**Reflections from a Parishioner**

*As part of becoming a more synodal church, periodically, parishioners will share their reflections so that we can hear different voices and perspectives. This week's reflection was lovingly shared by Catherine Swanstrom.*

At our parish picnic on Pentecost Sunday, I sat on the bench in front of the College Church with a new friend who had been at our table. While his wife got their car, we began to share what we noticed in the statue of Jesus tenderly holding a young child in his arms. "I see that Jesus is holding her small hand in his hand, and that everything is going to be all right. Jesus is holding my hand, too.... Jesus is holding the child close as she listens to his heartbeat. No words are needed." I love that we could share so simply about the love of God, even though we had just met.

I recalled our conversation on our recent Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Being held close...receptivity...feeling safe. Each of these a facet of God's infinite love.

Like the child in Jesus's arms, the activity of our synodal journey is perhaps born from a daily space of *inactivity* given to listening to the Spirit, with no other purpose than to be loved as we are. We may be unable to reasonably describe what happens in the silence, yet we know that in its mystery we are made a new creation. Quietly, almost imperceptibly, the gaze of Jesus transforms us in his image and likeness. His love in us flows into all that touches our lives. We can better handle the demands of the day. A prophetic voice emerges. Our hearts become sensitive to the needs of our sisters and brothers. Perhaps most importantly, we come to see that we are not alone. Mary of Nazareth is our model of a heart given to interior silence with her God.

In today's Gospel, Jesus bids us, "*Follow me.*" It seems that to be a disciple of Jesus also asks that we simply *be* with him.

When tempted to give a reason for our inactivity, we might remember the words of Antoine de St. Exupéry: "The heart has its reasons of which reason knows nothing."

through sixth grade. You may be put on a waiting list for the CGS program.

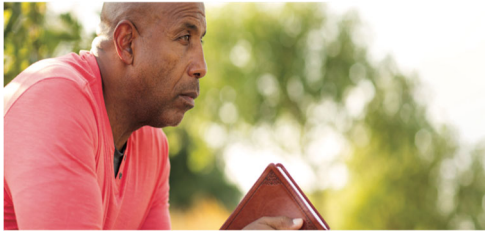

## Bridges Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius in Everyday Life



Are you seeking a deepened prayer life and a more personal relationship with God?

Perhaps you are discerning a major life decision, or simply seek to walk with Jesus more closely in your life.

The Bridges “Retreat in Everyday Life,” based on the 450+ year-old Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius Loyola, is a nine-month retreat is designed and adapted for persons in all walks of life. A monthly small group meeting with fellow retreatants is offered. The retreat runs September into May, following the life of Jesus in the liturgical year.

## Antiracism at College Church

At College Church, antiracism is an expression of our recognition that all are created in the image of God. As such, we respond—personally and collectively—to the call to identify, and to actively challenge, structures and systems that devalue people on the basis of race, and to practice restoration in the pursuit of justice.

### Working With Our Jesuit Family

The practice of Ignatian Spirituality places value on relationship and collaboration, and these are elements that we incorporate into the work of antiracism at College Church. Engaging with members, ministries, staff, and leadership groups within the parish and the wider community helps us to support and strengthen one another's efforts.

The co-chairs of the Antiracism Team recently had an opportunity to meet and establish a relationship with members of the Division of Diversity and Innovative Community Engagement at St. Louis University. Their stated mission is "...to establish a culture of inclusive excellence, equity, and human flourishing for all members of Saint Louis University and our connected communities through education, elimination, and transformation."

Known by the acronym DICE, this division directs the efforts of the Cross Cultural Center for Global Citizenship and the Center for Social Action. It sponsors a diversity speaker series, an annual MLK tribute, and programming focused on global equity, as well as events commemorating Occupy SLU—the 2014 protests for justice. This office also oversees the fulfillment of the Clock Tower Accords in which the university committed to actively strengthen diversity, inclusion, and equity. DICE initiated a campus-wide task force that includes representatives from every unit across the university. This team is responsible for increasing awareness and developing solutions that will help to increase inclusivity and equity at SLU.

The work of DICE was begun by the late Jonathan Smith, Ph.D., SLU's first chief diversity officer. His collaboration with university stakeholders initiated the reorganization and development of the current expanded structure. Amber Johnson, Ph.D., currently leads the division as the Associate Provost and is also one of the cofounders of The Institute for Healing Justice and Equity.

By meeting with members of DICE, the SFX Antiracism Team co-chairs were able to share some of the initiatives under way at College Church and to make clear a shared commitment to racial justice. Ongoing contact with DICE promises opportunities for future communication, collaboration, and support. 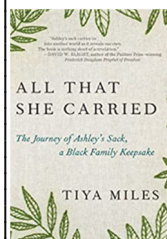
### Our Parish Racial Equity Review: An Update

The work of the Equity Review Team has reached a new milestone. After delays imposed by the pandemic, the members of this committee have just begun a five-week course of study that will prepare them to develop an appraisal of our parish's policies and practices in regard to racial equity and justice. This online workshop experience will provide a shared understanding of the form and function of systemic racism so that we can more effectively recognize it and work toward change. A variety of parish roles and ministries are represented within the group of 26 members. Staff members, commission chairs, ministry volunteers, as well as community partners will be completing individual learning activities and meeting weekly through Zoom to share insights and extend their learning.

After completing these sessions, members of the Equity Review Team will be tasked with developing the activities and events to gather and analyze information about every aspect of our parish life. Look for additional updates and invitations to be part of the process. It is important to hear from all members of the community.

Please keep the Racial Equity Review Team and all of the workshop participants in your prayers. We are grateful for the gifts each one brings to this important work.

Instead these items should go to NexTrex plastic bag and film recycling via the brown bins at the grocery store (e.g., Schnucks, Dierbergs, etc.).
