FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I do not believe in coincidence. So, it appears most fitting that we celebrate Mother's Day when we have glorious Easter readings on the topic of love. There are many types of moms, and many ways to be a mother. In much the same way, there are a multitude of ways to experience and express love. Clearly the Holy Spirit is at work.

Let me suggest a way to enter into this truth. The First Letter of St. John includes the line, "Whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love." The absence of love makes it impossible to know God who is perfect love. Let me ask, who was the first person to make us aware of love? Being loved by our mothers was our very first experience of what it means to be loved. Even before we were conscious of it, we received the love of our mothers.

God's love is mediated by our capacity to receive it. I am convinced that capacity is based upon our experience of human love. The love of mothers helps to prepare us to know the love of God. They are opening our hearts to receive divine love by showering us with human love. How did Jesus come to know the intimate love of his Father? Because his mother had already prepared him by her own abundant love.

All the proceeds from our Fair Trade sales go directly to St. Peter Claver in Punta Gorda, Belize. Because of the pandemic, as well as a series of fires which destroyed farms in the community, unemployment in the area has increased dramatically.

There are two options for receiving your items, which you will specify upon placing your online order. Both options occur twice a month on 1st and 3rd Sundays:

Hand Delivery (only for orders of \$20 or more):

One of our volunteers will deliver your products to your porch or in front of your home. If requesting delivery of orders which contain chocolate, please plan for immediate retrieval of your package in order to protect chocolate from melting. Volunteers will ring your doorbell/buzzer or knock on your door when dropping off items.

Pick-up at College Church (orders of any value):

Pick-ups at the College Church will be pre-collected into bags with the buyer's name displayed on the outside of the bag, available from 9-10:15am outside of the Ballroom (below the church) on the designated Sundays. We ask that parishioners wear a face mask and continue to practice social distancing during pick-up.

The deadline for ordering delivery or pick-up for the 1st and 3rd Sunday is the Tuesday before. The next deadline is May 11, for delivery/pick-up on May 16.

St. Peter Claver Parish Updates

St. Peter Claver, our sister parish, is a Roman Catholic Church located in Punta Gorda, Belize. The Jesuits at St. Peter Claver minister to the town of Punta Gorda and 36 villages with Catholic Churches in the Toledo District of Belize.

Food Bank / Church Ministries: Given an increase in food insecurity in the parish as a direct result of the pandemic, St. Peter Claver, in conjunction with their emergency food bank, recently established a St. Vincent DePaul Society, which current feeds 100 families per month. St. Peter Claver is also excited to welcome two Sisters of Charity this summer to help with parish ministries. St. Peter Claver's music ministry is also proud to report it has established a Mass Choir, which will be fully active once Covid-19 regulations permit. Parishioners are back to Mass-in-person following pandemic protocols.



Partnership with St. John's College: St. Peter Claver and St. John's Community College (SJC) in Belize City have initiated a collaborative agreement to bring some higher education classes to Punta Gorda and Corazon communities. The goal is not to rely heavily on online courses since many of the parishioners do not have adequate Internet access or access to technology in the home, but to establish satellite campus with in-person education. The long-term goal is to have fully functional satellite campuses in both Punta Gorda and the Village of Corazon.

Belize Church-State Relationship: St. Peter Claver Parish depends heavily on financial support from Jesuit communities and donors. Because of the pandemic, they have lost over \$200,000 in revenue. Despite this significant loss, St. Peter Claver has worked hard to ensure there would be no layoffs or salary reductions for their 17 parish employees. To the frustration of Fr. Matt, St. Peter Claver primary school has experienced teacher layoffs and pay reductions in an administrative structure that does not provide school staff with health insurance. School administration is the responsibility of the government of Belize, even though



the school is Catholic. Unlike the U.S., there is a partnership between religious organizations and the State to provide primary education, where the state retains control over school administration. Fr. Matt has put together “a very bright and exuberant committee that is investigating other options to this church-state educational system which quite frankly does not work for us.”

Parishioners are also invited to make direct donations on this website or consider sponsoring high school scholarships for our St. Peter Claver Parish primary school children. High Schools in Belize are not supported by the government so high schools charge tuition. Because of this, most students are forced to end their education at 8th grade.

Deadline for sponsoring a sister parish child for high school is Sunday, May 23rd for the 2021-2022 school year. It roughly costs \$225 a year with a 4-year commitment for a high school education in Belize. For more information, contact Lisa DeLorenzo at lisa.c.delorenzo@gmail.com.

St. Francis Xavier Outreach Program Seeks New Volunteers for Summer 2021

Founded in 1993, our program provides financial assistance to those in need to apply for and purchase a Missouri State ID and birth certificate. As you may know, it is impossible to receive employment, housing, child care, and health care (to name a few) without these forms of identification. Since reopening our program last year in June, we have provided IDs and birth certificates to over 3,000 individuals and families.



We could not have accomplished this without the help of our wonderful volunteers and staff. Since we have reopened our program, we are back in business ready to make a difference while being as safe as possible. The need for IDs and birth certificates continues to be great.

We are looking for dedicated teachable volunteers for our program! The ID and Birth Certificate Program is hosted every Tuesday from 9 am-1 pm onsite at College Church. Volunteers are encouraged to give at least two hours of their time each week but our program offers flexibility. We offer on-site volunteer opportunities that comply with CDC guidelines (6-foot distance and masks are required for all) as well as remote administrative positions. After a hiatus during the winter months, weekly Tuesday night vigils for racial justice will begin again on Tuesday, May 4th, and continue each week from 6–7 p.m. You are invited to join on the steps of College Church to stand in prayer and hold signs calling for racial justice locally and nationally.

Originally hosted by the Jesuit scholastics in summer 2020 after the killing of George Floyd, the vigils became a weekly witness, growing to encompass a larger group of St. Louis Catholics. As racial violence continues, as most recently seen in the deaths of Daunte Wright and Adam Toledo, among others, the College Church Racism and Reconciliation Committee wants to continue this public witness and invites all to join in both participation and planning. Update on the new leadership model for College Church

St. Francis Xavier (College) Church is moving to a new model of parish leadership. We will move from a traditional priest-pastor to a Parish Life Coordinator (PLC). Fr. Dan will transition out of his role as pastor and Katie Jansen, who serves currently as our parish administrator, will be our PLC. This change will take place in the latter half of 2022. Katie will have the responsibility of administering and overseeing the parish, as well as participating in and giving pastoral direction to College Church. This position already exists in a number of parishes in the archdiocese. Archbishop Rozanski supports this change.



For those familiar with Jesuit apostolic institutions, Katie will be the director of the work. The director of a work is responsible for the general administration of the works, together with the inspiration, apostolic orientation, and implementation of the mission. She will be accountable for this mission to the Jesuit provincial, Fr. Tom Greene, S.J.

Jesuit leadership is committed to missioning a priest to work full-time at the parish. He will have a critical role in leading the parish in prayer, preaching, celebrating sacraments, and be a resource for deepening the Ignatian Spirituality of SFX. He will serve as a member of Katie's staff.

The transition we are making is not just a change in leadership. It is a change in the way we are community. One could say that we are formalizing a structure that reflects the culture we have all been building at College Church. We have a long history of parishioners shaping the mission and direction of our community. The role that each of us plays makes us who we are, contributes to the body of Christ. Each of us is called to a pastoral role.

Pope Francis is talking a lot about a synodal church which is not simply about involving people in decision making but involving all the baptized in discerning God's will and listening to the Holy Spirit. The goal always is to find the best ways for every baptized person to fulfill the church's mission of proclaiming God's love and salvation in Jesus Christ to the world. Or, as the International Theological Commission writes: "A synodal church is a church of participation and co-responsibility. In exercising synodality she is called to give expression to the participation of all, according to each one's calling...Participation is based on the fact that all the faithful are qualified and called to serve each other through the gifts they have all received from the Holy Spirit."

Those are powerful words. But I've seen us living this call very clearly over the past year. Since we haven't been able to all be in church together, many of you have been ministers in your own homes. You set up your liturgical space and you assembled your congregation. Some of you have become catechists as your children have participated in youth faith formation from home. Some of you even shared your preaching online when we couldn't hold Triduum services last year. Many of us offered pastoral care to family members or others in our communities. Part of embracing synodality is simply naming the significance of the roles we are already called to.

In the coming months we will provide opportunities to discern with one another how we as a community are called to fulfill the church's mission. In preparation for that discernment, I invite you to reflect on this question: what pastoral role is God calling you to?

Third Quarter Financial Summary

Thank you for your financial support as we work to balance our budget during COVID. Back in June, we projected a loss for this year of (\$130,000) using our best estimates of the impact of COVID. As you all know, this has been a year like no other in our lifetimes. In March, 2020 we closed our church and our lives changed in ways we could not imagine. Through the generosity of all of you, support we received through the CARES Act and the efforts of our parish staff in lowering costs, we were able to bridge these challenging months and find ourselves in a strong financial position with one quarter remaining in our fiscal year. The Finance Committee will continue to provide counsel to our pastor, parish administrator and Pastoral Council as we approach the end of our fiscal year on June 30, 2021 and assess our finances for the upcoming year.

- 1) Unrestricted revenue, primarily offertory, is slightly below budget and consistent with prior year.
- 2) Program fees are slightly under budget due to COVID impacting our our Adult and Youth Formation programs.
- 3) Restricted Revenue is ahead of budget resulting from Social Ministry Beyond 2020 campaign and Giving for the Poor and Maintenance.
- 4) Other revenue is ahead of budget due to the great success of the Virtual Gala (\$70,000) partially offset by lower than budgeted wedding revenues.
- 5) Expenses are under budget due to the diligence of our team. All our salaried personnel have been reimbursed for their one-week furlough.
- 6) As communicated in our Finance update in March, the CARES Act loan has been fully forgiven. This is an unusual event and is not included in ordinary income.
