FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Once again our country is confronting the death-dealing consequences of our racism. The grief, outrage, injustice and anger that is never far below our national surface has been brought out into the open. Perhaps better to say, the ugly reality that is the everyday experience for communities of color confronts white people now, too.

I do not feel in any way able to offer insights or reflections. I do know our dedication to becoming an anti-racist parish has never felt more necessary, and at the same time woefully inadequate. But we have to press on.

This week I have been praying over a section from the book *Becoming an Anti-Racist Church*. There is a quote from Rev. Willard Bass, an African American pastor in North Carolina, that seems appropriate for our time:

"The challenge I continue to think about is how to have hope. It is not enough to be convicted, ashamed, and disarmed by the truth of racism in the church. I think that for white people and people of color who are Christians, embracing the whole truth about our faith requires a rethink of what it means to be Christian in America."

A rethink of what it means to be Christian in America no longer sounds like a choice, but an ultimatum.

Our lectors music ministers will be announced at the beginning of Mass.

No song sheets are included in this bulletin; we will be using instrumental music for the liturgy as a health precaution.

However, starting next weekend (June 13-14), we will be livestreaming our 5:30 pm Saturday Mass and including songs and song sheets. As this Mass tends to have smaller attendance, we will be better able to accommodate both social distancing and music.

Volunteers Needed!

College Church's Outreach Program provides assistance with Missouri State IDs and birth certificates for people with limited resources in St. Louis. Having closed our walk-in hours since mid-March to protect the health and safety of program guests and volunteers, we are now preparing to reopen June 2nd in a way that adheres to CDC best practices. We are seeking volunteers to help with on-site (at St. Francis Xavier College Church) ID and birth certificate assistance on Tuesdays and/or Wednesdays. Volunteers will receive in-depth training and ample on-site support.

Ideal volunteers:

- Feel comfortable working—as close as physical distancing allows—with guests who belong to at-risk groups; and do not themselves belong to at-risk groups
- Can commit to two hours a week of onsite service
- Will navigate, with ease, iPads and standard copy machine
- Approach individuals whose life experiences may not mirror their own with respect, patience, and compassion
- Are teachable! Willing and able to work with good humor, humility, and poise
- Communicate with care; able to create and maintain boundaries and stay calm under pressure

Volunteer Roles:

<u>ID and Birth Certificate Volunteer:</u> Works one-on-one with program guests to review Missouri State IDs and birth certificates requirements, managing paperwork needed for applications. New volunteers can be matched with a remote, at-home volunteer for real time guidance.

<u>Set-up</u>, <u>Breakdown and Sanitation Ministry</u>: Helps to set-up tables in the ballroom; serves as keeper of disinfectant spray, potential-maker of DIY masks; bathroom checker; greeter; CDC best practice facilitator and enforcer; breaker down of tables...





Outdoor Communion Available Starting Next Saturday, June 13th

In an effort to be responsive to the needs of our parishioners, starting **Saturday**, **June 13** we will make a special accommodation for the reception of Communion **during the 5:30 mass**. You are invited to drive to church, and either stay in your car or bring a lawn chair and sit across the street, and participate in our live-streamed liturgy on your hand-held device. As it becomes time for Communion, you may then line up on the sidewalk near the Lindell church entrance, observing six-foot distancing, and a Eucharistic Minister will come out and distribute Communion to you.

The nature of the Eucharist is that it be celebrated within the context of community prayer. That is why we are emphasizing that you participate in our live-streamed mass, and then share with us in the reception of the Body of Christ. Please understand that we are not offering "drive-by Communion."

We will have a special Eventbrite link with our Mass RSVP links for our outdoor Communion. If you intend to take advantage of this, please sign up on the Eventbrite page on our website (available starting Monday, June 8th) so that we know how many hosts to have ready. Please note that this is only for the 5:30 Mass.



Parish Immersion Trip to El Paso, TX: Thursday 10/22/20-Tuesday 10/27/20

College Church still has plans for a border immersion trip to El Paso, Texas and Juarez, Mexico with the Jesuit ministry 'Encuentro Project' in October 2020. The purpose will be to facilitate learning and awareness about immigration through direct experience, with

a goal of then taking action for immigration justice. The trip has a capacity of 14 people (adults only). All trip participants MUST have a valid passport. The total cost of the trip is expected to be approximately \$850 per individual.

Examples of Potential Activities:

- Meeting parishioners and staff of El Sagrado Corazon (Sacred Heart), a Jesuit parish founded in 1893, located 3 blocks from the Texas/Mexico border. Visit participants and instructors in Social Ministries adult education program. Participate in Sunday liturgy.
- Border Patrol's information tour.
- Diocese's office for immigration legal assistance (DMRS) overview presentation of immigration law.
- Mass with detainees at ICE Detention Center in El Paso. Meet detainees.
- Visiting Annunciation House, a hospitality house for migrants and refugees.
- Presentation on border environmental concerns, given by university professor from Cd. Juarez.
- Programs for the impoverished in Cd. Juarez, Mexico. Meet the people and the leaders (a passport is required); or other U.S. option.
- Eucharists and end-of-day reflections. Common meals in the evening.
