



Feast of St. Louis

Today, throughout the Archdiocese, we will commemorate the life and faithful disciple-ship of our patron, King Louis IX of France, who is also the patron of the City of St. Louis and of Saint Louis University. He was born in 1214 in Poissy, France.





He strove to embody the finest of Christianity in his time, seeking to be a just and upright sovereign, who sought to provide for those in need and promote values. His friend Joinville wrote that he allowed no profanity nor spoke ill of others. He forbade usury, protected vassals from cruel lords, and ordered restitution when innocent people were injured by warfare. He was known as a fair arbitrator for disputes among nobles and common people. He made himself available to people in need. He would go out and sit under a tree and anyone who had a matter that needed to be settled could present their situation to him directly.

Louis was renowned for his charity. The peace and blessings of the realm come to us through the poor he would say. Beggars were fed from his table, he ate their leavings, washed their feet, ministered to the wants of the lepers, and daily fed over one hundred poor. He founded many hospitals and houses: the House of the Felles-Dieu for reformed prostitutes; the Quinze-Vingt for 300 blind men (1254), hospitals at Pontoise, Vernon, Compiégne. He died on August 25, 1270 in Tunis, Algeria.

From the letters of St. Louis:

"In order to avoid discord, never contradict anyone except in case of sin or some danger to a neighbor; and when necessary to contradict others, do it with tact and not with temper."

"In prosperity, give thanks to God with humility and fear lest by pride you abuse God's benefits and so offend him."

"Be kindhearted to the poor, the unfortunate and afflicted. Give them as much help and consolation as you can. Thank God for all the benefits he has bestowed upon you, that you may be worthy to receive greater. Always side with the poor rather than the rich, until you are certain of the truth."

LIGHTWORKS - AN EXPERIENCE OF IGNATIAN PRAYER

LIGHTWORKS is a "light form of work," a series of limbering up exercises for the spirit. Physical exercises build muscle, increase stamina, and develop flexibility. So LIGHT-WORKS does for the spirit. These exercises of prayer and reflection build our relationship with God and help us become more aware of God's presence in our lives. It consists of weekly group sessions. Participants are given scripture passages or reflections from the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius to pray over each week. These invite us into conversation with God about our lives. Then during the weekly session, there is sharing about these passages and a presentation. There are 16 weekly sessions with eight before Thanksgiving and eight in the new year. Light-Works will be offered at St Louis U High on Oakland this fall on Monday evenings from 6:30 until 8:30, beginning on September 30. Flyers will be available soon at the doorways of the church. Season of Creation

September I was proclaimed as a World Day of Prayer for Creation for the Orthodox in 1989. It was embraced by the major Christian European Churches in 2001 and by Pope Francis for the Roman Catholic Church in 2015, when he extended the World Day of Prayer for Creation to the "Season of Creation".

The newly-proclaimed "Season of Creation" (although not an official liturgical season) offers us the chance to focus our attention on God the creator and to reflect on our human responsibility as creatures of Earth to serve and protect all of life. The timeframe precedes October 4, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, patron of ecology. This is a time for us to pray in gratitude to God for the gift of creation, to learn about *integral ecology*, and to take concrete actions to care for Earth.

We will observe the Season of Creation in the following ways:

- The Ignatian Solidarity Network has created an **Ecological Examen** as a tool for prayer, reflection and action on behalf of our beloved Earth. This will be available September 1.
- Each week in the bulletin and on an easel in the vestibule there will be a quote from Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato Si' On the Care of Our Common Home and a suggested action you might choose to take during that week.
- Our **Sunday mass music** will include hymns which reflect the sacredness of creation.
- A Pet Blessing will occur at 10:00 am on Saturday, Oct 5 in the dog park across the street.
- Our speaker for this season will be Dr. Peter Raven, PhD, world-reknowned botanist scientist and environ mentalist and one of the writers of *Laudato Si*. On Sunday, October 6 at noon he will deliver an address entitled "Protecting the Earth: An Environmental, Economic and Moral Challenge". Please mark your calendars!

Before Thursday at noon

Welcome to the new Stewardship/Financial Development section of the bulletin. Each month it will communicate information on how your generosity impacts the mission and ministries at College Church. It is helpful to know concretely the many ways you enable SFX to do all the wonderful things it does. God alone is aware of everything taking place here, but this can provide some sense of the breadth of activities.

This month we want to focus on the facilities of the parish. That is the church, parish center, ballroom, and offices in Jesuit Hall. This is the physical space where so much of our ministry and work takes place.

A Weekend in the Life of College Church – Ever wonder about all that goes on here? If so, here's a taste from a typical weekend this past spring: Saturday, March 9th - Sunday, March 10th.

That gives a sense of how much is going on here, and the incredible usage of our facilities. Hence, the need for constant upkeep, repairs and long-term projects.

Relationship with Saint Louis University Two years ago St. Francis Xavier parish and SLU began a new relationship in regards to our shared home, College Church. You may know the parish grew out of the original chapel when SLU was downtown. You may not know that the parish church has always been owned by the university. Since fiscal year 2017-18, the parish has paid rent on our use of the church and parish office buildings. SLU provides services (gas & electricity), improvements, and general upkeep. This relationship has proven beneficial to the parish. When the bathroom sink springs a leak in the middle of mass, SLU's facilities are right on campus. More importantly, SLU has made major investments in the infrastructure. Last year we switched over to LED lights in the church and added a new light board. This year SLU in putting a new HVAC system in for the church and parish office. This will cost roughly \$900,000. Our rent to the university is \$190,000. We are clearly getting an excellent return on our expenditure. Each spring Fr. Dan meets with SLU representatives to plan the next projects, and discuss the various needs of our facilities.

Did You Know? Many of our parish offices are across the street at Jesuit Hall. They moved in 2013 in order to accommodate dedicated space for our expanding Religious Education program. Each year we pay \$32,000 rent to Jesuit Hall for the use of office space on the 7th floor.

Jesuit Response to Victims of Sexual Abuse

In December, 2018 the Jesuits of the United States Central and Southern Province released the names of those Jesuits credibly accused of sexual abuse of minors and vulnerable adults. In response to the release of those names we encourage anyone who has felt victimized by a Jesuit, or who seeks to report abuse by a Jesuit to contact their local law enforcement agency.
