FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The feast of the Assumption of Mary falls on a Sunday this year. So we are able to celebrate this weekend. The specific date of the 15th of August is ancient but the reason for it has been lost to history. We believe Mary's body was "assumed" into heaven at the end of her life. Surprisingly, though this faith tradition dates back at least to the 5th century, it was only formally approved as a doctrine of the Catholic Church by Pope Pius XII in 1950. One can never accuse the Church of doing anything in haste.

There is much to ponder on the feast of Mary's Assumption. I want to highlight an aspect that strikes me in particular. The Apostle's Creed states we believe in "the resurrection of the body." Our faith tells us human beings are body and soul, physical and spiritual beings. Because that is who we are, we cannot share in the resurrection as merely dis-embodied spirits. Our bodies are essential. Now what exactly a resurrected body looks like is well beyond my theological and mystical capacity. We will all have to wait and see.

Mary was the first and foremost of believers. She said yes to God's Word and bore Christ. She is the model for all the faithful. It is fitting, therefore, that she is first to share in the fruits of His resurrection. God's favor to Mary is the same hope we have for ourselves. The Feast of the Assumption of Mary reminds us of our sharing in Christ's life forever.

Antiracism at College Church

Our Parish Racial Equity Review: Some Frequently Asked Questions

In recent issues of the bulletin, articles have provided information about the racial equity review that our parish hopes to undertake, likely with the assistance of the Crossroads Antiracism Organizing and Training organization. Following is an effort to address, in a more specific way, questions that may arise about the content and process of a racial equity review.

What is a Parish Racial Equity Review?

The term “racial equity” describes a condition of fairness and justice in policy, practice, and opportunity designed to address the impacts of historic racial discrimination. Systemic racism within our society and, specifically, within our Church, has caused inequitable outcomes in a variety of areas, among them decision making, power-sharing, and cultural inclusion. A parish racial equity review is a process of scrutinizing our congregation's policies, practices, and cultural messages to determine the ways in which they may perpetuate racial inequity and to recommend remedies for identified disparities.

Why are we, at College Church, conducting a Parish Racial Equity Review?

In their 1979 Pastoral Letter on Racism, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops describe racism—a violation of fundamental human dignity—as an “evil which endures in our society and in our Church.” We are similarly instructed by Pope Francis and several of his predecessors, by Catholic Social Teaching, and by the Universal Apostolic Preferences of the Society of Jesus. At College Church, we have set as a priority the aim of becoming an antiracist parish, one that opposes racism in all its forms and manifestations. To work toward that end we must first acquire information about every aspect of our parish's organizational structure and services and then analyze that data for evidence of systemic racism. With the knowledge that the parish review yields, we will be able to undertake the transformative change of becoming a multicultural, antiracist, and affirming parish.

What role will the Crossroads Organization have in our parish racial equity review process?

Crossroads, to fulfill its mission of dismantling racism, has partnered with a variety of for-profit and nonprofit institutions, as well as with religious organizations and

and congregations. For College Church, Crossroads proposes to provide a conceptual model for the review process; the methods, tools, and training needed to conduct the review; and the support of skilled facilitators and consultants.

When will the Review begin, and how long will it take?

A tentative timeline suggests that the parish racial equity review will take place over the course of nine to twelve months. This proposed timeline would allow the findings of the equity review to inform the transition, as a parish, to our new model of leadership. If, as seems probable, an agreement to obtain assistance from Crossroads is formalized, the review process could be expected to begin in late September or early October.

Righting a Wrong: Japanese Americans and World War II

The Soldiers Memorial Military Museum

The exhibit examines the incarceration of 75,000 Americans of Japanese ancestry and 45,000 Japanese nationals following the attack on Pearl Harbor. Old and young lived together in crowded, hastily built camps; endured poor living conditions; and were under constant watch of military guards for two and half years.

Meanwhile, brave Japanese-American men risked their lives fighting for the United States. Some 40 years later, members of the Japanese-American community led the nation to confront the wrong it had done and urged Congress to make it right.

Under President George H. W. Bush, the first redress checks of \$20,000 were distributed in October 1990 to survivors. Locating and identifying the 82,219 former camp inmates took ten years with a total of \$1.6 billion paid in reparations.

Highlighted in the exhibit are two prominent St. Louisans: Gyo Obata and Richard Henmi, both graduates of the Washington University (St. Louis) School of Architecture. Obata was one of the founding partners of the HOK firm, and Henmi designed the Mansion House on the St. Louis waterfront and the “flying saucer” building located at Forest Park Avenue and Grand Boulevard.

The internment of Japanese Americans during the Second World War is a clear example of an action based on “race prejudice, war hysteria and a failure of political leadership,”* as there was never any documented evidence of espionage or sabotage. It is another sad chapter of our shared history that we must vow never to forget and never to repeat.

A recommendation from Lisa Burks:

Some of My Best Friends are Black: The Strange Story of Integration in America was written by Tanner Colby in an effort to answer his own questions about how racial divisions remain—decades past the Civil Rights era. He shares the answers he found, including the personal stories of individuals who are part of systems that maintain racial separation and inequity—namely: housing, education, advertising, and religion. Colby describes his own connection to each of these social and organizational structures and clarifies the ways in which we all are impacted. Writing in a style that is part personal narrative and part journalistic inquiry, this book helps each of us to recognize our role in the story of race and shares the journey of some who worked for unity and justice. That journey includes a stop in a Jesuit parish in Grand Coteau, LA and encourages us to persist in seeking racial equity and reconciliation.
