FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The story of Samuel, Eli and the voice of God is a wonderfully humorous metaphor for our spiritual lives. Samuel is young and inexperienced in the Lord's ways. He hears God's call but does not understand it. Eli is old and perhaps a bit jaded. His main concern seems to be a good night's sleep.



There is an almost slapstick back and forth as they try to figure what exactly is going on. Finally, the light bulb goes off in Eli's head. He recognizes God is calling Samuel, and instructs him in the right answer. Samuel is able to respond to the invitation of the Lord.

It is a charming scene that speaks to spiritual truths: the difficulty of comprehending God's call, the "sleepiness" that can cloud our judgment, and the need to seek the help of others to understand God's presence. A perfect prayer primer in a few short verses.

Most importantly, the story relates the dogged persistence of God. One gets the sense the Lord would have called Samuel a million times if that was what it took.We can ignore, miss, or mistake the invitation over and over again, yet the invitation remains.


