FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The wildfires in the West are the worst in recent memory. There have always been fires, of course, in that part of the country. However, experts indicate that climate change is changing the frequency, duration and intensity of these blazes. Hot, dry summers create the conditions for fires. Mild winters plus a lack of significant moisture is the recipe for disaster. Sadly, the destruction and loss of life experienced in the West has become the new normal.

Our response to the environmental crisis is often conditioned by its apparent incremental nature. How can we act when it is a disaster taking place in slow motion? The truth is the signs are all around us. The wildfires are but the most recent revelation that our failure to care for creation is already wreaking havoc. The calamity is upon us.

Christians are called to stay awake and pay attention. We discern the signs of the times and respond. Wishful thinking and ignoring the obvious are not Christian virtues. The Church seeks to work with all of those around the globe who are committed to change.

Fourth Sunday of the Season of Creation

September 27, 2020 | 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

SCRIPTURES

Ezekiel 18:25-28

Ps. 25:4-9

Philippians 2:1-11

Matthew 21:28-32



In this Season of Creation, we have prayed over our calling to recognize the global climate emergency in which we are living and spread the word about the call to conversion and change that it presents.

The ways the human family is living on the planet, the ways our economies function and the values they serve are depleting and wasting Earth's resources, creating great inequalities, suffering and injustice, and exceeding Earth's regenerative capacity.

Earth is crying out. The poor are crying out. The existence and wellbeing of future generations is threatened. This all constitutes a strong and urgent call to conversion in all dimensions of life.

In today's readings, we hear clearly from Ezekiel that this conversion is the personal responsibility of each of us. God will judge us in the end upon the choices we each make of how we will live with each other in the community of creation. It is never too late to choose God's ways. God is always compassionate and forgiving, ready to teach us the way.

St. Paul reminds us that Christ Jesus is that teaching, is God's demonstration of the Way to live: serving everyone compassionately and generously, not competing for attention, appreciation, wealth or glory, humble and self-sacrificing, even to the point of death on a cross. For this God exalted him, glorifying him above every other.

And in the gospel, Jesus warns that words, that simply saying the right things, is not enough. Our actions must show our conversion, a conversion that in these critical times in the history of our planet must be integral, a conversion to action in the ecological, social, economic, cultural, and political dimensions of our lives.

Points for Reflection on the Scriptures

Reading from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel. Our decisions for evil or for good matter for God.

The message Ezekiel is affirming is that the major decisions affecting the direction of our lives – even late in life – are matters of life and death for us. Our decisions matter. God pays attention to personal responsibility.

It is never too late in life to respond to God's call to conversion. How can we become more attentive to that call in how we relate to creation?

YOUTH FAITH FORMATION NEWS**Youth Faith Classes Resume This Sunday**

College Church Youth Faith Formation Classes will begin Sunday, September 27. In an abundance of caution they will begin virtually, with a commitment to return to live classes as soon as it is safe.

Both RE and Catechesis of the Good Shepherd virtual classes will replicate the in-person classes as closely as possible. Classes for children in sacramental years will concentrate on sacramental preparation. There will be times when students in those years come together outside or in the ballroom for activities specific to that preparation.

There will be opportunities to come together even as we learn virtually. We will have Class Masses with seating in designated areas of the Church, and we will come together for penance services.

We will offer opportunities and suggestions for service work, either done independently at home, or in safe gatherings in the ballroom or outside.

It is all our hope and prayer that this is a very temporary situation. In the meantime we feel this structure will allow you and your family to maintain and nurture the role of faith in your life and keep a connection with our YFF family.

New Classrooms for Atrium Levels I and II.

When students return to their Atrium classes, they will have a dedicated space which is much more easily accessible. Level I and II classrooms will all be in a large area behind the Ballroom in the space of the former Chapel.

All the rooms are larger than the current ones, and they will have a dedicated entry, down the ramp on the southside of the church. There are no steps so monitored entry and social distancing will not present a problem. Parents can park in the Laclede garage, which is free on Sunday, and just make a short trip through the campus to the Atrium door.

There are two options for receiving your items, which you will specify upon placing your online order. Both options occur twice a month on 1st and 3rd Sundays:

Hand Delivery (only for orders of \$20 or more): One of our volunteers will deliver your products to your porch or in front of your home. If requesting delivery of orders which contain chocolate, please plan for immediate retrieval of your package in order to protect chocolate from melting. Volunteers will ring your doorbell/buzzer or knock on your door when dropping off items.

Pick-up at College Church (orders of any value): Pick-ups at the College Church will be pre-collected into bags with the buyer’s name displayed on the outside of the bag, available from 9-10:15am outside of the Ballroom (below the church) on the designated Sundays. We ask that parishioners wear a face mask and continue to practice social distancing during pick-up.
