Week Eight: Dignity of Work and Rights of Workers

Throughout the Bible, you see references to the essential act of treating workers with compassion and justice: from Isiah saying "To observe religious practices but oppress your works is to false worship" to James writing "Those who become rich by abusing their workers have sinned against God". During these tumultuous times, we have seen various organizations keep to the Catholic Social Teaching of dignity of work and rights of workers. Unfortunately, there have also been just as many groups going against this important guideline.

The global economies have been severely damaged throughout the pandemic – stocks falling and businesses being lost. Behind these extremely visible signs from the media are thousands upon thousands of workers and their families who are losing not just their income but also their healthcare coverage. The small businesses within our

communities have taken a serious blow with the social distancing and although the measures have been needed for public health it remains difficult to see our local institutions struggling.

While closures and profit margins for various organizations have increased exponentially, we must not forget the upsurge in our essential industries like healthcare and grocery. At a time when we all are told to work from home these neighbors cannot and have to risk exposure to COVID while ensuring our society continues to function in this "new normal". Even with their essentiality, many of these workers remain among the lowest paid. Catholic Social Teaching emphasizes the right to safe working conditions and just wage which is founded in the contribution to the common good. The current public health highlights both the economic and health disparities of our communities. We must remind ourselves that these people, who Pope Francis calls "the saints next door", should receive our gratitude as well as recognition from our nation. Restoring work, rescuing livelihoods and recognizing the needs and rights of workers should also be at the center of any economic recovery plan.

Working for Mercy Health here in St. Louis, it has been devastating seeing the impact COVID has had upon our communities as well as my coworkers. Given the new challenges within the industry, I have seen various departments get "rightsized" and other coworkers get furloughed. Even with all of these very difficult decisions, everyone still holds strong to the mission of this Healing Ministry. The people have taken such life-changing news in stride and continue to show grace in order to sustain Mercy through these economic struggles. Ensuring that the dignity of these coworkers remains intact, Mercy has given different benefits extended after their employment and guidance to find their next role.

Remember, the Lord has given us all strengths and gifts to bring to life the kingdom of heaven. The dignity of that work that we do through these talents must be held even during challenging times we find ourselves in today.

Volunteers Needed!

College Church's Outreach Program provides assistance with Missouri State IDs and birth certificates for people with limited resources in St. Louis. Having closed our walk-in hours since mid-March to protect the health and safety of program guests and volunteers, we are now preparing to reopen June 2nd in a way that adheres to CDC best practices. We are seeking volunteers to help with on-site (at St. Francis Xavier College Church) ID and birth certificate assistance on Tuesdays and/or Wednesdays. Volunteers will receive in-depth training and ample on-site support.

Ideal volunteers:

- Feel comfortable working—as close as physical distancing allows—with guests who belong to at-risk groups; and do not themselves belong to at-risk groups
- Can commit to two hours a week of onsite service
- Will navigate, with ease, iPads and standard copy machine
- Approach individuals whose life experiences may not mirror their own with respect, patience, and compassion
- Are teachable! Willing and able to work with good humor, humility, and poise
- Communicate with care; able to create and maintain boundaries and stay calm under pressure

Volunteer Roles:

<u>ID and Birth Certificate Volunteer:</u> Works one-on-one with program guests to review Missouri State IDs and birth certificates requirements, managing paperwork needed for applications. New volunteers can be matched with a remote, at-home volunteer for real time guidance.

<u>Set-up</u>, <u>Breakdown and Sanitation Ministry</u>: Helps to set-up tables in the ballroom; serves as keeper of disinfectant spray, potential-maker of DIY masks; bathroom checker; greeter; CDC best practice facilitator and enforcer; breaker down of tables...

Parish Immersion Trip to El Paso, TX: Thursday 10/22/20-Tuesday 10/27/20

College Church still has plans for a border immersion trip to El Paso, Texas and Juarez, Mexico with the Jesuit ministry 'Encuentro Project' in October 2020. The purpose will be to facilitate learning and awareness about immigration through direct experience, with

a goal of then taking action for immigration justice. The trip has a capacity of 14 people (adults only). All trip participants MUST have a valid passport. The total cost of the trip is expected to be approximately \$850 per individual.

Examples of Potential Activities:

- Meeting parishioners and staff of *El Sagrado Corazon* (Sacred Heart), a Jesuit parish founded in 1893, located 3 blocks from the Texas/Mexico border. Visit participants and instructors in Social Ministries adult education program. Participate in Sunday liturgy.
- Border Patrol's information tour.
- Diocese's office for immigration legal assistance (DMRS) overview presentation of immigration law.
- Mass with detainees at ICE Detention Center in El Paso. Meet detainees.
- Visiting Annunciation House, a hospitality house for migrants and refugees.
- Presentation on border environmental concerns, given by university professor from Cd. Juarez.
- Programs for the impoverished in Cd. Juarez, Mexico. Meet the people and the leaders (a passport is required); or other U.S. option.
- Eucharists and end-of-day reflections. Common meals in the evening.
