**Reflection from our Parish Life Coordinator**

I have been reflecting on Fr. Tim's homily from last Sunday. For any who may have missed it, he talked about St. Ignatius' vision of God the Father placing Ignatius with Jesus holding his cross. Ignatius hears Jesus say, I wish you to serve us. Fr. Tim remarked, "That profound grace for Ignatius changes everything. He begins to make better decisions... He came to know that God the father placed [Ignatius] with his son and that his son accepted him as his follower. And finally, Ignatius knew who he was [to God]; How profoundly he was loved by God."

I haven't had a vision that I would compare to Ignatius' vision. But in some parenting moments, I feel like I have been able to see as God sees, to love as God loves and to recognize that I am profoundly loved by God. There have been many "visions" for me along the way. The first time I held Alice I was overwhelmed by how much love I felt for her. I remember crying and laughing at the same time - no one expression of emotion could hold it all. Until then, I had never thought of God crying and laughing with overwhelming love for me.

Another "vision" came at 2am when she was just a month or two old. She wasn't sleeping (she rarely slept at night) and she was screaming - the kind of scream that makes you wish for the soothing sound of a smoke detector. I knew there was nothing wrong and I also knew there wasn't much I could do except try to comfort her. At one point she grabbed my bare skin with her little sharp fingernails and squeezed as hard as she could. And I remember crying because it hurt and I was exhausted and at the same time feeling grateful that I could share in her suffering. I came to understand in a new way that God isn't just open to hearing about my struggles, God *wants to share* them with me. God would forgo yet another night's sleep just to comfort me.

I think we all have these everyday visions - these moments of profound grace. They may not be as mystical as St. Ignatius' vision, but they happen more often. And like with St. Ignatius, they can remind us of who we are to God and help us make decisions based on what God wants for us rather than based on what we need to prove to God or the world.

### Introducing Fr. Tim McMahon, SJ



As Fr. Dan mentioned above, Fr. Tim is now our canonical pastor. Here is a bit about his background so you can start keeping him in your prayers:

Father Timothy McMahon, SJ most recently served as Associate Pastor at St. Matthew the Apostle Parish in St. Louis. Prior to arriving in St. Louis he served as Superior of the Jesuits in Houston and as Pastor of Sacred Heart Parish in El Paso, Texas from 2019-2020. Fr. McMahon was President of Arrupe Jesuit High School in Denver, Colorado from 2010-2018. He served as the Provincial of the Jesuits of the Missouri Province from 2003 – 2009 and as Provincial Assistant for Formation and Secondary Education from 2001 - 2003. Fr. McMahon spent seven years as pastor of St. Frances Xavier Church and elementary school in Kansas City, Missouri and adjunct professor of Biology at Rockhurst University (1994 -2002). He also served in the Province Offices as Vocation Director and Provincial Assistant for Planning (1991-1994). He did pastoral ministry in Santa Tecla, El Salvador (1987-1989) and taught Biology at St. John's College in Belize (1982-1984) .and at De Smet Jesuit High School in St. Louis, Missouri. (1989-

Fr. McMahon is a native of St. Louis, Missouri, attended St. Louis University High School and Saint Louis University before entering the Jesuit Novitiate in Denver, Colorado in 1976. During his course of formation, he earned Bachelors degrees in Philosophy and Slavic Studies from Saint Louis University; a Masters of Divinity from the Weston School of Theology in Cambridge, Massachusetts; an MS in Biology from the University of Illinois at Chicago, and an MA in Theology from the University of Central America José Simeón Cañas in San Salvador, El Salvador.

## City Parking Fees Help Pay for College

If we could list all of the many reasons we love to come to College Church, we can be

confident that parking would not be included. Admittedly, some people may value the extra steps gained from the hike to a SLU parking lot or garage, and many in our community arrive by bike, public transportation, or live close enough to walk. However, many more will readily admit feelings somewhere between relief and rejoicing as they shift the transmission into “park” in a spot near the church. This Sunday ritual becomes a bit more challenging when Mass, meetings, and events invite us to gather during the week. Monday through Saturday, city parking fees are required and payment through the meter is enforced. However, like many who live and work in the city, we accept these requirements because—despite the cost and vexation of parking—we value our community and relationships.

In addition to our devotion to College Church, there is another reason this burden is also a blessing. Since 2015, revenue from parking fees collected in the City of St. Louis funds a program called College Kids. Through this system, every kindergarten student enrolled in St. Louis public and charter schools receives a savings account with a \$50 deposit. Additional deposits may be earned through strong attendance and family participation in financial education programs. Families may also deposit money into the account and receive matching funds up to \$100 per year. Upon graduation, funds may be used to pay college tuition or the fees for other postsecondary education or training programs.

Such systems have demonstrated their effectiveness. Research shows that even with less than \$500 saved, children are three times more likely to enroll in college and four times more likely to graduate from college than children without college savings accounts.

So, next time you pay a city parking meter, a parking fine, or park in one of the city-owned garages, you will be helping to build a more promising future for a young person in St. Louis. While we continue to advocate for more equitable educational systems for all students in our

region, we can take this small step to create a more hopeful future for St. Louis children.

## HB 1878: The New Missouri Voting Act

Approved last May by the Missouri legislature and signed into law this summer by Governor Mike Parson, HB 1878 changes the procedures to vote in the wake of unsubstantiated claims of voter fraud. In November, voters will be required to present a government-issued photo identification (e.g. a non-expired Missouri driver license). The new law removes previously accepted forms of identification such as student IDs, voter registration cards, bank statements, and utility bills. If the voter lacks the proper ID, they can cast a provisional ballot, but it will not be counted unless they return the same day with a proper ID or have an election official match their ballot with a signature on file. Twice the Missouri Supreme Court has found that reducing the number of acceptable forms of voter identification is unconstitutional.

Additional components of HB 1878 include:

- ..# Repealing the use of mail-in ballots — though allowing certain absentee ballots—and prohibiting drop boxes for absentee ballots;
- ..# Establishing a two-week period of no-excuse absentee voting, but only for those able to vote in person at the election office;
- ..# Banning the use of electronic vote-counting machines that can connect to the internet, and banning all electronic vote-counting machines after January 1, 2024, making the paper ballot the official method of voting;
- ..# Giving power to the Missouri Secretary of State to conduct audits of voter rolls and to remove ineligible voters; and
- ..# Eliminating the Missouri presidential primary in favor of a caucus system to select delegates for presidential nominating conventions.

Denise Lieberman, director and general counsel with the Missouri Voter Protection Coalition, says “HB 1878 places unnecessary, unconstitutional and burdensome voting restrictions that undermine Missourians’ right to vote, and undermines free and fair elections in Missouri.”

Lieberman will challenge the law this fall in court. Secretary of State Jay Ashcroft says “the bill is very clear and understandable to the people. If you are registered, you can vote.” On the other hand, Derek Tisler, counsel of the Brennan Center for Justice, says “the challenges facing our democracy are unprecedented and we’re only beginning to understand their impact and long-term implications.” HB 1878 takes effect on August 28, in time for the midterm elections in November 2022. Look for updates about HB 1878 in this section of the bulletin as we go into the fall season.

### History Highlights: SFX School Days

*With summer vacation drawing to a close and school doors about to reopen, it's interesting to take a look back at the elementary and high schools that were formerly part of St. Francis Xavier parish. We'll begin with St. Vincent's Free School.*

On Easter Sunday, 1843, the newly constructed College Church, at Ninth and Christy in downtown St. Louis, held its first Mass. One month later, St. Francis Xavier opened the first parish-based school for girls in St. Louis. Originally known as St. Vincent's Free School, it was located in the basement of the church and was operated, at the invitation of Father George Carroll, S.J., by the Sisters of Charity. The school was free of charge, although those who were able to pay were encouraged to do so. St. Vincent's is said to have been a success from its start, opening with one hundred thirty pupils and having an enrollment, as of 1845, of two hundred eighty girls. The school later moved into a new building at St. Charles and Tenth Street and, in 1875, relocated to Grand and Lucas, when it became known as St. Vincent's Academy. The school closed permanently in 1909 because of low enrollment and the number of other Catholic school options in the area, but it is believed to have contributed to the growth of Catholic life in St. Louis.

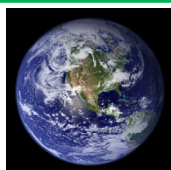


