**Reflections from our
Parish Life Coordinator**

We are still in the first year of the Pope's Synod on Synodality in which the Pope is calling all of us to "look others in the eye and listen to what they have to say." He wants us to "become experts in the art of encounter." I feel that College Church is called to this in a particular way. We are in a part of the region that is seeing significant development. A lot of people, especially young people, will be moving into this area. They will be looking for community. What will we do? We are also in the midst of All Things New, a large Archdiocesan strategic planning process, that will most likely lead to major changes and a sense of loss for many Catholics, especially in the City. How will we respond?

I've started to think about encounter as a muscle we strengthen through practice. And as we look toward the next few years, it will be a muscle that we will need more and more. I feel all of us being called to practice encountering others, to strengthen our listening and accompanying muscles within our communities so that as we have the opportunity, we are ready to reach out and expand our community.

We are a parish that has a history of acting synodally even if we didn't use that word. There are many folks in this parish who truly are experts in the art of encounter. But all of us have experience with it - as parents or caregivers, as close friends, as partners, as spiritual companions, as community members, etc. I would guess that we also all have experience with encounter leading to conversion - a new way of seeing, a new understanding, a deeper sense of love and connection, a new sense of community.

So, my invitation to all of us is to seek out encounter - look for opportunities to listen, and pray for the grace recognize when our encounters are calling us to conversion, individually and as a church. The Holy Spirit is in and among us. And so, I have hope that our church will be formed and transformed through our encounters.

Antiracism at College Church

At College Church, antiracism is an expression of our recognition that all are created in the image of God. As such, we respond—personally and collectively—to the call to identify, and to actively challenge, structures and systems that devalue people on the basis of race, and to practice restoration in the pursuit of justice.

May, the Month of Mary

The Black Madonna



In hundreds of Roman Catholic and Orthodox churches around the world, one finds examples of the Black Madonna—statues and images of Mary depicted with dark skin. And the question arises: How did the Blessed Mother, a Jewish woman, come to be shown as black? Several explanations have been advanced, some suggesting that the dark coloration of Mary was

intentional, others suggesting that it occurred by accident.

Among the explanations that regard the depiction of Mary with dark skin tones as deliberate are those associating the Black Madonna with a biblical verse from the Song of Solomon (1:5), in which Solomon's bride says, "I am black and beautiful, O daughters of Jerusalem." Also offered is the explanation that some of the images were intentionally created to resemble indigenous people. Some scholars suggest that the dark images of Mary represents a transference from pagan practices to Christianity, recognizing that several goddesses—Isis, Ceres, Artemis—were shown with dark skin as a sign of fertility, particularly the fertility of the earth's rich soil. Others see these depictions of Mary as representing "the blackness of divine mystery celebrated by the great mystics who see the divine as forever unknowable, mysterious, [and] beyond all our concepts...." (Andrew Harvey, religious scholar) One artistic view holds that, because in the language of Jesus—Aramaic—black means sorrow, the Black Madonna is "the Sorrowful Mother, Mater Dolorosa...who can receive and contain even our most unbearable pain." (Meinrad Craighead, artist)

Those who believe that the Madonna's dark skin is accidental attribute it to environmental influences. For wooden statues, the natural aging process is said to be responsible for the gradual darkening. Others suggest that the images and statues have darkened because of centuries of exposure to candle smoke and soot.

Two of the best examples of the Black Madonna are the one located in a monastery in the city of Czestochowa in southern Poland and the one at the Santa Maria de Montserrat monastery in Catalonia, Spain. Our Lady of Czestochowa is a dark-skinned Byzantine icon; the Black

Madonna of Montserrat (shown on this page), also known as the Moreneta, is a wooden sculpture. These and other such representations of Mary draw thousands of pilgrims annually and many are located at sites where miracles are believed to have occurred. It will be remembered that St. Ignatius, following a night of prayer before Our Lady of Montserrat, surrendered his sword and set forth on his religious mission.

The St. Louis area has its own shrine dedicated to the Black Madonna, located south of Pacific and southwest of Eureka. In 1927, Archbishop Glennon invited an order of Polish Franciscans to establish an infirmary in the countryside. Brother Bronislaus Luszcz, a member of that order, constructed a cedar chapel where he hung an image of Our Lady of Czestochowa. The shrine and grotto later became a site of pilgrimages and religious devotion.

YOUTH AND FAMILY FAITH FORMATION

BE A PART OF THE COLLEGE CHURCH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

The College Church Religious Education, RE, program is looking for faith-filled individuals to lead RE classes next year.

No experience is needed. Individuals need to be strong in their faith and eager to share it with children. The textbook series is Finding God, a publication of Loyola Press which takes an Ignatian Approach to religious instruction. In addition to class work and discussions the school year includes Sandwich Sundays, and Class Masses and service days as possible. Those are coordinated by the Youth Faith Formation staff.

Catechists work in teams, and a parent or parishioner is often paired with a SLU student. The students bring their leadership experience and love for God, which is outstanding modelling for our children.

Classes meet on most Sunday mornings, 9:15 – 10:20 in the Parish Center and in Davis-Shaughnessy Hall, from September through early May. On nice mornings classes often meet outside. On Sundays when a catechist is not available, the co-leader will manage the class. If you are unable to commit to a full schedule right now, you can volunteer to be a substitute.

Catechists receive free tuition for their children and are paid a modest stipend. They need to be in compliance with the Archdiocese Prevent and Protect STL program.

REGISTRATION NOW OPEN FOR YOUTH FAITH FORMATION PROGRAMS

Families with children preschool through eighth grade can register for the 2022-2023 College Church Youth Faith Formation Programs. The College Church offers both a traditional religious education (RE) program and a Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) program. The RE program is available for children second through eighth grade. The CGS program is offered for children from preschool through sixth grade. You may be put on a waiting list for the CGS program.

Classes meet at 9:15 on Sunday morning in the College Church and in Davis-Shaughnessy Hall, just west of the Pius XII Library. RE classes conclude at 10:40, GCS classes go until 11:15 with children brought to their parents during the 10:30 Mass.

Both programs are based on Ignatian Spirituality, with an emphasis on God's unconditional love, and on the importance of service. The programs use the Examen to reflect on each day's opportunity to be Christ-like in daily activities.

RE classes are organized by grade level and operate in a more traditional classroom setting. CGS classes are Montessori-based, with multi-aged groupings, and they encourage children to grow in their faith life through individual experience. Children in both programs receive sacraments in second and eighth grade.

Through the efforts of Father Heithaus, and others, Saint Louis University officially integrated later that year. Grace has learned that Father Heithaus played an important role in making SLU a more just, welcoming school. He is related on her mother’s side of the family.
