FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Right before departing on his final journey to China, St. Francis Xavier wrote a letter from India to his friend Simao Rodrigues in Portugal. Among other things, Francis mentions that while in Japan he had tried to persuade some Buddhist monks to sail back to Europe so the Jesuits there could meet them. Alas, they said no.

It is no stretch to say Francis was enchanted with the Japanese. He considered them a great people and open to Christianity. Even among the Buddhist clergy he was trying to convert, there was an attitude of respect. He writes in another letter about an elderly and distinguished monk he came to know well. "This man has become my great friend," Francis states.

Now, Francis Xavier was not what we would consider a model of multi-cultural sensitivity nor inter-religious dialogue. He was definitely a man of the 16th century, and was hardly free of prejudices. Francis, however, had the unique experience of encountering the Japanese on their terms. He lived among them eating their food, sleeping in their homes and relying on their hospitality. He came to know them up close and personal (at least as far as possible without speaking the language).

Francis wanted his friend to meet these Buddhist monks because he believed them to be worth knowing. His heart was open to this encounter with the other. Francis Xavier was no theoretician of cultural interactions but had a gift to see in someone very different God's presence. This spirit led not simply to respect but friendship.

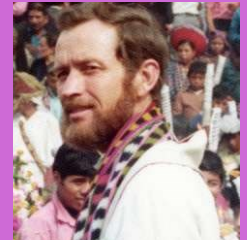

BLESSED STANLEY ROTHER

On Sept. 23, Fr. Stanley Rother, a priest and farmer from Okarche, Oklahoma, was beatified.

Parishioner Sandy Spencer knew Fr. Rother as she worked in a neighboring parish at the same time. On Oct 29 after the 8:00 Mass in the ballroom, she will share about Fr Rother and the historical context which led to his murder.

He was a priest of the Oklahoma City Archdiocese. He trusted God throughout his life even when things seemed impossible. He volunteered to serve in the diocesan mission in Guatemala where he became the pastor and only priest to 25,000 parishioners at St. James the Apostle parish. He dedicated himself to the people and won the trust of the community as he worked in the fields with them, built a clinic and repaired machinery. His name appeared on one of the death lists and he returned to Oklahoma in January of 1981 but found it unbearable to be away from the people. He said that a "shepherd cannot run." He returned to Guatemala and on July 28, 1981, when gunmen tried to kidnap him he was shot. The words of Pope Francis can truly be applied to him. He was a shepherd who smelled like his sheep.



ST. MARY'S HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

Five new scholarships for incoming freshmen have been established based on the five Characteristics of Marianist Education. Multiple scholarships will be awarded for the first four.

- **Embodied in Faith Scholarship:** Students actively involved in a youth group.
- **Empowered by Excellence Scholarship:** Students scoring 90% or above on standardized testing.
- **Family Spirit Scholarship:** Students sons or grandsons of alumni of St. Mary's High School.
- **Service Justice and Peace Scholarship:** Students actively involved in community service at a charitable or community organization outside of school.

Adaptation and Change Scholarship: For one young man who has gone through a traumatic or life-changing event within the last two years.

Four scholarships emphasizing STREAM have been added. One scholarship will be awarded for each.

- **STEM Scholarship:** Student who scores 90% or above in Math and Science Standardized testing.
- **St. Mary's Music Scholarship:** Student who plays a musical instrument and an active participant in either his school band or an outside music group.
- **St. Mary's Fine Arts Scholarship:** Student artistically talented and/or involved in theatre.

Boy Scout Scholarship: Student who is active in Boy Scouts.

These scholarships range from \$1,000 to \$3,000 and are renewable all four years under certain conditions. Families are welcome to apply for additional tuition assistance if needed.
