FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This weekend the anointing of the sick will be offered at our liturgies. It is a sacrament rooted Christ's ministry towards the sick and suffering. The Evangelists depict again and again Jesus the



healer. Even his opponents acknowledged the power he exercised to cure all kinds of infirmities.

Physical ailment in first century Palestine was not simply a matter of being lame or blind. The human person was seen as one, spiritual and physical. Just as important, an individual was intimately embedded into a communal network of relations. Thus, when illness occurs it is a spiritual conflict as well as physical, and it has enormous repercussions for communal ties. Sickness, in whatever form, was a profound experience of separation.

Jesus' power is directed to the whole person, not just fixing the physical problem. Faith is essential to the encounter with Him. The Gospel's stories recount not only the person's restoration to health, but also to the wider community. The person is healed and made whole in every way. That is why the healing Christ brings is so connected to the inauguration of the kingdom of God. Healing is symbolic of God's definitive in-breaking into all creation through lesus Christ.

Dr. Leonard McKinnis, Assistant Professor of Constructive Theology and African American Religions at Saint Louis University, will lead a conversation on the power of imagination and human agency in relation to racialized images of God. Dominant portraits of God in the Christian tradition overwhelmingly point to an image of a white Jesus as the symbol of God. Indeed, what might be called "Divine Whiteness." That is, white images announce as much about "whiteness" as they do about God. Why does this matter? What's at stake in images of a white God? How might images of a non-white Jesus challenge dominant narratives of whiteness as a normative category for truth, beauty, and justice. Dr. McKinnis, working within a Black theological context, will discuss the utility and liberative function of a Black messiah in the struggle for racial justice.





Health Care, Eschatology and the Happy Death Sunday November 18th from 9:15 am to 10:15 am in the ballroom



Statistics tell us that the vast majority of us will know that we are dying... sometimes years in advance. While certain practical things – such as legal matters and advance directives – are important, what about the spiritual dimension of death? Is there a way to prepare for

death? What would a "happy death", an idea deeply etched in Catholic spirituality and devotion to St. Joseph, look like in the midst of many high-tech treatment options? Is the Church helping us to die well? What will the next life be like? Can the happy death be an answer to assisted suicide and euthanasia?

Fr. Bouchard will describe some of the history of the happy death and lead a discussion about how to prepare for one today.

SFX Outreach Program Advocacy Success! Judge's ruling makes it easier to vote; restricts Photo ID Law

On Tuesday, October 9th, Judge Richard Callahan blocked key aspects of Missouri's photo ID law for voting,



essentially striking down the requirement that voters have a state-issued photo ID. He also stated in his decision that the state may not advertise that a photo ID is required to vote. This is a huge win, as it could make it easier and less confusing for Missourians to vote in November. Keep an eye on the news for updates on a potential appeal from the state of Missouri. St. Francis Xavier's Outreach Program was cited in the judge's decision! Director of Social Ministry Christine Dragonette was a witness on behalf of St. Francis Xavier in the case. In his written decision, Judge Callahan was critical of the lack of free photo IDs

for voting given out by the state.

"Of the 177 Department of Revenue license offices in Missouri, 83 have not issued any nondriver licenses for voting; 30 offices have only issued one, 17 offices only two, and 13 offices only three. The Downtown DOR license office in St. Louis stands out as the singular exception as it has issued 863 free nondriver licenses for voting, which accounts for 62% of the total number of free nondriver licenses issued statewide. The credit for the St. Louis office's numbers belongs to a local Social Ministry group that has been proactive in assisting voters to obtain the necessary documentation."
