**FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

I believe the Holy Father is calling us to a deeper appreciation of the Eucharist and what this great gift of Christ's self for us means. As he preached, "Let us not forget that the Eucharist is meant to nourish those who are weary and hungry along the way. A Church of the pure and perfect is a room with no place for anyone. On the other hand, a Church with open doors, that gathers and celebrates around Christ, is a large room where everyone – everyone, the righteous and sinners – can enter."

It can be a temptation to imagine the Eucharist as a reward for good behavior. That somehow we have earned the right to receive Christ. This way of thinking could not be further from the truth. Remember, every single time before receiving Communion we all pray together: "Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and my soul will be healed." That is an acknowledgement that the sacrament is ultimately far more about God's compassion than it is about our deserving it.

Every single encounter with God is based upon His prodigious mercy, not our worthiness. If we were to wait until each and every aspect of our lives was in good order, none of us would ever receive Communion. The generosity of God is always greater than the smallness of our response.

## Antiracism at College Church

### MUTUAL BLESSINGS FROM THE BORDER

### ENCOUNTERS OF MUTUAL BLESSING

Everyday, a mutuality of graces seemed to overflow through encounters with guests and volunteers alike. As our guests entered a safe space, we offered them food, cots, clean clothes and showers. Most importantly, our work was to contact their sponsoring family or friend to arrange transportation from El Paso to their destination city. The most powerful contrasts were in their faces when people arrived and when they left us. Refugees were brought to us by either Border Patrol or ICE (Immigration and Custom Enforcement). My first day, one of the long-term volunteers invited me to go with her to meet an arriving bus. We greeted people, *Bienvenidos*, as they emerged and were told by the officials to form a line. We went to each person, greeting them and checking their documents. It was not lost on me that this was the first time that anyone in the United States had welcomed them. I was struck by the fatigue, fear, and anxiety worn on their faces.

Once welcomed we brought them inside and began the Intake process. While collecting information needed for their stay overnight and pending travel, I would hear many stories of hardship and horrendous indignities suffered.

To share just a few:

- An older Honduran woman called her 29-year-old daughter, Kathleen, now living in New Jersey whom she has not seen since she was 18. Her daughter now has a 9-year-old child. We shared tears as she related her story, telling me that she no longer wants to dwell on the horrific past 3 years in Juarez—homeless on the streets and in shelters. After speaking by phone with her daughter and passing the phone to me, Kathleen was also overwhelmed with emotion, sharing more tears of joy and relief! The next day the mother flew from El Paso to New Jersey to be reunited after 12 years with her daughter and to meet her granddaughter for the first time!
- A timid woman from Guatemala with a son and baby of just 7 months, heading to North Carolina to be reunited with her husband and 2 older daughters.
- The anguished tale of a grandmother who left her home country with her 11-year-old granddaughter. That very morning, Border Patrol had separated them. The grandmother was bereft and filled with anxiety. After consulting with our coordinators, I was told that the child had likely been taken by ORR (Office of Refugee and Resettlement), and it typically could take 30 days before they are reunited. When I learned there was nothing we could do, we then made the dreaded phone call to the mother of the child and daughter of the woman with us. The grandmother left the next morning for Florida so she and her daughter could wait together.
- A beautiful Mexican family that included a mother and her 4 daughters were on their way to her sister's home in California.

During our conversation, as I asked if the children's father would be joining them, she told me that her husband had been murdered in Juarez. She said this with no show of emotion but held my hand tightly while completing the forms and before calling her sister with news of their arrival.

Next, we prepared guests for the night with cots, bedding, toiletries and towels. The office phones were buzzing with ticket information from sponsors. Once confirmed, there were many phases in preparing them for departures: family contact, notification of departures, and then finally the big day they had been awaiting for years. We would meet those leaving in the *Salidas* (departures) room to give them their ticket information and a travel bag with food and water for their trips, as well as blankets for some traveling by bus for days to their final destination.

One day while in the *Salidas* room preparing folks for their journey, a young Honduran teenager named Gabi presented me with a gift—a beautiful hand crocheted pillow cover that she made while being held with MPP in a Juarez shelter. I was so surprised, and she said it was for all the kindnesses and care we had offered them while there. She was traveling with her father and her brother, on their way to the Bronx to stay with their aunt. I treasure this unexpected gift, and often wonder how they are doing.

My favorite part of our times together was accompanying our guests to the shuttle buses taking them to either the airport or bus station. When they boarded these shuttle buses, we would hug and wave and shout to one another, “*Que le vaya bien. Dios les bendiga.*” Now, on this next leg of their long journey, their smiling faces were wearing palpable signs of hope!

***‘No one should be obliged to flee their country. But the wrong is doubled when the migrant is forced into the hands of people traffickers in order to cross borders; and tripled when they reach the land they thought would give them a better future, only to find themselves despised, exploited, abandoned, or enslaved. We need to welcome, promote, protect, and integrate those who come in search of better lives for themselves and their families.’***

## What Are The Spiritual Exercises?

The *Spiritual Exercises* are prayers, meditations and reflections developed by St. Ignatius of Loyola. Participation in the Ignatian *Spiritual Exercises* offers the retreatant the tools to deepen their prayer life and, thus, their relationship with God. Accompanied by a companion schooled in the movements of the *Spiritual Exercises*, retreatants are guided according to their own personal journey. For many centuries, the *Spiritual Exercises* were often experienced in seclusion over the course of 30 days. People still engage in the *Spiritual Exercises* through this format.

In actuality, St. Ignatius realized that not everyone could leave the responsibilities of their daily lives to devote themselves to the 30-day retreat, so he provided for an alternative known as the 19th Annotation Retreat. The Bridges Retreat in Everyday Life stretches the four weeks of the 30-day retreat over eight months. It uses the same prayers, meditations and reflections as the 30-day retreat. Each retreatant commits to one period of prayer each day and then meets weekly with a trained, experienced prayer companion who serves, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, to accompany the retreatant on an individual basis. The retreat is prayed in parallel with the seasonal liturgy of the church.

### THE BRIDGES RETREAT

The Bridges Retreat begins in September and ends in May. The Bridges Foundation offers the *Spiritual Exercises* at various sites throughout the St. Louis area. An online site is also available to persons outside the Greater St. Louis area and for local persons comfortable with virtual meeting technology.

The group meetings are offered on various days of the week and at different times of the day. As you progress through the Ignatian *Spiritual Exercises*, your responses and needs will be assessed by the prayer companion, who will make your retreat an individualized experience. The Bridges Retreat is enhanced by a community aspect with regular group meetings, including presenters and the opportunity for group sharing.


