FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The film A Hidden Life tells the true story of Franz

Jagerstatter an Austrian farmer, husband and father. He was executed during WWII for not swearing allegiance to Adolf Hitler and serving in the German army. Franz acts according to his conscience as informed by his Catholic faith. He feels compelled to do so despite knowing what this means for his beloved wife and three children.

One of the aspects the film captures well is the fundamental mystery behind why Franz decides to resist to the point of death. Yes, he is a devout Catholic but the vast majority of German Catholics had no qualms supporting Nazism. Indeed, the movie depicts the historical fact that Franz's pastor and bishop both discouraged his stance. Franz is unwavering in his commitment to resist so great an evil despite the opposition of his fellow Catholics and villagers.

What remains unanswered is how Franz has the courage to do what is right when no one else does. He was not a moral theologian or some radical, prophetic figure. He is a simple person of faith who refuses to participate in what he knows to be wrong.

Perhaps the real question is why are Christians so often cowards? Why do we have such difficulty acting in the spirit of the Gospels? I wish I knew why this was true, in myself and the Church. I do know disciples like Franz exist to disturb our complacency. He and others confront us with the cost of faith.

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord – February 2

Next Sunday the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, the day when Mary and Joseph, 40 days after Jesus' birth, fulfilled the prescriptions of the Law by presenting their first born child to God in the temple. In a sense this is another Epiphany, as Jesus was revealed as the Messiah through the words of Simeon and Anna. The feast invites us to consider the mystery of God's appearances in our world in the little and the least, and to dedicate ourselves to nurturing and revealing that presence.

The feast is also known as Candlemas day, and the practice has been to bless and distribute candles. Candles kept in homes are an expression of our faith in Jesus, the Light of the World, and a reminder that we, too, are called to be light bearers to our world.



So, all are invited to bring candles from home next week to be blessed. Tapers will be provided to everyone else and then collected at the end of Mass.

It is a call for unity to stand in solidarity with and care for those who are excluded and marginalized. Right Not to Migrate

When talking with North Americans visiting his parish in Guatemala, Padre Mynor stresses that families don't move to

the U.S. for adventure. "Parents have an **obligation** to migrate to support their children." This seems obvious upon seeing the funeral store a short distance away that is half full of child-sized caskets. The Catholic approach to migration holds seemingly opposing values in tension. Nations have a right to control their territories. Persons also have the right to migrate to support their families if they can't do so in their country.



In our polarized national debate, we should emphasize a third principle: People have the right to find opportunities in their homeland. We support this principle here through our fair trade sales that gives farmers prices for their coffee and other products that alow them to thrive at home. We can also support it through legislative advocacy.

The U.S. helps people stay in their countries through international development aid implemented through NGOs like Catholic Relief Services. This aid funded programs that created youth jobs to counter violent gangs. It trained farmers to address climate change that causes so many to migrate. The aid did much more. It made a difference. In March 2019 President Trump halted all U.S. development aid to the Central American North-

ern Triangle and lifesaving programs have ceased. Fortunately, the U.S. House passed bipartisan legislation that prevents the administration from rescinding this aid and requires that it be spent for its allocated purpose. HR2615, The Northern Triangle Enhanced Engagement Act has moved to the Senate and awaits a sponsor. We can help prevent the need to migrate by contacting Senators Blunt and Hawley and asking them to sponsor this legislation.

Shared Prayer


