# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



The latest edition of our Jesuit province magazine concludes with a reflection from Fr. Lasantha de Abrew, SJ. He works with the Jesuit Refugee Services of East Africa. Fr. de Abrew and his team have experienced the anxiety and uncertainty of the COVID-19 pandemic. Charite Lobo, a refugee from Congo, told him, "There is no need to be anxious. You fear because of uncertainties. We, as refugees, experienced these uncertainties from the very first moment we started running from our countries."

Perspective is a powerful gift. It enables us to place ourselves and our concerns in a broader context. The words of Charite Lobo help us remember there are millions of people whose daily bread is anxiety and uncertainty. Christian faith is not dependent upon security, order and the control we so desperately seek. Times of crisis have always been the measure of how well we can deepen the faith we proclaim.

Now let me be clear I am not saying we should ignore or discount the difficulties we experience. The anxiety and uncertainty I have felt since March has been very real, and I suspect you feel the same. What I do suggest is this moment can enable us to see two important graces. The first is that authentic discipleship is often lived in the midst of struggle. Second, the experience of suffering should increase our compassion. Everything is an opportunity for us to grow in our friendship with God. How is that happening for us right now?

# Bridges Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius in Everyday Life

Looking for a deeper prayer life and a close relationship with God? If so, please consider the "Bridges Retreat in Everyday Life" based on the 450+ year-old Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius. This retreat is designed and adapted for persons in all walks of life. The retreat consists of daily prayer and journaling (experiencing discernment, contemplation, meditation).

The retreat runs September into May and coincides with the Church's liturgical calendar. You meet weekly with a Prayer Companion who listens to your experiences and provides oral and written guidance through the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola.

#### **Bishops Endorse Medicaid Expansion**

Saying "Yes on 2" for the August 4<sup>th</sup> primary election ballot to expand Medicaid, providing healthcare to the most vulnerable citizens in our midst, will give Catholics an opportunity to live out their Catholic social teaching beliefs. That is the essence of a letter signed by the state's four bishops that was issued late last January. The letter speaks out for poor Missourians that include the elderly, the disabled, pregnant women and children.

As it is, Missouri taxpayer money goes to Washington, D.C., to fund healthcare for 36 other states including New York and California. "In our Catholic ministries throughout the state...we find that there are



still many Missouri citizens who lack access to affordable healthcare coverage that is so necessary for human flourishing," the bishops contended.

Additionally, the letter indicates that Medicaid expansion is all about saving lives and is pro-life. "Our commitment to life is unwavering and lives are at stake," the bishops wrote. "We must make decisions on what we currently know to be true."

Dear St. Francis Xavier (College) Church Parishioners and Friends,

Hello and God's blessings. I pray that you are well. It is certainly not a normal St. Louis summer, but I hope that you and all those you love remain safe.

I want to share with you some financial information regarding the parish. Thank you for your incredible commitment to the stability of College Church. Your amazing generosity has enabled us to withstand the stress of the coronavirus pandemic. Giving to the parish has been maintained despite the impact of no public masses for over two months, and limited attendance since June. The fiscal year just ended indicates we met our budget goals. That we were able to do so in the midst of such uncertainty is due to you. It is a sign of your love for this community. I am grateful for your making possible the ministry of St. Francis Xavier. Unfortunately, the challenges created by Covid-19 remain. The budget for fiscal year 2020-21 reflects this reality. We have budgeted for a deficit of \$215,000. Slightly more than half of this deficit is due to lower estimated revenues in offertory and rental of our ballroom. I am confident in our ability to navigate this time with creativity. I am also aware the financial difficulties we face are shared by families, businesses, and most especially those in need.

You may recall that last year the decision was made to move our parish Gala to a every other year format. That choice has proven wise in light of our inability to gather in person. What this presents, however, is a \$100,000 gap in our budget given our reliance on Gala revenues to balance our budget. We are planning a fund-raising event the weekend before Thanksgiving which will be, of course, virtual. Please keep an eye out for more information.

I start my ninth year as pastor in a few months, and this has been the most difficult period by far. We will face many struggles in the months to come. But this parish community has weathered plenty of storms over the past 180 years. We know this has also been an experience of grace helping us see with new eyes and imagine new possibilities. Thank you again for all you do to support and live our mission. It remains an honor and privilege to serve at College Church. May God continue to give an abundance of faith, hope, and love to all who call this place home.

Dear Friends in Christ.

Since 1956, the Archdiocese of St. Louis has sent over 45 archdiocesan priests to serve the people of Bolivia, one of the poorest countries in South America. This year, we offer praise and thanks to our Lord, as Fr. Patrick Hayden and Fr. James Michler continue to serve in the Latin America Apostolate, each with over 25 years of missionary service to the apostolate. Their perseverance and endurance, especially in the midst of the recent crisis in Bolivia, is an outstanding testimony to their faith and to the support and encouragement they receive through the faithful of our local archdiocese.

All of us are facing unprecedented challenges because of the pandemic. Pope Francis reminds us,

"Like the disciples in the Gospel we were caught off guard by an unexpected, turbulent storm. We have realized that we are on the same boat, all of us fragile and disoriented, but at the same time important and needed, all of us called to row together, each of us in need of comforting the other. On this boat... are all of us. Just like those disciples, who spoke anxiously with one voice, saying 'We are perishing' (v. 38), so we too have realized that we cannot go on thinking of ourselves, but only together can we do this" (Meditation in Saint Peter's Square, 27 March 2020).

Right now, we have the opportunity to come together. We are the Body of Christ and are called to live this reality; comforting one another. One of the ways we can do this is through the support of our Latin America Apostolate. Our brothers and sisters in Bolivia are, too, suffering the effects of the pandemic. Without the prayers and sacrifices of the people of the Archdiocese of St. Louis, our Latin America Apostolate could not offer pastoral care, formation, catechesis, and social services to the parish community of Maria Reina. Ask God how He is calling you to participate in this mission financially. Please pray for our Latin America Apostolate, missionaries, and all involved with this ministry. The annual collection for our Latin America Apostolate will take place in all parishes during the weekend of August 1st & 2nd.

I am asking God's blessings on you and your families, and am grateful for your support of our Latin America Apostolate.

# Parish Immersion Trip to El Paso, TX: Thursday 10/22/20-Tuesday 10/27/20

College Church still has plans for a border immersion trip to El Paso, Texas and Juarez, Mexico with the Jesuit ministry 'Encuentro Project' in October 2020. The purpose will be to facilitate learning and awareness about immigration through direct experience, with

a goal of then taking action for immigration justice. The trip has a capacity of 14 people (adults only). All trip participants MUST have a valid passport. The total cost of the trip is expected to be approximately \$850 per individual.

#### **Examples of Potential Activities:**

- Meeting parishioners and staff of *El Sagrado Corazon* (Sacred Heart), a Jesuit parish founded in 1893, located 3 blocks from the Texas/Mexico border. Visit participants and instructors in Social Ministries adult education program. Participate in Sunday liturgy.
- Border Patrol's information tour.
- Diocese's office for immigration legal assistance (DMRS) overview presentation of immigration law.
- Mass with detainees at ICE Detention Center in El Paso. Meet detainees.
- Visiting Annunciation House, a hospitality house for migrants and refugees.
- Presentation on border environmental concerns, given by university professor from Cd. Juarez.
- Programs for the impoverished in Cd. Juarez, Mexico. Meet the people and the leaders (a passport is required); or other U.S. option.
- Eucharists and end-of-day reflections. Common meals in the evening.
