FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



A very Merry Christmas to one and all! God's blessings as we celebrate the coming of Emmanuel, God with us. Christmas provides us an extended period to consider joyfully this incredible gift.

One of the best parts of Christmas is being with family. As with everything, 2020 has put a strange twist on family time. Some of us have been unable to get together with family because of the pandemic. Other folks have had nothing but family time. These extremes are not ideal but here we are. If we are separated from family, these days can be a reminder of how we take our loved ones for granted. If we are with our families (maybe too much?), this time can teach us patience with the ones we love.

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph is our companion at Christmas. It is comforting that family, with all its joys and sorrows, was at the heart of the Word become flesh. God enters into the totality of our experience. There is nothing human that is foreign to Jesus.

There is a wonderful quote from the early Church theologian, St. Gregory of Nazianzen. He states, "What He [Jesus] has not assumed, he has not healed." In other words, the Incarnation of Christ takes on everything that is human so that we may be completely healed. I believe this means our human relationships as well, especially families. YOUTH AND FAMILY FAITH FORMATION

College Church Youth Faith Formation programs have been virtual this semester, but that hasn't stopped the all-important service part of our program.



For several years our eighth-grade Confirmation students hosted a Christmas party for children served by the Let's Start program. Children in the program have parents in prison. With a party out of the question this year, each eighth grader decorated a Christmas bag and filled it with goodies, often including homemade cookies. Youth Faith families also donated money for gift cards, candy and warm socks for the Let's Start bags. The bags were brought to the agency by Youth Faith staff members.

Youth Faith families also participated in three car parades and drop-offs at the Mary Ryder Home on Olive. In past years our classes visited the Home and made crafts with the residents. Women who live at the home rarely have visitors and the craft days were a highlight for all of us. This year families had to make the crafts and treats on their own, but participated in car parades to drop off the items, and make sidewalk chalk messages of cheer for the ladies.



We can't wait until we're able to have in-person service events. In the meantime we are grateful for our families who have rallied around those in need and allowed us to continue our tradition of service. Purchase Fair Trade Products and Support our Sister Parish!

Sales of fair trade products have resumed **online only** to benefit St. Peter Claver in Punta Gorda, Belize. Because of the pandemic, as well as a series of fires which destroyed farms in the community, unemployment in the area has increased dramatically. All the proceeds from our Fair Trade sales go directly to St. Peter Claver.

So far, we have contributed toward their food pantry and two student scholarships.

Winter items are available, including soups, cornbread, hot cocoa, and baking cocoa, in addition to our ongoing sales of chocolate, tea, and coffee!

There are two options for receiving your items, which you will specify upon placing your online order. Both options occur twice a month on 1st and 3rd Sundays:

Hand Delivery (only for orders of \$20 or more): One of our volunteers will deliver your products to your porch or in front of your home. If requesting delivery of orders which contain chocolate, please plan for immediate retrieval of your package in order to protect chocolate from melting. Volunteers will ring your doorbell/buzzer or knock on your door when dropping off items.

Pick-up at College Church (orders of any value): Pick-ups at the College Church will be pre-collected into bags with the buyer's name displayed on the outside of the bag, available from 9-10:15am outside of the Ballroom (below the church) on the designated Sundays. We ask that parishioners wear a face mask and continue to practice social distancing during pick-up.

Metropolitan Congregations United (MCU) Update

Did you know that College Church is a member congregation of MCU? Metropolitan Congregations United (MCU) is involved in several matters of social justice, one of which is the School to Prison Pipeline. In 2018 MCU worked to pass Raise the Age which raised the age that a youth could be certified as an adult for purposes of prosecution for a crime, from 17 to 18. The new law will take effect in 2021. MCU recently held a virtual rally to discuss the new law and its implementation.

Action Item from MCU:

At a virtual rally on Thursday, December 10, MCU's Juvenile Justice Task Force, the Family Partners leaders and Campaign for Juvenile Justice brought attention to implementation of the Raise the Age Bill. This bill, passed in 2018, raises the age at which a youth is automatically certified an adult in the court/prison system from 17 to 18. Joined by Rick Gaines, the Chief Juvenile Officer for St. Louis County and Ben Burkemper, Family Court Administrator for St. Louis County, MCU has issued a CALL TO ACTION. Going into effect in January 2021, the new Raise the Age is already being threatened: no funds have been allocated to implement this crucial and overdue change in the system. Call the leaders of Missouri's Blue Ribbon Panel on Juvenile Justice: Allocate the funding... save our youth...do your job!
