FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



My recent vacation afforded me a rare experience: I attended Sunday mass without presiding. My mom and I went to the chapel of Viterbo College a small Catholic school a few blocks from home. The church is used for campus ministry liturgies, but with a lot of “outsiders” as well.

The college is tiny compared to SLU but there was a nice turn-out of students, older folks, and young families. Viterbo was begun by Franciscan women religious and they remain a strong presence. The chapel is staffed by male Franciscans. I felt very ecumenical. The choir was about 15 strong, all young women from the school and they were fantastic. The chapel was originally a parish for the Bohemian Catholic community. The stained-glass windows retain the Czech names for the saints depicted. The liturgy was prayerful, welcoming and joyful.

That experience got me thinking on how we are Catholic. This has been a hard time in the Church. We are rightfully concerned with the leadership that has failed miserably. A full accounting is essential.

I also believe that we can focus too much on authority in the Church. Keep in mind the Pope and local bishop are only mentioned once in the entire liturgy. Our primary and most important experience of the faith community is Sunday after Sunday with one another, and in communion with parishes all over the world. “Grass-roots” Catholicism has always been the heart and soul of our faith. It still is.

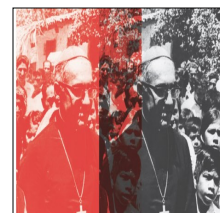

“Divine Images and Human Imaginations: On the Utility of Racialized Images of God”

Sunday, November 4th at 12:00 pm in the College Church Ballroom



Dr. Leonard McKinnis, Assistant Professor of Constructive Theology and African American Religions at Saint Louis University, will lead a conversation on the power of imagination and human agency in relation to racialized images of God. Dominant portraits of God in the Christian tradition overwhelmingly point to an image of a white Jesus as the symbol of God. Indeed, what might be called “Divine Whiteness.” That is, white images announce as much about “whiteness” as they do about God. Why does this matter? What’s at stake in images of a white God? How might images of a non-white Jesus challenge dominant narratives of whiteness as a normative category for truth, beauty, and justice. Dr. McKinnis, working within a Black theological context, will discuss the utility and liberative function of a Black messiah in the struggle for racial justice.

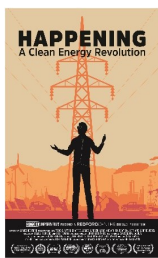

College Church Liturgy Commission

One of the important groups operating in the parish is the Liturgy Commission. It seeks to provide liturgical worship in keeping with the church's liturgical guidelines, with a special eye toward helping all parishioners achieve the "full, conscious and active participation" called for by Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy of Vatican II. The Commission has a four-fold purpose:

1. Assessing the needs of the worshipping community, and helping determine appropriate responses to those needs
2. Ensuring the recruitment, training and development of competent liturgical ministers (acolytes, cantors, lectors, ushers, Ministers of Holy Communion, cross bearers, musicians, Art & Environment members, and Linens Keepers)
3. Evaluating liturgical worship and ministers on a regular basis
4. Engaging in ongoing education of liturgical documents and resources

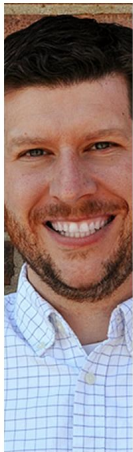
