FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



I want to share some good news regarding an important endeavor of College Church. We have begun a relationship with St. Peter Claver parish in Belize, Central America. There will be meetings after both Sunday masses on October 28th to provide details.

Let me share what this means to our parish community. First off, this is not entirely a new project. For a number of years we had a twinning arrangement with Santa Maria Chiquimula parish in Guatemala. That was beneficial partnership, but we found the remoteness and our few Spanish speakers made a relationship difficult.

The past two years we have looked to establish a relationship that would facilitate a deeper encounter. It made sense to come together with a parish in the same Jesuit province and in a country that speaks English. We are most happy to enter into this new agreement with St. Peter Claver.

What exactly this coming together of our parishes will look like remains to be seen. However, I believe any attempt to expand our universe is good. Like most institutions, College Church can get a little myopic. There is a great big church and world beyond the corner of Grand & Lindell that we want to engage. This relationship can provide a focus to learn more about the lives of our sisters and brothers in Christ in a very different place. Please stop by after mass next week to learn more!

**“Divine Images and Human Imaginations:
On the Utility of Racialized Images of God”**

Sunday, November 4th at 12:00 pm in the College Church Ballroom



Dr. Leonard McKinnis, Assistant Professor of Constructive Theology and African American Religions at Saint Louis University, will lead a conversation on the power of imagination and human agency in relation to racialized images of God. Dominant portraits of God in the Christian tradition overwhelmingly point to an image of a white Jesus as the symbol of God. Indeed, what might be called “Divine Whiteness.” That is, white images announce as much about “whiteness” as they do about God. Why does this matter? What’s at stake in images of a white God? How might images of a non-white Jesus challenge dominant narratives of whiteness as a normative category for truth, beauty, and justice. Dr. McKinnis, working within a Black theological context, will discuss the utility and liberative function of a Black messiah in the struggle for racial justice.

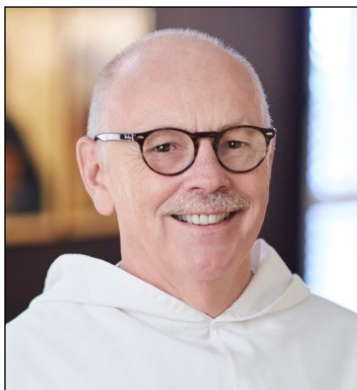

**Health Care, Eschatology and the Happy Death
Sunday November 18th**

Statistics tell us that the vast majority of us will know that we are dying... sometimes years in advance. While certain practical things – such as legal matters and advance directives – are important, what about the spiritual dimension of death? Is there a way to prepare for

death? What would a “happy death”, an idea deeply etched in Catholic spirituality and devotion to St. Joseph, look like in the midst of many high-tech treatment options? Is the Church helping us to die well? What will the next life be like? Can the happy death be an answer to assisted suicide and euthanasia?

Fr. Bouchard will describe some of the history of the happy death and lead a discussion about how to prepare for one today.

Judge's ruling makes it easier to vote; restricts Photo ID Law



On Tuesday, October 9th, Judge Richard Callahan blocked key aspects of Missouri's photo ID law for voting, essentially striking down the requirement that voters have a state-issued photo ID. He also stated in his decision that the state may not advertise that a photo ID is required to vote. This is a huge win, as it could make it easier and less confusing for Missourians to vote in November. Keep an eye on the news for updates on a potential appeal from the state of Missouri.

St. Francis Xavier's Outreach Program was cited in the judge's decision! Director of Social Ministry Christine Dragonette was a witness on behalf of St. Francis Xavier in the case. In his written decision, Judge Callahan was critical of the lack of free photo IDs for voting given out by the state.

"Of the 177 Department of Revenue license offices in Missouri, 83 have not issued any nondriver licenses for voting; 30 offices have only issued one, 17 offices only two, and 13 offices only three. The Downtown DOR license office in St. Louis stands out as the singular exception as it has issued 863 free nondriver licenses for voting, which accounts for 62% of the total number of free nondriver licenses issued statewide. The credit for the St. Louis office's numbers belongs to a local Social Ministry group that has been proactive in assisting voters to obtain the necessary documentation."



College Church Liturgy Commission

One of the important groups operating in the parish is the Liturgy Commission. It seeks to provide liturgical worship in keeping with the church's liturgical guidelines, with a special eye toward helping all parishioners achieve the "full, conscious and active participation" called for by Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy of Vatican II. The Commission has a four-fold purpose:

1. Assessing the needs of the worshipping community, and helping determine appropriate responses to those needs
2. Ensuring the recruitment, training and development of competent liturgical ministers (acolytes, cantors, lectors, ushers, Ministers of Holy Communion, crossbearers, musicians, Art & Environment members, and Linens Keepers)
3. Evaluating liturgical worship and ministers on a regular basis
4. Engaging in ongoing education of liturgical documents and resources
