There remain still many, many people without adequate food, even in our own country. Keep in mind the farmers, harvesters, and laborers whose hard work and sweat enable us to enjoy our meals. It is also true many who help put food on our tables are the very undocumented migrants so cruelly demonized in this country.

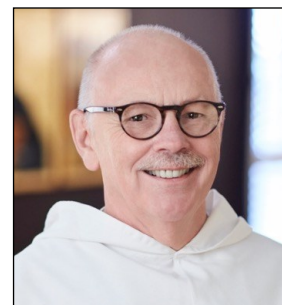

Health Care, Eschatology and the Happy Death

**Today...Sunday November 18th

Statistics tell us that the vast majority of us will know that we are dying...sometimes years in advance. While certain practical things – such as legal matters and advance directives – are important, what about the spiritual dimension of death? Is there a way to prepare for death? What would a “happy death”, an idea deeply etched in Catholic spirituality and devotion to St. Joseph, look like in the midst of many high-tech treatment options? Is the Church helping us to die well? What will the next life be like? Can the happy death be an answer to assisted suicide and euthanasia?

Fr. Bouchard will describe some of the history of the happy death and lead a discussion about how to prepare for one today.

November is Black Catholic History Month



In 1990 the National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus of the United States designated November as Black Catholic History Month to recognize the long history and proud heritage of black Catholics. We are provided an opportunity to reflect on the contributions of many black saints and leaders who served our church from its earliest days. This year, we invite you to consider the lives and contributions of African American Catholics who are currently under consideration for sainthood. Reflect on blessings they shared with their communities and the inspiration they offer to us today.

Mother Mary Elizabeth Lange

Mother Mary Lange, the Oblate Sisters of Providence founder, is on the road to sainthood. Letters of testimony supporting this mission continue to arrive at the Vatican. The Vatican requires a miracle to be approved for beatification and a second one to be named a saint. In 1992, Cardinal Keeler, Archbishop of Baltimore at the time, supported her path to Sainthood, with the approval of Rome, and officially opened a formal investigation into her life which might lead to her canonization as a saint. Elizabeth Clarisse Lange was born in 1784 in Haiti and fled the country when a revolution occurred. She came to Baltimore where many other Catholic, French-speaking Caribbean refugees had settled. She was well-educated, generous and deeply spiritual. Despite opposition, Mother Lange offered free education to children of slaves and former slaves in her home, who prior to the Emancipation Proclamation, were denied public education.



Later, due to her determination and faith, she was asked by Archbishop James Whitfield to establish a religious order of women for the education of Black children. With the help of the Church, Mother Lange founded the Baltimore-based Oblate Sisters of Providence in 1828 as the first woman's religious community for women of color. She helped establish the first Black Catholic school in the Catholic Church of America St. Frances Academy, and later, she took vows and took the name of Mary. Despite hardships, throughout the 19th century, the sisters of the Oblate taught children how to read the Bible and served the community. Mother Lange died February 3, 1882, but the Oblate sisters continue their work. They teach in schools, work in parishes, care for the sick and labor in other ministries in the United States, Cuba, Costa Rica, the Dominican Republic and parts of Africa.

Next Sunday the liturgical year comes to an end with the celebration of the Solemnity of Christ the King. Rather than being a king who desires triumphalism and slavish adoration, Jesus Christ is humble and loving and governs with justice and mercy. We honor him best by recognizing and serving him in our loving care and concern for our brothers and sisters, especially the poorest and most oppressed.

Liturgically, since this is a solemnity, we will use incense throughout the mass. Incense, through its smoke and fragrance, is a visible sign to us of our prayers arising before our God. Historically it was used to indicate and honor the presence of the Divine. We incense the altar and the gifts, the Gospel book, and the presider, all bearers of divinity. And we also incense the assembly, a powerful acknowledgement that each of us is a God-bearer, a temple of the Spirit.

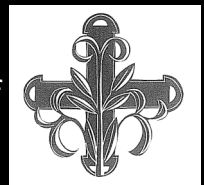
