

November is Black Catholic History Month

In 1990 the National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus of the United States designated November as Black Catholic History Month to recognize the long history and proud heritage of black Catholics. We are provided an opportunity to reflect on the contributions of many black saints and leaders who served our church from its earliest days. This year, we invite you to consider the lives and contributions of African American Catholics who are currently under consideration for sainthood. Reflect on blessings they shared with their communities and the inspiration they offer to us today.

Augustus Tolton

Born in Missouri on April I, 1854, John Augustine Tolton fled slavery with his mother and two siblings in 1862 by crossing the Mississippi River into Illinois. He attended St. Peter's Catholic School where he was baptized into the Catholic faith. After graduating from high school and Quincy College, he began his ecclesiastical studies in Rome, because no American seminary would accept him because of his race.



Fr. Tolton returned to served both black and white parishioners in Quincy be-

fore being transferred to Chicago to start a parish for black Catholics. Housed in a modest storefront church, Fr. Tolton ministered tirelessly to his parishioners for their physical, as well as spiritual needs. At the same time, he worked to gain the resources to build a church, soliciting the assistance of St. Katherine Drexel and others. Working to exhaustion, Fr. Tolton died in 1897.

His cause for canonization was officially launched in 2010, and he was given the title "Servant of God" by the Vatican in February 2011. The next step in his cause for canonization will be in February 2019, when a theological commission with the Congregation for the Causes of Saints will further investigate his life and virtue and consider granting him the title of "Venerable," which must receive papal approval.

O God, we give you thanks for your servant and priest, Father Augustus Tolton, who labored among us in times of contradiction, times that were both beautiful and paradoxical. His ministry helped lay the foundation for a truly Catholic gathering in faith in our time. We stand in the shadow of his ministry. May his life continue to inspire us and imbue us with that confidence and hope that will forge a new evangelization for the Church we love.

If it be your Will, O God, glorify your servant, Father Tolton, by granting the favor I now request through his intercession *(mention your request)* so that all may know the goodness of this priest whose memory looms large in the Church he loved.

Christ the King

This Sunday the liturgical year comes to an end with the celebration of the Solemnity of Christ the King. Rather than being a king who desires triumphalism and slavish adoration, Jesus Christ is humble and loving and governs with justice and mercy.

We honor him best by recognizing and serving him in our loving care and concern for our brothers and sisters, especially the poorest and most oppressed.

Liturgically, since this is a solemnity, we will use incense throughout the mass. Incense, through its smoke and fragrance, is a visible sign to us of our prayers arising before our God. Historically it was used to indicate and honor the presence of the Divine.

We incense the altar and the gifts, the Gospel book, and the presider, all bearers of divinity. And we also incense the assembly, a powerful acknowledgement that each of us is a God-bearer, a temple of the Spirit.

The Season of Advent

The first season of the new liturgical year, Advent, begins next week. Its color is a bluepurple, like the color of the sky just before the sunlight breaks through in the morning, and is also reminiscent of royalty. During Advent our Scriptures are filled with the longing of God's people for the promised Messiah, including lush descriptions of what that blessed time will be like, and admonitions for us to prepare our hearts for his coming. Our Advent wreathe visually increases our excitement for the feast of Christmas as an additional candle is lighted each week.

On a spiritual level, each of us is invited to reflect on the ways in which we recognize the presence of Emmanuel, God with us, each and every day, and the extent to which our lives do or do not make his presence known. One way we can prepare our hearts to celebrate the feast of the Incarnation is through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, a beautiful sign of God's mercy and forgiveness for us all.
