FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Within the space of three months we have experienced the worst global pandemic in 100 years, a subsequent economic nosedive, and civil unrest over racial injustice. All of it taking place during a momentous presidential election year. It may be a period unprecedented in our country's history.

News coverage has detailed the sense of despair, anxiety, and helplessness felt by Americans across every demographic. There is a palpable sense of uncertainty. It is as if we are staggering to regain our bearings and are afraid that we may not be able to do.

The Gospel today is a reflection on fear. It reminds us of our call to discipleship. It also reminds us of our God who has counted the hairs on our head. We fear what does not matter, and we trivialize what does. Jesus asks that we pause to understand exactly who God is and who we are.

We are indeed precious and beloved by God. That truth leaves no room for fear. Instead, it invites us to faith.

Purchase Fair Trade Products and Support our Sister Parish



Until further notice, sales of fair trade products are resuming **online only** to benefit our sister Jesuit parish St. Peter Claver in Belize. Because of the pandemic, as well as a series of fires which destroyed farms in the St. Peter Claver parish community, unemployment in Punta Gorda, where the parish is located, has increased dramatically. In response, St. Peter Claver is opening a food bank, which we would like to support through our fair trade sales.

There are two options for receiving your items, which you will specify upon placing your online order. Both options will occur twice a month on 1st and 3rd Sundays:

Hand Delivery (only for orders of \$20 or more): One of our volunteers will deliver your products to your porch or in front of your home. If requesting delivery of orders which contain chocolate, please plan for immediate retrieval of your package in order to protect chocolate from melting. Volunteers will ring your doorbell/buzzer or knock on your door when dropping off items.

Pick-up at College Church (orders of any value): Pick-ups at the College Church will be pre-collected into bags with the buyer's name displayed on the outside of the bag, available from 9-10:15am outside of the Ballroom (below the church) on the designated Sundays. We ask that parishioners wear a face mask and continue to practice social distancing during pick-up.

The deadline for ordering delivery or pick-up for the 1st and 3rd Sunday is the Tuesday before. For example, to receive your order on Sunday, June 21st please plan to place your online order by the end of the day THIS Tuesday, June 16th. Parish Immersion Trip to El Paso, TX: Thursday 10/22/20-Tuesday 10/27/20

College Church still has plans for a border immersion trip to El Paso, Texas and Juarez, Mexico with the Jesuit ministry ‘Encuentro Project’ in October 2020. The purpose will be to facilitate learning and awareness about immigration through direct experience, with a goal of then taking action for immigration justice. The trip has a capacity of 14 people (adults only). All trip participants MUST have a valid passport. The total cost of the trip is expected to be approximately \$850 per individual.

Examples of Potential Activities:

- Meeting parishioners and staff of *El Sagrado Corazon* (Sacred Heart), a Jesuit parish founded in 1893, located 3 blocks from the Texas/Mexico border. Visit participants and instructors in Social Ministries adult education program. Participate in Sunday liturgy.
- Border Patrol’s information tour.
- Diocese’s office for immigration legal assistance (DMRS) overview presentation of immigration law.
- Mass with detainees at ICE Detention Center in El Paso. Meet detainees.
- Visiting Annunciation House, a hospitality house for migrants and refugees.
- Presentation on border environmental concerns, given by university professor from Cd. Juarez.
- Programs for the impoverished in Cd. Juarez, Mexico. Meet the people and the leaders (a passport is required); or other U.S. option.
- Eucharists and end-of-day reflections. Common meals in the evening.
