The Restorative Power of Kindness in the Gospels

As we prepare to begin our Lenten Journey, 2023, much weighs on our hearts: the uptick in mass shootings, the discord in our legislatures and Church, the racism that is climbing its way back into our everyday lives. Perhaps its post-COVID, but there seems to be a "meanness of spirit" a disregard for others; seeping in. An over-all malaise hangs over our communal lives as a city, as a county, as a country.

Lent is not a time for being downcast. The word, Lent, means "lengthening". Our days are lengthening with sunshine, each day a few seconds longer. The longer days can break through the fog of malaise.

A few months ago I listened to a woman homilist speak of the **Restorative Power of Kindness.** I keep sitting with that phrase. So much Spirit energy there. So much Spirit power.

This year's Lenten Sunday Readings begin with the "false gods of power" showing up. We see the clever serpent in the Garden tempting Eve. The power-hungry devil tempting Jesus in the desert in the First Sunday of Lent Readings.

But the Spirit is among us as the Spirit is with Jesus in the desert and as Jesus journeys to Jerusalem. In Jesus Lenten Journey, we see him restoring Love, Light and Life rooted in Kindness. It is the kindness of Jesus who chats with the Woman at the Well and **restores** within her a sense of worth and dignity. **Jesus' kindness heals her.**

The next week, despite the Pharisees trying to rankle Jesus with their own assumed power, we see Jesus **restoring** sight to the man born blind. **A restorative act of Kindness.** On the 5th Sunday of Lent, we see Jesus **restoring** life to his beloved friend, Lazarus.

To restore is the work of the Spirit, pulsing through us, sharing our kindness to heal the wounds of loneliness, of anxiety, of hurt, of anger, of being marginalized.

As we begin our Communal Lenten Journey at SFX, I would like to invite each of you to join in what I am naming, The SFX 40 Days of the Restorative Power of Kindness. We can do this, each of us, young, old or in between,. Graced by the Spirit, we can be instruments of the **restorative power of Kindness** throughout our 70 zip codes. How 'bout it? Let's make it a synodal Lent of Kindness at SFX and beyond.

February—A Banner Month!

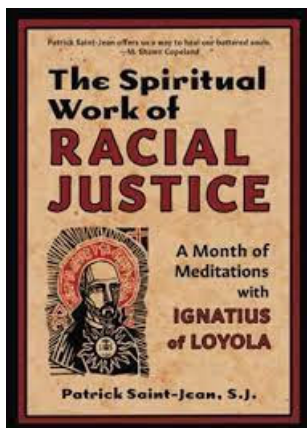
In honor of Black History Month, banners capturing the racial history of St. Francis Xavier (College) Church are on display in the front former confessional on the north wall. The banners, designed by parishioner Laura Stanton, are the result of the research conducted by the parish racial equity review History Committee. That exploration, undertaken as a consequence of our partnership with the Crossroads Antiracism and Training Organization, serves the purpose of grounding the work of the equity review and of our ongoing antiracism efforts.

The banners show three timelines: one for the archdiocese of St. Louis; one that details our civic history, i.e., major national, state and local events; and one displaying the history of College Church, St. Louis University, and the Jesuit order. The age of our parish required a recognition and examination of how those historical threads intertwine, and the ability to view events across the three banners affords an understanding of which occurrences were concurrent and how one historical event may have influenced others.

The banners will be on display throughout the month of February. Be sure to stop and take a look at them the next time you're in church!

The Spiritual Work of Racial Justice

A Month of Meditations with Ignatius of Loyola by Patrick Saint-Jean, SJ



The practices and perspectives of Ignatian Spirituality are a way of being that deepens our life of prayer, provides a pathway for discernment, and leads to discovery of how God calls each of us to be part of healing work in the world. Through his book, *The Spiritual Work of Racial Justice*, Patrick Saint-Jean offers us an opportunity to draw closer to God through daily readings, prayers, and questions

for personal reflection. Saint-Jean uses the 4 weeks of the Spiritual Exercises as a framework to help us explore the ways Christ calls us to and supports us in the work of racial justice.

February Figures in Black History

Born on February 18, 1931 – Critically acclaimed Black Catholic novelist, Toni Morrison, in Lorain, OH. She was the first black woman awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature.

Born on February 20, 1927 – Film actor Sidney Poitier, Miami, FL. Known for starring in films like *In the Heat of the Night*; *Lilies of the Field*; and *Guess Who's Coming to Dinner*, Poitier was also a civil rights activist.

Born on February 21, 1940 – Congressional Representative John Lewis in Troy AL. As a young activist Lewis was beaten by police officers while protesting at the infamous Edmund-Pettis Bridge outside Selma, AL. In later years he was known for being involved in “good trouble.”



Died on February 21, 1965 – American Muslim minister and Civil Rights activist, Malcolm X, was assassinated at age 39 in New York City.

The season of Lent begins on Feb 22. Lent comes from the old English word for springtime, a time of new beginnings and new life. Christians are invited to return to their roots, their baptismal relationship with God. This can be done through prayer, reflection, and self-sacrifice that lead to conversion of mind and heart.
