

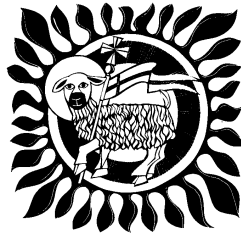

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

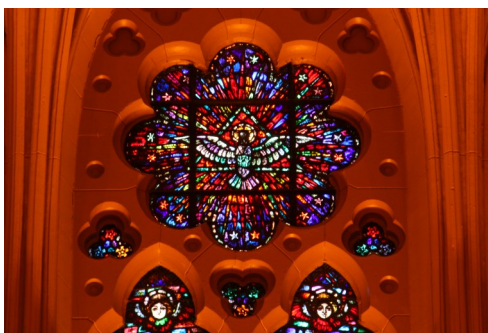
I wrote last week on how leadership at College Church has looked over the course of our long history. We have benefitted from many people, Jesuits and lay, who have devoted themselves to the mission of the parish. Different times and circumstances have required various responses and approaches to ministry. What has remained constant is the desire to serve God's people.

Now I want to share in a bit more personal reflection. It is important to note the labors of the recent pastors who proceeded me. I inherited a thriving parish, a talented staff, and a long history of parishioner involvement in the work of College Church. This has not been a "one-man operation" for a long, long time. Besides, I have never found that an attractive way to exercise leadership no matter the situation.

My approach has been to build and expand upon this foundation of shared leadership. I have done so by strengthening the responsibility of ministry commissions, creating the parish administrator position, working closely with the pastoral council, seeking greater ties with SLU, emphasizing our common mission with the Society of Jesus, and so on. This is a dynamic, complicated faith community. I have neither the ability nor the desire to oversee and control every aspect of SFX. I am confident you do not want that either.

I am convinced the best exercise of leadership at College Church, both now and in the future, is collaborative. I have profited immensely from the expertise, input, and yes, leadership of so many during my time here. This has enabled our parish to flourish and thrive. I believe the Holy Spirit continues to invite us to imagine creative ways to further our mission. I pray we have the grace to respond with generosity and boldness.

Antiracism Efforts at College Church

You have been told what is good, and what the Lord requires of you: only to do the right and to love goodness, and to walk humbly with your God.

—Micah 6:8

“I can't breathe.” Those words—the last utterance of a dying man, and our witness of the horror of George Floyd's death—haunt us. They have driven some of us, in this time of pandemic, into the streets in protest. They demand that each of us evaluate what we are doing to promote racial justice. How have we, as individuals, within our families, and as members of our faith community, challenged our own biases in order to live the Gospel more fully?

Spurred to action by the similarly tragic death of Michael Brown and widespread area unrest, members of College Church leadership felt called to commit, in a substantial and sustained way, to creating a parish community that not only is not racist, but that is antiracist . . . a parish that—impelled by the love of Christ, informed by Catholic social teaching, and infused with Ignatian spirituality—opposes racism in all of its dimensions. That commitment entails deep self-scrutiny; an examination of how to effectively partner, as a parish, with other St. Louis social justice organizations; and a willingness to let go of the familiar, where necessary, in the pursuit of meaningful change.

Formalizing that response, parish leaders assembled, in 2018, the St. Francis Xavier Antiracism Team. With the guidance of the Crossroads Antiracism Organizing and Training group, the team convened focus groups through which parishioners expressed concern for the sin of racism, a desire to understand more deeply its systems and structures, and an intention to find paths to healing and reconciliation.

The goal of becoming an antiracist institution has since been identified as a priority in the parish's strategic plan. Using a self-evaluative instrument developed by Crossroads, the College Church—as a parish in the process of identity change—is on course to becoming an affirming institution, one that regards racial and cultural differences as gifts. Toward that end, Antiracism Team members, several of whom have undergone introductory training offered by Crossroads, are seeking—as the coronavirus restrictions allow—to engage in a more in-depth training experience, with partners from the St. Louis Archdiocesan Peace and Justice Commission, the North City Deanery, and the Jesuits of the Central and Southern Province, for the purpose of analyzing our current parish practices and creating just and equitable structures. Awaiting the commencement of that training, members of the Antiracism Team have undertaken thorough study of a work, *Becoming an Anti-Racist Church*, written by Crossroads' cofounder, Rev. Joseph Brandt.

Simultaneously, the parish's Racism and Reconciliation Committee has been hard at work planning activities—including the Lenten Racial Justice Journey; supporting the Social Ministry Commission in the development of an antiracism library; and working collaboratively with our community partners, such as the Peace and Justice Committee at St. Alphonsus Ligouri “Rock” Church. Through the efforts of the Racism and Reconciliation Committee, our representation in the Catholic Racial Justice Collaborative—a multiracial group of lay and religious leaders in parishes throughout the St. Louis area dedicated to overcoming racism in our Church and community—has increased. Likewise, our ties to Metropolitan Congregations United—an organization that works with member churches to impact public policy in support of disadvantaged and marginalized people—have strengthened, and we have been buoyed by serving with those in neighboring parishes on the North City Deanery's Interracial Relations Committee.

The Grace of the Spirit is evident as individuals, ministries, and commissions have answered the call to recognize and reject racism, and have begun to incorporate it into the work of the parish and beyond. We are grateful for and encouraged by homilies that decry racism, suggestions for diverse reading material, personal demonstrations, and the deeper conversations happening within families, among friends, among our parish ministers, in the pews, and on the steps outside of church. The work is growing. The last breaths of George Floyd, Michael Brown, and the sad litany of others whose lives were lost have become our inspiration.

Thank you for all of the ways you welcome the Holy Spirit to work within you to bring about God's Kingdom. Please accept an open invitation to contribute your thoughts, comments, questions, and concerns to members of the Antiracism Team and to join us to actively participate in this work. Expect regular updates as we progress in this effort. And, finally, let us hold one another in prayer as we journey together toward becoming a fully inclusive church and authentically the Body of Christ.
