FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



This Wednesday, Joe Biden will be inaugurated as the President of the United States. Not since President-elect Abraham Lincoln had to sneak into Washington, D.C. in 1860 has the transfer of power taken place in such a fraught time. I ask all of us to pray in a particular way for our country in this moment.

Prayer is about openness to God's desires for us. It requires patient listening rather than a constant speaking of our own needs. A life of prayer is also rooted in the recognition that this is slow, arduous work. There can be extended periods of prayer that can seem hopeless, tedious and even despairing. The great prayer guides of our Catholic tradition like Benedict, Teresa of Avila, and Hildegard knew this. They invite us into the paradox that prayer is always an expression of our greatest need running right smack into our human limitations.

Might I suggest that this is where we find ourselves as Christians and Americans. If there is going to be any real healing, reconciliation and growth for this country, it will mirror our experience of prayer. Prayer is not for the faint-hearted, and neither is confronting our national crisis. The gifts of persistence, hope, fidelity that are essential to the prayer life of a disciple are the same that will make us good citizens. Good spiritual habits are not ours alone. They are for the benefit of all.
