policies, and practices; and preparation of a report to share findings and to propose recommendations for change. Follow this space for regular updates about the review. 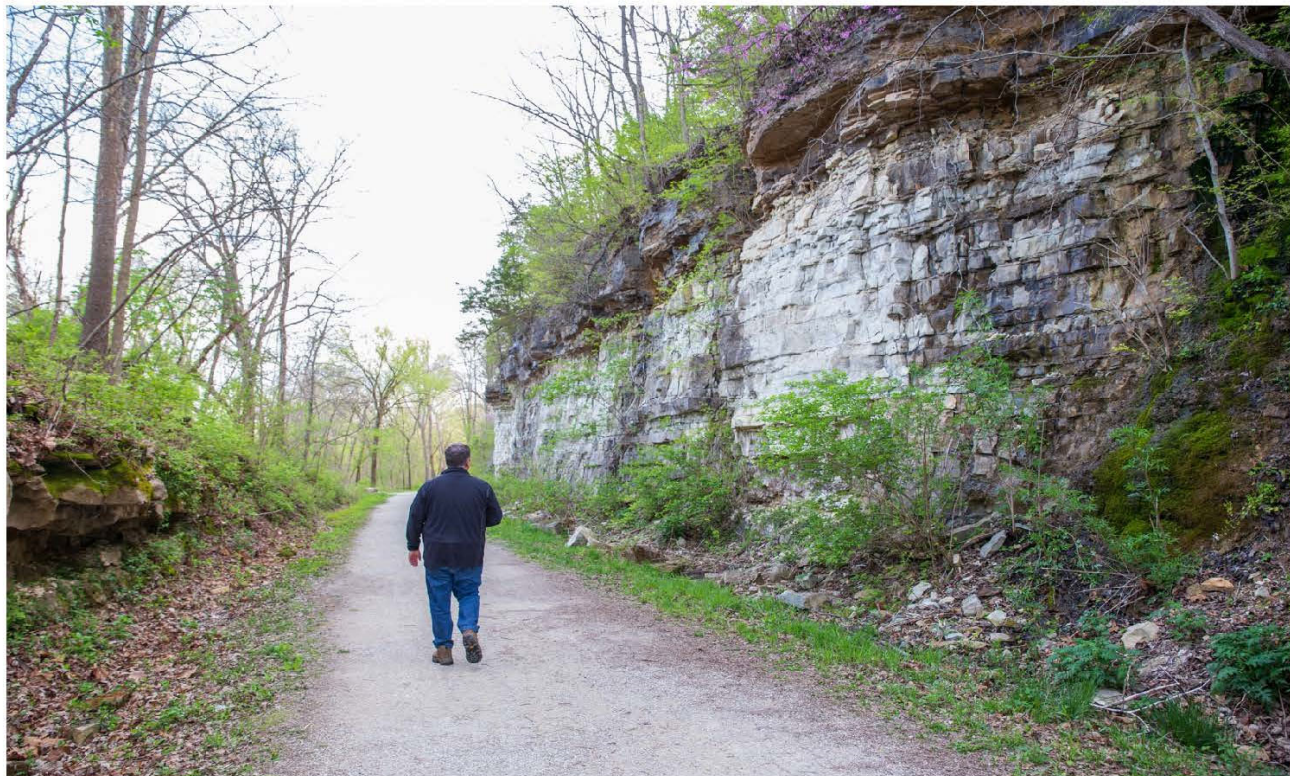


