**Reflections from our  
Parish Life Coordinator**

Two weeks ago the Archdiocese presented several proposals for how parishes might be consolidated as part of All Things New. The presentation was made to priests, parish life coordinators and the Archdiocesan pastoral council. I was pleasantly surprised about how the meeting went. When I left the meeting I felt more optimistic about All Things New than when I arrived. I think that's mostly because I got a clearer sense of the process.

Here is some of the clarity I got:

I knew the scale of the change coming out of All Things New would be big - and it will be. However, it became clear that the change was not predetermined. For the purposes of All Things New, the Archdiocese has been divided up into 15 geographic planning areas. For each planning area there are anywhere from three to five different proposals for how the area will be reorganized. A lot of thinking has gone into the process so far and very few decisions have been made yet.

There will be more listening than I thought. Those who are leading All Things New are in a phase of actively seeking feedback about the proposals. They hope each round of feedback will bring them greater clarity and show them where to make adjustments to their proposals. So far, priests, parish life coordinators and the Archdiocesan pastoral council have given feedback. Next month key parish leaders will give feedback. And the following month all parishioners will have the chance to give feedback.

I have been worried that this process would just be about loss and closure. Fr. Chris Martin, who is leading All Things New, made a point that I really needed to hear. He declared to all of us gathered that in the next phase of this process we will get to the "New" part of All Things New.

Finally, Fr. Martin repeated something that Archbishop Rozanski has said multiple times. There should be a Catholic presence in every square mile of the Archdiocese. I take that statement as an Archdiocesan commitment to which leaders should be held accountable as well as an opportunity for all of us to be creative in imagining what a "Catholic presence" could look like.

## Antiracism at College Church

*At College Church, antiracism is an expression of our recognition that all are created in the image of God. As such, we respond—personally and collectively—to the call to identify, and to actively challenge, structures and systems that devalue people on the basis of race, and to practice restoration in the pursuit of justice.*

### What Is Antiracism?

Responding to that question with a clear, comprehensive, yet concise answer is challenging. But arriving at an answer in order to explain and anchor our efforts here at College Church is important. Toward that end, members of the Antiracism Team and the Parish Racial Equity Review Team contributed their thoughts about the meaning of antiracism, and a review of those written comments yielded three elements essential to the definition.

First, antiracism involves elevating our awareness, identifying racism, recognizing and acknowledging it. Second, antiracism requires resistance, opposing racism, challenging it, dismantling it. And third, antiracism includes the idea of rebuilding, recreating, restoring, and reimagining just structures. With these elements named, three additional components emerged.

The work of antiracism must be active. As antiracists we move from the passivity and/or neutrality of being non-racist, to being active and intentional. Perhaps most important for us at College Church, antiracism is an expression of our faith; it is that grounding in faith that gives our antiracism work its impetus. And, given that our efforts are part of our life as a parish, antiracism engages us both personally and collectively, individually and communally.

With these many elements in mind, the statement that now appears at the top of this section each week—which we expect will evolve as we continue to grow in our understanding—is offered in answer to the question:

What is antiracism? As we proceed, during the course of this year, with our parish racial equity review, antiracism as our aim, hope, and inspiration is our North Star.

### History Highlights – SFX School Days, Part II

*As the lazy days of summer recede and school doors reopen, it's interesting to take a look back at the elementary and high schools that were formerly part of St. Francis Xavier parish.*

Recently, journeying back in our parish history, we noted that the St. Vincent Free School, opened in 1843 and originally located in the basement of St. Francis Xavier College Church at Ninth and Christy, was the first parish-based school for girls in St. Louis. According to early records, there were, as of 1838, two parish schools for boys in the St. Louis diocese: one in St. Charles and one in Florissant—both run by the Jesuits. The SFX parish school for boys was an outgrowth, according to Gilbert J. Garraghan, S.J., of the day school department of St. Louis University. Initially, the day scholars were provided fairly basic instruction in English or “mercantile education.” Eventually, they were granted admission to more of the educational opportunities enjoyed by boarding students and, in 1842, a school for economically disadvantaged boys—the English Free Male School—was opened in the basement of the church, with Jesuits serving as instructors. In 1845, the school moved to a new three-story building on the grounds of the university. But by 1851, instruction at the school—now with an enrollment of approximately 350 students—was assumed by the Christian Brothers.

**Liturgy Coordinator**

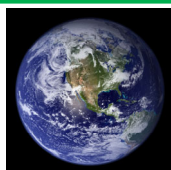
