FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The celebration of Laetare Sunday goes back at least 1000 years. The Latin word for "rejoice" reminds us even in the midst of Lent we are filled with joy. Every Sunday is a mini-Easter that proclaims the Risen Lord.

Christian joy is one of the favorite topics of Pope Francis. An address he made in 2015 described "the disease of a mournful face." It is worthwhile to quote the Pope at length as his words speak far more eloquently than mine.

He refers to, Those glum and dour persons who think that to be serious we have to put on a face of melancholy and severity, and treat others – especially those we consider our inferiors – with rigour, brusqueness and arrogance. In fact, a show of severity and sterile pessimism are frequently symptoms of fear and insecurity. An apostle must make an effort to be courteous, serene, enthusiastic and joyful, a person who transmits joy everywhere he goes. A heart filled with God is a happy heart which radiates an infectious joy: it is immediately evident! So let us not lose that joyful, humorous and even self-deprecating spirit which makes people amiable even in difficult situations.

Do not let the simplicity and accessibility of Francis' words hide the depth of his insight. The connection of pessimism to fear is nothing short of brilliant. Good humor and joy reflect the confidence that comes from a heart rooted in God. An ability to laugh at ourselves keeps us humble. If we seek to get serious with our faith, it is best to be joyful. Happy Laetare Sunday!

Reflections on Synodality

As I learn more about synodality, I find myself reflecting on the opportunity and the responsibility it holds to more fully and genuinely live the Gospel.

It calls each of us to recognize the Holy Spirit at work in our own lives and in one another's lives and to discern the ways we may use these abundant gifts to serve one another. I believe that charism has been present at College Church for some time and I find joy in seeing it grow. Among our members there are those who are called to contribute to our church community by supporting our spiritual development, providing sacramental preparation, prayer for healing, accompaniment in grief and infirmity, stewardship of parish resources, advocacy for justice, and care for creation. Still others serve by planning, supporting, and leading meaningful liturgical experiences, meeting the physical needs of people in the community, discerning parish vision and direction, or welcoming those who come to our doors. The many works of our parish are conducted through the collaborative efforts of staff, parishioners, and clergy—each contributing by virtue of his or her gifts more often than by title or role. I believe this moment is inviting us to continue to live into this charism more fully. The upcoming transition to lay leadership of our works is one such example of responding to this invitation. We will continue to pray and to imagine how we can create the space for each of us to hear God's voice by listening to and serving one another.

**COLLEGE CHURCH - SISTER PARISH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM
ST. PETER CLAVER, PUNTA GORDA, BELIZE**

PROGRAM BEGINNINGS

The Student Scholarship Program at St. Peter Claver parish began in 2013 when Lou McCabe, SJ was the Pastor. Fr. McCabe developed the Program as a way to recognize and repay the parish catechists who provided so much time and talent to the Parish with no compensation. As a solution to this, he created a scholarship program for the children of the catechists who completed 8th grade and wanted to go on to high school but did not have the financial means. This priority of selection for the high school Scholarship Program continues today, now through the Pastoral leadership of Fr. Matt Ruhl, SJ and the Program Coordinator, Ms. Olive Woodye, a parishioner volunteer.

Last year, we first extended the opportunity for College Church parishioners to sponsor students. Thanks to your generous response, our parish community now sponsors the high school education of thirteen students in Belize. We hope to sponsor 7-10 additional students this year.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION & GUIDELINES

The Scholarship Program is coordinated through our Sister Parish of St. Peter Claver in Belize and through the supervision of Ms. Olive Woodye. It is well organized and has specific requirements and guidelines for scholarship application and for retention. It is designed for boys and girls in all four high school years, Forms 1-4. The parents are interviewed and have an application process and a contract that they must sign for their child to participate. They also require 20 hours of service from each student each year. Their report cards are reviewed each quarter and Ms. Olive monitors and advises them on grades and other needs they may have. If they don't fulfill the terms, the student can no longer participate nor receive scholarship funds.

Overall, it costs \$225. USD to sponsor one student per year. Of that total, \$200. goes for school fees, books, uniforms and supplies; \$25. goes for food and drinks for lunch. There are a few variances per year, i.e. Form 1 students have a registration fee, need 2 new uniforms and sometimes new books that cannot be recycled; Form 4 requires a graduation fee.

To sponsor a student for all 4 years of high school costs \$900. USD, which can be paid as one lump sum or annually. This would be used for the same child all four years as long as they meet all the program requirements annually. If a student does not complete all four years, the sponsor would be informed and a new student in need would be selected and benefit from their sponsorship.

There are 30 schools in the Toledo district where St. Peter Claver is located, the poorest district in Belize. There are many students awaiting sponsorship for high school! School begins in August 2022 and scholarship interviews and selection takes place over the summer.

Antiracism at College Church Our Parish Racial History

In recent weeks, members of the History Committee of the Parish Racial Equity Review Team have collected and shared, by means of a brochure and a new video, a host of highlights about the racial history of College Church. We would be remiss not to acknowledge the many historians and researchers whose endeavors originally brought these facts to light, and we would like to express, in particular, our gratitude for the research conducted by those affiliated with the Slavery, History, Memory, and Reconciliation Project, an initiative of the Jesuit Conference of Canada and the United States.

With the understanding that history is not static, and our parish history materials are living records, some additional detail to supplement, clarify, reflect new understanding, and to provide context for the historical content will be incorporated into our materials from time to time. Women's History Month: Dolores Huerta

This week, in honor of Women's History Month, we celebrate the life and work of Dolores Clara Fernandez Huerta, a civil rights activist and labor leader who, together with Cesar Chavez, founded the organization that became the United Farm Workers Association.

Huerta was born on April 10, 1930, in Dawson, New Mexico, the grandchild of Mexican immigrants. Her father, Juan, was as a migrant laborer, coal miner, and union activist who, in 1938, became a state legislator. Her parents divorced when she was three, and her mother raised Huerta and her two brothers in a farm worker community in Stockton, California. Huerta's mother, Alicia, was employed as a cannery worker and a waitress until she was able to save enough to buy a small restaurant and hotel. Alicia was deeply involved in the life of her community—which included Mexican, Filipino, African-American, Japanese, and Chinese working families—and in her Catholic church. It was Alicia's kindness and generosity that served as a model for her daughter's later civil rights activity.

Huerta received an associate's teaching degree and briefly taught school in the 1950s. In 1955, she cofounded the Stockton chapter of the Community Service Organization (CSO), which organized voter registration drives and

fought for barrio economic improvements. Reflecting her abiding interest in promoting the rights and dignity of migrant laborers, she founded the Agricultural Workers Association in 1960. By 1962, Huerta collaborated with Cesar Chavez, whom she had met through the CSO, to form the National Farm Workers Association, the predecessor of the United Farm Workers Association.

In 1965 and 1973, Huerta led major labor actions involving the consumer boycott of grapes and designed to ensure better working conditions for farm laborers. In conjunction with these efforts, she served as a lobbyist and primary contract negotiator. She helped to secure Aid For Dependent Families and disability insurance for farm workers in the State of California, and she played a critical role in passage of the Agricultural Labor Relations Act of 1975, which granted farm workers in California the right to collectively organize and bargain for better wages. Since the 1970s, Huerta's activism has focused on increasing workers' legislative representation, advocating for women's issues, and electing more members of the Latino community to public office.



The recipient of many honors, Huerta was, in 1993, the first Latina to be inducted into the National Women's Hall of Fame. She received the Eleanor Roosevelt Human Rights Award in 1998 and the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2012. As founder and president of her eponymous foundation, Huerta—now 91 years old—travels around the country engaging in campaigns and influencing legislation that supports equality and defends civil rights.
