In these meetings, we want to talk in more detail about what the transition means or may mean, to hear your honest reactions, and to gather input on how you and other parishioners can guide College Church through this transition. We hope by meeting as small groups, we can begin to be the Church we hope to become—one in which our lay members take an active role in discernment about our future.

Antiracism at College Church

Black Catholic History Month 2021 Celebrating Contemporary Black Catholic Leaders

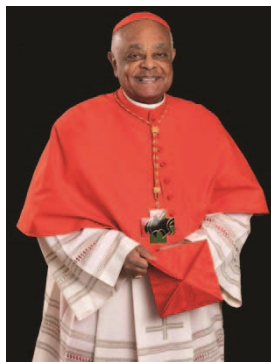
In 1990, the National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus of the United States met at Fordham University in New York and voted to designate November as Black Catholic History Month. This celebration enriches the season when the Church prays for all saints and souls in loving remembrance. Two commemorative dates fall within this month: the birthday of Saint Augustine is November 13th and Saint Martin de Porres' Feast Day is November 3rd. Since its inception, Black Catholic History Month has been celebrated throughout the country and is recognized by the United States Council of Catholic Bishops. At College Church, portraits of Black Catholic saints and other holy men and women will be on display in the church during weekend liturgies.

This year, in addition to honoring the black ancestors of our faith through a rotation of posters that will be displayed for Masses each weekend, the College Church will recognize some of the black Catholic leaders of our present day.

A special series of "Parish and Community" video interviews will highlight the contributions of Black Catholic leaders in the St. Louis area. Cardinal Wilton Gregory

Wilton Gregory was born in Chicago in 1947. Although his family was Protestant, he attended St. Carthage Catholic School and eventually converted to Catholicism. He studied for the priesthood at St. Mary of the Lake Seminary in Mundelein, IL, and was ordained for the Archdiocese of Chicago in 1973. He soon began graduate studies at the Pontifical Liturgical Institute (Sant' Anselmo) in Rome, where he earned a doctorate in sacred liturgy.



Father Gregory served as associate pastor at a parish in

Glenview, IL; taught at St. Mary of the Lake Seminary; and acted as master of ceremonies for both Cardinal Cody and Cardinal Bernardin. In 1983, he was ordained an auxiliary bishop of Chicago.

In 1994, he was installed as bishop of the Diocese of Belleville, IL, where he served for nearly eleven years. During that time he was elected the first Black president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. His leadership among the American bishops helped implement the "Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People."

Soon after, he was appointed archbishop of Atlanta, GA, and he was installed there in January 2005. While there Morehouse College inducted him into the "Martin Luther King, Jr. Board of Preachers," which includes religious leaders committed to peace, tolerance, interfaith understanding, healing, reconciliation, nonviolence, social progress, justice, and care for the earth.

"Racial healing is an aspiration that will only be possible because of the ceaseless attention of all of people of goodwill who believe in the value and significance of living harmoniously in a multiracial, multicultural society."

Pope Francis appointed him to lead the Archdiocese of Washington, DC, in 2019. The following year he became the first African-American Cardinal in the U.S. As archbishop of Washington he serves as Chancellor of The Catholic University of America, and Chairman of the Board of Trustees for The Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception.

All Cardinals have Vatican responsibilities assigned by the Pope, as well. Thus, Cardinal Gregory serves on the Vatican Dicastery for the Laity, Family and Life, and on the Board of Trustees for the Papal Foundation.

Cardinal Gregory has published numerous articles on the subject of liturgy, particularly in the African-American community. He has also written on end-of-life issues, and social justice.

Cardinal Gregory has been awarded nine honorary degrees, including a Doctorate of Humanities from Fontbonne University in St. Louis, and a Doctorate of Humane Letters from McKendree College in Lebanon, IL. He also received the Great Preacher Award from Aquinas Institute of Theology in 2002.

Hiding in Plain Sight: The Reality of Everyday Racism

As our country and our communities continue to confront racial inequity and social injustice, we often find ourselves asking, “How did we get here?” “What keeps us from making greater progress?” We know that racism is a barrier to fully living the call of the Gospel, and we seek ways to remove all that separates us from the Beloved Community God intends for us. As individuals and as a parish, we search for ways to make that a reality.

The Antiracism Team at College Church is hosting a virtual series of awareness sessions designed to open our eyes, minds, and hearts ever wider; to help us more fully understand how racism persists; and to guide us on the path to creating greater equity and justice. The next session will be held on **Tuesday, November 9 from 7:00 – 8:45.**

St. Patrick Center Casserole Program: Volunteer Cooks Needed!

St. Patrick Center (800 N. Tucker) provides free daily nutritious lunches to clients who come to the Center for treatment/services related to substance abuse, transitional living, job training, independent living skills, GED, job placement, childcare, transportation assistance, and more.

College Church contributes casseroles on the first Tuesday of each month to St. Patrick Center. Each agency SPC works with is assigned a particular kind of casserole and our parish is asked to specifically provide chili mac. College Church provides the recipe (or volunteers can use their own) and containers, and asks that you bring the frozen chili mac to the parish center prior to the first Tuesday of each month.

Congratulations to Parishioner Stefani Weeden-Smith!

Stefani Weeden-Smith was recently appointed the Executive Director of the newly formed St. Louis Anchor Action Network. The Network is composed of 11 major employers with a goal of hiring more people of color from the high-poverty areas of St. Louis City and County. The institutions include Harris-Stowe, Saint Louis Community College, Saint Louis University, UMSL, Washington University, Webster University, BJC, Mercy and SSM health systems as well as Edward Jones. The Network have pledged to hire more people of color and spend more money with minority-owned businesses. In this new position Stefani will have an impact on the people in the poorest neighborhoods where 24% of the residents live below the poverty line.
