FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Monday we celebrate the feast of St. Aloysius Gonzaga, S.J. He was the first son of an aristocratic and politically powerful Italian family. His decision to join the Jesuits infuriated his father. Aloysius went to Rome, took vows, and died as a scholastic at the age of 23.

Aloysius Gonzaga held little appeal for me initially. His saccharine, otherworldly piety appeared unhelpful for our contemporary world. The sentimentalized depictions of the saint made him seem hopelessly out of date. His extreme penances struck me as quite bizarre.

Digging deeper into his life, however, changed my mind. I discovered he preferred his Italian name Luigi, rather than the Latinized Aloyisus. How can you not like someone named Luigi?

His brief life witnessed a deep love for those in need. Luigi died ministering to victims of the plague in Rome. He engaged in this ministry in the midst of his studies as a Jesuit. The contrast between the opulence of the courtly life of his family, and the awful reality of those suffering sickness must have been jarring. Luigi contracted the plague and died quickly.

The COVID pandemic has revealed a multitude of St. Luigis. Healthcare workers and others have worked courageously with the suffering. Many, like him, have themselves become sick and died. I wonder if years from now we will have our own saints from this time of plague. Luigi's feast day reminds us compassion for the suffering, generosity, and selflessness are not found only in the distant past. Those virtues are all around us.

MUTUAL BLESSINGS FROM THE BORDER

Vicki Simon, a member of the College Church community, spent this Easter in El Paso, Texas volunteering for the Annunciation House. Her first-hand experience is presented here in two segments (today and next Sunday). The entire article is available on the sfxstl.org website.

In March I received a message from a friend who told me that Annunciation House (AH) needed volunteers in El Paso at the border. Specifically, they needed volunteers who spoke Spanish and who had experience as they began to reopen. AH provides short respite for migrants, typically 1-3 days, as they await travel to their sponsors' homes in the U.S. They stay with their sponsor until their immigration court date comes up, usually 1-3 years. During the pandemic AH also provides Covid testing for those migrants arriving untested by ICE.

Being vaccinated I decided to return (volunteered in 2019-20) and flew to El Paso to begin work on Easter Sunday. This time I was assigned to work at CDR (Casa de los Refugiados) – a large warehouse converted into a house of hospitality and shelter that can accommodate up to 500 people; the largest number of migrants received was 200 one day, and the least was 70. In addition to our volunteer group of 19, there were 6 full-time volunteers staying at AH for a year and several staying for a month or two.

In the scope of this article I really can't cover all that I learned those two weeks, but I would like to

share two experiences: first, the stories of why migrants are coming to our border in such great numbers and second, stories that inspired and brought me tears and much joy!

WHY DO THEY COME?

Sr. Sheila Karpan, SCL, friend and fellow AH volunteer, kindly shared this with me. "Some months ago, I read Howard Thurman's book, *Jesus and the Disinherited*. His writing inspired John Lewis and Martin Luther King in their civil rights work. While he applied the term, "disinherited" to Blacks in America, it was rooted in Jesus' experience of living under an oppressive regime and the struggle to survive. I recognized this application, but I also immediately thought of refugees, people today who are on the move. Thurman described the oppressed, those who suffer, as "people with their backs against the wall."

Refugees who come to our border seeking asylum come because their backs are against the wall. The true value for me while at CDR was being able to see and hear the perspective of those who had to be on the move! These are some of the factors that put them in motion:

- **Fleeing Violence:** from forced gang recruitment and sexual or gender-based violence. A woman from Nicaragua started to cry as she mentioned how long it took with her children to arrive at the border and then wait for over a year in a Juarez shelter (Migrant Protection Protocols, MPP).
- **Fleeing Extortion and Threats of Violence from Organized Crime and Drug Cartels:** A father fled with his wife and children after he was told to pay a certain amount of income from his business because, "We know

you have a son. We know how old he is, where he goes to school and what he wore today. We know who takes him to school.” He told the CDR volunteer, “People in the United States don’t know what it’s like to leave everything behind.”

- **Climate Migration:** Two category 5 hurricanes, Eta and Iota, two weeks apart, destroyed homes, farms, killed livestock and agricultural products. A woman from Honduras showed me a picture on her cell phone of her flooded home. I asked how she was able to escape and she told me she got to a boat and lived on it for four days. (I imagined a rowboat). In other parts of the Northern Triangle countries (El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras) there is a severe and prolonged drought. People are no longer able to sustain a livelihood by providing food for their families.
- **Poverty:** Very often this is a constant that afflicts people on the move...socio-economic instability with the majority of people living below the poverty line.

What Are The Spiritual Exercises?

The *Spiritual Exercises* are prayers, meditations and reflections developed by St. Ignatius of Loyola. Participation in the Ignatian *Spiritual Exercises* offers the retreatant the tools to deepen their prayer life and, thus, their relationship with God. Accompanied by a companion schooled in the movements of the *Spiritual Exercises*, retreatants are guided according to their own personal journey. For many centuries, the *Spiritual Exercises* were often experienced in seclusion over the course of 30 days. People still engage in the *Spiritual Exercises* through this format.

In actuality, St. Ignatius realized that not everyone could leave the responsibilities of their daily lives to devote themselves to the 30-day retreat, so he provided for an alternative known as the 19th Annotation Retreat. The Bridges Retreat in Everyday Life stretches the four weeks of the 30-day retreat over eight months. It uses the same prayers, meditations and reflections as the 30-day retreat. Each retreatant commits to one period of prayer each day and then meets weekly with a trained, experienced prayer companion who serves, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, to accompany the retreatant on an individual basis. The retreat is prayed in parallel with the seasonal liturgy of the church.

THE BRIDGES RETREAT

The Bridges Retreat begins in September and ends in May. The Bridges Foundation offers the *Spiritual Exercises* at various sites throughout the St. Louis area. An online site is also available to persons outside the Greater St. Louis area and for local persons comfortable with virtual meeting technology.

The group meetings are offered on various days of the week and at different times of the day. As you progress through the Ignatian *Spiritual Exercises*, your responses and needs will be assessed by the prayer companion, who will make your retreat an individualized experience. The Bridges Retreat is enhanced by a community aspect with regular group meetings, including presenters and the opportunity for group sharing.
