**Reflections from our Parish Life
Coordinator**

"Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her."

Through the Synod on Synodality we have been called into a two year process of journeying together without a pre-determined destination. It's calling us to consider listening and being present as the "job" to be done. It's not something that works well with our white, U.S.-Christian values of productivity, efficiency and S.M.A.R.T. goals. Don't get me wrong, I love all of those things - maybe too much.

But, what Jesus invited Martha to, what the Pope is calling us to, is grounded in a value that we often treat as less important: deep relationship with our God, each other and our world. Not as a means to an end; not as a way to set a SMARTer goal or improve efficiency. We are being reminded of the value and goodness of our deep desire for connection; and the value and goodness of simply being.

So, as we consider our priority lists for the week, maybe include encounter on the list of boxes we get so much pleasure from checking: Spend 5 minutes in silence with your morning coffee to be aware of how God is accompanying you; include sharing highs and lows on your next meeting agenda; listen to your child tell you about the super-funny (and completely unimportant) thing that happened; come to church 10 minutes early to check in with the person you share a pew with; invite your friend for tea even when there are dishes in the sink and unfolded laundry in the chair. And don't apologize for the mess.

Introducing Fr. Tim McMahon, SJ



As Fr. Dan mentioned above, Fr. Tim will be joining us starting on August 1st. Here is a bit about his background so you can start keeping him in your prayers:

Father Timothy McMahon, SJ currently serves as Associate Pastor at St. Matthew the Apostle Parish in St. Louis. Prior to arriving in St. Louis he served as Superior of the Jesuits in Houston and as Pastor of Sacred Heart Parish in El Paso, Texas from 2019-2020. Fr. McMahon was President of Arrupe Jesuit High School in Denver, Colorado from 2010-2018. He served as the Provincial of the Jesuits of the Missouri Province from 2003 – 2009 and as Provincial Assistant for Formation and Secondary Education from 2001 - 2003. Fr. McMahon spent seven years as pastor of St. Frances Xavier Church and elementary school in Kansas City, Missouri and adjunct professor of Biology at Rockhurst University (1994 -2002). He also served in the Province Offices as Vocation Director and Provincial Assistant for Planning (1991-1994). He did pastoral ministry in Santa Tecla, El Salvador (1987-1989) and taught Biology at St. John's College in Belize (1982-1984) .and at De Smet Jesuit High School in St. Louis, Missouri. (1989-1991)

Fr. McMahon is a native of St. Louis, Missouri, attended St. Louis University High School and Saint Louis University before entering the Jesuit Novitiate in Denver, Colorado in 1976. During his course of formation, he earned Bachelors degrees in Philosophy and Slavic Studies from Saint Louis University; a Masters of Divinity from the Weston School of Theology in Cambridge, Massachusetts; an MS in Biology from the University of Illinois at Chicago, and an MA in Theology from the University of Central America José Simeón Cañas in San Salvador, El Salvador.

Bridges Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius in Everyday Life



Are you seeking a deepened prayer life and a more personal relationship with God?

Perhaps you are discerning a major life decision, or simply seek to walk with Jesus more closely in your life.

The Bridges “Retreat in Everyday Life,” based on the 450+ year-old Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius Loyola, is a nine-month retreat is designed and adapted for persons in all walks of life. A monthly small group meeting with fellow retreatants is offered. The retreat runs September into May, following the life of Jesus in the liturgical year.

Antiracism at College Church

At College Church, antiracism is an expression of our recognition that all are created in the image of God. As such, we respond—personally and collectively—to the call to identify, and to actively challenge, structures and systems that devalue people on the basis of race, and to practice restoration in the pursuit of justice.

Forward Through Ferguson— Creating Paths Toward Racial Equity

Engaging the community was at the heart of the work of the Ferguson Commission from the very beginning. This body was appointed by then Governor Jay Nixon in 2014 in response to the death of Michael Brown by a police officer and the civil unrest that ensued. The 16-member board was tasked with identifying the underlying causes of inequity in our region and developing recommendations to promote progress, equality, and safety. Entitled *Forward Through Ferguson: A Path Toward Racial Equity* (<https://forwardthroughferguson.org/report/executive-summary/>), the summary report of the Commission includes numerous calls to action with focused attention on systems of justice, the needs of youth, economic opportunity, and racial equity.

Members of the Commission were not content to end with a report. They recognized that bringing healing and growth to our region required continued commitment and the ongoing engagement of stakeholders, civic leaders, and faith leaders. Forward Through Ferguson (<https://forwardthroughferguson.org/>) (FTF) is now a 501 (c)(3) organization and is leading multiple initiatives to advance racial equity in our region. As outlined in the action plan for STL2039 (dropbox.com/s/yj5piypu7ujusr/FTF_ActionPlan_Final_2up.pdf?dl=0), FTF encourages us to imagine and create a community where race does not predict a person's outcome, and where all have an opportunity to thrive.

This month, FTF launched Transforming911 (transforming911.org/), which examines the emergency call system in our area and invites us all to reimagine public safety. FTF conducted dozens of interviews with public safety officials, dispatchers, and community leaders across the St. Louis region and partnered with AH Datalytics (www.ahdatalytics.com/) to analyze over 1.7 million resident-initiated 911 calls made to the St. Louis County Police Department from 2015 to 2020. This information revealed a major mismatch between why St. Louisans call 911 (mostly for service and medical reasons) and what armed police are trained and equipped to do (use force to arrest and incarcerate). Despite this mismatch, the St. Louis 911 system defaults to sending armed police to almost every situation and St. Louis

municipalities continue to overinvest in policing to the detriment of other municipal services, including health and human services.

Later this year, FTF will release the full Transforming911 report, including data related to the City of St. Louis's 911 system. The data already published reveals multiple factors that result in emergency responses being delayed, inappropriate services being dispatched, and in too many cases causing harm to people of color. Too many in our region have experienced the gut wrenching moment when [help doesn't answer](#) or [takes too long to arrive](#). Some, mistrustful of our policing system, [choose not to call 911 to begin with](#).

The interviews and data already shared at [Transforming911](#) indicates our present public safety system perpetuates racial inequities. And because 911 is the front door to our public safety system, if we want to reimagine public safety, we have to transform 911.

justice directive to love all people. We pray for those who experience racial injustice and for those who perpetrate it. Our weekly gathering allows people driving and walking by to know that our Catholic Church is committed to the dignity and safety of all people. We demonstrate that commitment by standing together for an hour to pray. The moments between our spoken prayer are filled with the silent prayer in our hearts.


