**Reflections from our
Parish Life Coordinator**

The readings from Acts of the Apostles over the past two weeks are ones that the Pope is using to ground and inform the Synod on Synodality. This says to me that he is open to and maybe even encouraging discernment that leads to changes that the church currently finds unacceptable. The unfolding story in chapters 10-15 is a fascinating example of synodality: listening to those outside the church, listening to the Holy Spirit and, ultimately, conversion. Peter and other apostles go out to meet Gentiles. The Gentiles they meet are faithful to God but they don't follow the church's current rules. The message Peter hears in a vision that seems to become a touchstone for him is "What God has made clean, you are not to call profane." By that he is saying, just because these folks don't follow our rules doesn't mean they are wrong or sinners or should be kept outside of our community. And it actually leads to the change of church laws! And how it happens is so beautiful. It doesn't happen without tension - not everyone is in agreement at first. But the leaders and apostles are faithful to the idea that if they share their varied experiences and truly listen to one another they will be able to discern where the Holy Spirit is leading them. As I reflect on all of this, I want to say to Pope Francis, "You had me at Synodality." But then to connect synodality to such an evocative (or maybe provocative?) story leaves me with a sense of spirit-filled wonder at where we as a church might be called now.

For the Greater Good

of all St. Louisans

After four years of Jesuit education at Rockhurst University in Kansas City, I embraced a philosophy of life rooted in a key tenet of the Jesuits “for the greater good of all.” It is the phrase that has always guided my career, from working in a cooperative art gallery—Art St. Louis—working with St. Louis artists right after graduation to my work as an art therapist, working with the unhoused, people living with HIV+, and young people. I’ve found that my work continues to bring me back to working within collectives, coalitions, and community-focused organizations. I believe work only happens when we learn to lean on each other.

When a friend of mine told me about an opportunity to lead a new initiative called the St. Louis Anchor Action Network, I was intrigued by this opportunity to bring together community, civic, and corporate leaders to focus on developing and implementing a wealth-building strategy to address longstanding patterns of inequity in our region. The members seek to scale the adoption of organizational best practices to collectively leverage intentional hiring, career development, and local spending to drive equitable wealth-building and economic development across the region. The network began with focused geography to include 22 zip codes in St. Louis City and County with poverty rates above 20 percent and a majority African American populace.

When he mentioned the zip codes, I realized that one of the zip codes was one where I grew up— 63135, Ferguson, and another, 63118, is where I currently live in the city. It became very clear that this was an opportunity made for me. It would foster the belief that our collective work should be for the greater good of all St. Louisans. We are all St. Louis, and the sooner we believe this and act as if it’s true, the sooner we might hear a different story about our city. Safe to say, I interviewed and was named the inaugural director for the St. Louis Anchor Action Network in October 2021. It’s a huge responsibility and the solutions will not come overnight. I am humbled to be in a position where coalition-building is central to finding innovative shared solutions.

Celebrating Asian American Catholics

The month of May is designated as Asian American Heritage month. It is an opportunity to celebrate the many diverse cultures represented by the title of Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI). Approximately, one out of every five Asian and Pacific Islanders in the United States is Catholic, totaling nearly three million. In their pastoral letter, *Encountering Christ in Harmony: A Pastoral Response to Our Asian and Pacific Island Brothers and Sisters*, the United States Council of Catholic Bishops recognized the rich and deep history of Catholicism and remind us that Asian and Pacific Island Catholics are made up of ethnically, racially, culturally, nationally, and socially diverse groups of people that share a single faith.

Alongside all of the other immigrant groups in the United States, Asian American families can count many generations of ancestors who have lived in and helped to build communities in this country. More recent arrivals seek new opportunities and sometimes refuge. Fleeing the violence of the government overthrow in Myanmar, some refugees have settled in south St. Louis and are members of the parish of St. Pius V. As they continue to transition into their new home—physically and spiritually—they are making connections to the community and preserving their language and culture.

In celebration of Asian American Heritage Month and in solidarity with these neighbors, we recognize Blessed Isidoro Ngei Ko Lat whose cause for canonization is being considered. His parents died when he was young and both he and his younger brother were cared for by their aunt and uncle.

As he grew older, he expressed a desire to serve God and his vocation led him to the minor seminary of Saint Teresa where he studied for six years until World War II started. During the war, he returned to his village and became a teacher where he opened a school for the village children. He served with missionary Mario Vergara. After the 1948 independence of Myanmar, he and Vergara were threatened by the guerillas in Myanmar and the two were murdered.

YOUTH AND FAMILY FAITH FORMATION

BE A PART OF THE COLLEGE CHURCH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

The College Church Religious Education, RE, program is looking for faith-filled individuals to lead RE classes next year.

No experience is needed. Individuals need to be strong in their faith and eager to share it with children. The textbook series is Finding God, a publication of Loyola Press which takes an Ignatian Approach to religious instruction. In addition to class work and discussions the school year includes Sandwich Sundays, and Class Masses and service days as possible. Those are coordinated by the Youth Faith Formation staff.

Catechists work in teams, and a parent or parishioner is often paired with a SLU student. The students bring their leadership experience and love for God, which is outstanding modelling for our children.

Classes meet on most Sunday mornings, 9:15 – 10:20 in the Parish Center and in Davis-Shaughnessy Hall, from September through early May. On nice mornings classes often meet outside. On Sundays when a catechist is not available, the co-leader will manage the class. If you are unable to commit to a full schedule right now, you can volunteer to be a substitute.

Catechists receive free tuition for their children and are paid a modest stipend. They need to be in compliance with the Archdiocese Prevent and Protect STL program.

REGISTRATION NOW OPEN FOR YOUTH FAITH FORMATION PROGRAMS

Families with children preschool through eighth grade can register for the 2022-2023 College Church Youth Faith Formation Programs. The College Church offers both a traditional religious education (RE) program and a Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) program. The RE program is available for children second through eighth grade. The CGS program is offered for children from preschool through sixth grade. You may be put on a waiting list for the CGS program.

Classes meet at 9:15 on Sunday morning in the College Church and in Davis-Shaughnessy Hall, just west of the Pius XII Library. RE classes conclude at 10:40, GCS classes go until 11:15 with children brought to their parents during the 10:30 Mass.

Both programs are based on Ignatian Spirituality, with an emphasis on God's unconditional love, and on the importance of service. The programs use the Examen to reflect on each day's opportunity to be Christ-like in daily activities.

RE classes are organized by grade level and operate in a more traditional classroom setting. CGS classes are Montessori-based, with multi-aged groupings, and they encourage children to grow in their faith life through individual experience. Children in both programs receive sacraments in second and eighth grade.
