FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



This is Mardi Gras weekend. It seems there are only two ways to view this unofficial Church holiday. One is puritanical. This perspective sees any notion that being Catholic could involve joy and celebration as suspect. The other option, far more popular these days, is to embrace the bacchanal whole-heartedly. It is the perfect excuse to eat, drink and act stupid.

As usual, a middle-way is best. Mardi Gras makes no sense without Lent. It grew out of the last days of preparation for the strict observance of the Lenten season. The celebration is the recognition of the weeks of prayer, fasting and alms-giving right around the corner. Mardi Gras is tied to the great season of preparation that culminates with the Holy Triduum.

The notion of balance is key to understanding the Catholic perspective. The origins of this time of revelry in the dreary days of winter remind us to live with joy even as we prepare for the somber period of Lent. Feasting and fasting are intimately related, and both are necessary for a healthy spiritual life. By all means enjoy the party, but do Lent with the same enthusiasm.

A story is told of St. Teresa of Avila that on a feast day in the convent a delicious meal featuring pheasant was served. St. Teresa torn into the bird with great relish. Some of the sisters were quite shocked. Looking up she simply stated, "Sisters, when we fast, we fast; when we pheasant, we pheasant." Happy Mardi Gras.

SPOTLIGHT ON YOUTH FAITH FORMATION

This academic year parish leadership wants to communicate more consistently how your generosity impacts College Church's ministries. It is helpful to recognize the many ways you enable SFX to do the wonderful things it does. God alone knows everything taking place here. We can, though, provide a sense of our activities, and our financial commitment to making them succeed.

This month the focus is Youth Faith Formation. This important program engages young people from tod-dlers to high school students. It helps fulfill the essential responsibility to pass our share our faith with the next generation of Catholics.

Programs: Our programing begins even before birth with baptismal preparation for parents. A nursery program for our youngest parish members is offered during mass. The major focus of YFF are: Catechesis of the Good Shepherd classes for preschool through 6th grade, and traditional religious education with emphasis on Ignatian Spirituality for First through Eighth Grade. The youth group is for teens. Sundays at the 10:30 mass children's Liturgy of the Word for children preschool through 2nd grade is celebrated. Preparation for Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation is also part of YFF.

Numbers: *201 students enrolled in grades PreK-8 *12 members in Youth Group *20-25 children participate in Children's Liturgy of

Staffing: This year we created a team approach to leadership for YFF. There are three part time directors, and two SLU assistants. We are grateful for generous volunteers. Each Sunday morning two bring order to chaos at Davis-Shaughnessy Hall. There are 45 volunteer Catechists including parents, community members, women religious and Saint Louis University students. We have ten babysitters, and eight Children's Liturgy of the Word Leaders.


Facilities: YFF programs meet 28 Sundays a year. That means space is a precious commodity. Dedicated space for the CGS children is a necessity. SLU is incredibly generous to allow us space for free.

What's New? This year YFF has made an even greater effort to reach out to parents. As the first and best teachers of the faith, speakers and discussion groups have addressed their concerns. We have also sought to deepen our Ignatian Spiritual heritage, and incorporate the parish's anti-racism work. Finally, youth participation in liturgical ministries has grown considerably.

Finances: The fees for our programs are \$225 for one child, \$400 for two children, \$475 for three children, or \$560 for four or more children. In total we received about \$28,000 in registration fees this year. This covers less than half of the cost of our programming. We are grateful to the parish for generously subsidizing this program through the Pancake Breakfast, weekly offertory, the Gala



Lenten Books and Materials

The season of Lent begins on February 26. Reflection materials are now available in the Lower Hall after the Sunday morning masses. These include: the <u>Little Black Book</u> with a scripture verse and a reflection on a person, event or practice that invites us to deeper faith; <u>Sacred Space</u> from the Irish Jesuits with a line from one of the readings of the day and a reflection on it; and several booklets with excerpts from the preaching of Pope Francis.

<u>Daybreak</u> is a series that presents passages from the writings of particular authors arranged for reflection during Lent. Each booklet features a different author. These include Fr. John Kavanaugh, SJ,, Fr. Ronald Rolheiser, OMI, scripture scholar Sr. Diane Bergant, CSA, and liturgist Fr. Paul Turner.

Other booklets feature reflections from Henri Nouwen, Cardinal Newman, and storyteller Fr. Connery. There are books that draw from the writings of St. Ignatius, St Francis and St. Claire, and Thomas Merton. Joyce Rupp, OSM, has a new book for Lenten reflection, Jesus, Friend of my Soul, that offers a two page reflection for each day.

Communal Lenten Formation Activity




ish. Think of this as something you can do, not just for yourself, but for the parish, and even for the whole Church.
