**FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**



The Church stresses three primary spiritual activities during the season of Lent: prayer, fasting and alms-giving. Today and the next two Sundays I want to focus on these elements of our Lenten observance. Obviously, prayer should be at the center of our lives always. This is not simply a nice addition for the six weeks of Lent. It is just as important in the 22<sup>nd</sup> week of Ordinary Time as it is right now.

So why is prayer singled out? My sense is this season of preparation is concerned with the priority of prayer in our lives. Re-dedicating ourselves to prayerful living means we acknowledge our relationship with Christ requires time, labor, and attentiveness. Prayer is not simply one good among others. It is the foundation for following the Lord. I speak from experience when I say faith without consistent prayer becomes much more about ourselves than Jesus.

The importance is not how we pray, but *that* we pray. The emphasis is not so much on content. The Catholic tradition has a great number of Lenten prayers or devotions that can be helpful. However, the Church is more concerned our prayer comes from a heart open to God. Lent insists that we find more room these days to be present to the Lord. Prayer is not a penance but there is something penitential about carving out space in the midst of busy lives. This may mean rather than doing more in this season, we seek to slow down, take time and be with God.

### Hiding in Plain Sight: The Reality of Everyday Racism

As our country and our communities continue to confront racial inequity and social injustice, we often find ourselves asking, “How did we get here?” “What keeps us from making greater progress?” We know that racism is a barrier to fully living the call of the Gospel, and we seek ways to remove all that separates us from the Beloved Community God intends for us. As individuals and as a parish, we search for ways to make that a reality.

The Antiracism Team at College Church is hosting a virtual series of awareness sessions designed to open our eyes, minds, and hearts ever wider; to help us more fully understand how racism persists; and to guide us on the path to creating greater equity and justice. Participants will share prayer, benefit from the expertise of a guest speaker, and exchange perspectives in small groups. Please join us as we seek to provide a space in which to listen, reflect, and learn to increase our individual and collective awareness of how systemic racism continues to permeate our societal structures and influence our daily interactions. There will be time for questions and answers, and participants will receive resources to aid in continuing the journey.

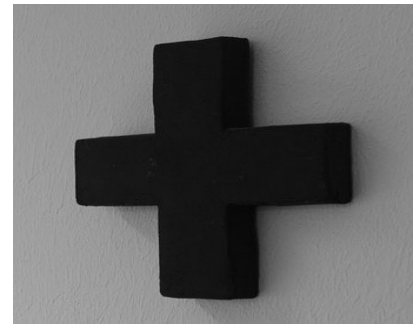

**The Disciplines of Lent**

*Jesus said, "Whoever wishes to be my follower must deny his very self, take up his cross each day, and follow in my steps." (Lk 9:23)*



In response to this call, the Church for centuries has invited Catholics to make the season of Lent one of repentance for sin and a renewal of our baptism. **Baptism and penance** are the two foci of the season. We journey with our catechumens as they prepare to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. We embrace the traditional spiritual practices of **prayer, fasting and almsgiving** in order to deepen our own discipleship.

**Prayer** is the way each of us grows in our relationship with God. Consider adopting the Ignatian practice of praying with the examen (use the *Racial Justice and the Way of the Cross* booklet prepared for us this year); pray the Stations of the Cross to connect with the deep suffering of so many of our brothers and sisters today; commit to more daily prayer time. And remember to journey with catechumens and candidates throughout the Church as they prepare for full incorporation into the Easter mysteries.

**Fasting** helps us remember that we are ultimately dependent, not on food or ourselves, but on God.

**Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** are days of fasting for those 18-59. Fasting means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing in between. Our communal fasting manifests our collective commitment to putting God first in our lives.

**Almsgiving** is a means for us to concretely respond to those who are in need. Giving can include material gifts as well as gifts of the spirit. Ideally, whatever we choose is given not from our excess, but in a way that is sacrificial and makes us do without.

If requesting delivery of orders which contain chocolate, please plan for immediate retrieval of your package in order to protect chocolate from melting. Volunteers will ring your doorbell/buzzer or knock on your door when dropping off items.

Pick-up at College Church (orders of any value): Pick-ups at the College Church will be pre-collected into bags with the buyer's name displayed on the outside of the bag, available from 9-10:15am outside of the Ballroom (below the church) on the designated Sundays. We ask that parishioners wear a face mask and continue to practice social distancing during pick-up.

## Communal Lenten Formation Activity

There is a long tradition of adopting a special practice for Lent in order to make a more generous offering of ourselves to the Lord in this season. As an expression of our communal desire to be formed more deeply by the Lord—not only as individuals but as a parish—we propose that we adopt this common Lenten practice again this year *as a parish*, but through virtual means. Think of this as something you can do, not just for yourself, but for the parish, and even for the whole Church.

**| What We're Proposing |** The idea is to reflect together in small groups on the scriptures for the previous Sunday as a way of entering more deeply into our weekly encounter with the Lord in the Mass. Each week you will receive an email with a brief background to the scripture passages to help you better understand the passages. *What makes this gospel passage "good news"? What new horizon do these scriptures open for me personally and for our parish? How do I sense it forming me more profoundly in the love of God?*


