FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



All over the United States we are grappling with how to re-open our society in the midst of an ongoing pandemic. It is not surprising there are a variety of responses to the decisions being made at the federal, state and local level. Economics, science, politics, ideology, and countless other factors are being touted as the key for how we should proceed.

I would like to consider what this might mean from the perspective of our Catholic faith. I believe a basic notion of the common good is helpful at this moment. This is a concept that has a long, rich tradition in the Church. The most fundamental sense is that we have an obligation and responsibility to seek the good not just for ourselves or our small group, but for all. Catholics desire not simply what is good for us but what is good for others.

There are no rights without responsibilities, both to myself and my community. A great deal of Catholic morality is finding the balance between the good of the individual and that of the whole. We must be careful not to go to the extreme of either one.

We can all agree our culture tends to emphasize individual rights. We are justifiably proud of our protection and promotion of the individual person. That is important. However, we should be careful to not forget this is only half of the equation. We are all children of our God, and we are all called to care for one another.

The way we live in the weeks and months ahead should reflect that truth. Plans, guidelines and personal actions that do not may be a lot of things. But they are not Christian.

Matthew C. Stewart, SJ, was born and raised in St. Louis, Missouri, by his two wonderful parents alongside his younger brother. He met the Jesuits while as a student at St. Louis University High School. He attended Saint Louis University. After college, he joined the Alum Service Corps (ASC) and taught theology and music at Rockhurst High School in Kansas City, Missouri. After this volunteer year, Matt was hired back at his alma mater, SLUH, where he taught for six years prior to entering the Society. Matt did his novitiate in Grand Coteau, Louisiana under the expert guidance of Fr. Dan White, SJ. Matt went to Denver to pursue a degree in choral conducting at the University of Denver while doing his regency at Regis University. While there, he taught theology, supervised the Peer Ministry program and coordinated liturgy alongside his colleagues in university ministry. Matt earned his Licentiate in Sacred Theology at the Boston College School of Theology and Ministry focusing on liturgical theology.

From Matt: "I am thrilled to be back at College Church for the year. It's a place where I first considered a Jesuit vocation and has been a spiritual home for years. I'm so excited to serve the good people of the parish!"


Week Five: Community, Family, and Participation

The Social Ministry Commission is reading a book called *The Challenge and Spirituality of Catholic Social Teaching*. The chapter on Community, Family, and Participation begins with a reflection that God is the reason for our communal identity., having formed covenants with biblical leaders like Moses and the prophets to Jesus and disciples of Jesus and early church leadership. The book also examines how the family is a symbol of the importance of the domestic church. Papal messages call on Catholics to form inclusive communities that ensure social and economic equality by embracing and providing for those who are underserved.

The world-wide pandemic of the coronavirus made it especially difficult to heed these calls, when most cities and towns shut down business. Such a challenging time has been difficult for many who have dealt with great losses. I currently live alone and gave up my car keys due to poor sight over a year ago. However, my isolation is eased by neighbors in my closed-knit community, members of the Voelker and Rice families, and two College Church families, the choir and Social Ministry Commission. All of these families offer a sense of the healing, sometimes highlighted by leaving food and treats on my front porch, backyard distanced visits, phone calls and Zoom gatherings. So in contrast to others in the metro region, I am blessed.



As the second oldest in a family of seven children, my earliest community consisted of my siblings, mom and dad simply because my family moved from St. Louis to the west and east coasts with stops back to St. Louis in between. When my family was finally preparing to settle in St. Louis in 1966, dad went ahead of us to acclimate to his new job at McDonnell Douglas and secure a new home for us. At the age of 13, I wrote him a newsy letter and signed it "Your Loving Daughter and Family." I added a P.S.: "We're always praying for you."

When we moved in, it was two weeks before school was to begin. I was in the seventh grade in the sixth grade school I had attended since kindergarten. My brothers and I

relished the community we found in our neighborhood, playing games like "kick the can" with our new friends after dinner nearly every night. From then on, I learned the importance of forming relationships within and outside of my family.

- This position will serve for eight weeks through the summer months, starting in early June. The position is paid \$479 bi-weekly, totaling around \$1,916 for the eight week commitment.
- After successfully completing a term of service, Summer Associates may receive a Segal AmeriCorps Education Award of \$1,311.11 which can be used to pay for college or student loans, or an end-of-service cash stipend of \$276.64.

Thirty years later, I had earned a bachelor's degree in journalism, married a St. Louis police officer and started working at a newspaper and then non-profit organizations. My husband and I thought we could help others by becoming foster parents. We were licensed through the St. Louis Division of Family Services.

We learned how beautiful a loving family can be. Over the course of 10 years, we individually fostered two toddlers and two babies. All had special needs and challenged us to love them as they were. We had to deal with grief as they were reunited with their families. Then, sight unseen, we opened our home and hearts to our last foster child.. He became our son for keeps.

Parish Immersion Trip to El Paso, TX: Thursday 10/22/20-Tuesday 10/27/20



College Church still has plans for a border immersion trip to El Paso, Texas and Juarez, Mexico with the Jesuit ministry 'Encuentro Project' in October 2020. The purpose will be to facilitate learning and awareness about immigration through direct experience, with a goal of then taking action for immigration justice. The trip has a capacity of 14 people (adults only). All trip participants MUST have a valid passport. The total cost of the trip is expected to be approximately \$850 per individual.

Examples of Potential Activities:

- Meeting parishioners and staff of *El Sagrado Corazon* (Sacred Heart), a Jesuit parish founded in 1893, located 3 blocks from the Texas/Mexico border. Visit participants and instructors in Social Ministries adult education program. Participate in Sunday liturgy.
- Border Patrol's information tour.
- Diocese's office for immigration legal assistance (DMRS) overview presentation of immigration law.
- Mass with detainees at ICE Detention Center in El Paso. Meet detainees.
- Visiting Annunciation House, a hospitality house for migrants and refugees.
- Presentation on border environmental concerns, given by university professor from Cd. Juarez.
- Programs for the impoverished in Cd. Juarez, Mexico. Meet the people and the leaders (a passport is required); or other U.S. option.
- Eucharists and end-of-day reflections. Common meals in the evening.
