**FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**



Tuesday is Election Day. This is an important day for us as citizens and people of faith. It is a great responsibility to exercise this crucial duty of our society with care. Perhaps the only thing all Americans can agree on is the need for an informed citizenry to choose wisely our elected officials.

I feel it important to call attention to a neglected aspect of our national discernment voters. The U.S. Bishops' guide on Faithful Citizenship states, "those who are in greater need deserve preferential concern. A moral test for society is how we treat the weakest among us." One is hardly going out on a limb to say we as a society have failed miserably that particular moral test. Fear, incivility, and demonization seem to take up the vast amount of our energy. The least among us are ignored.

It is a good to remember our call to serve the weakest both inside and outside of the voting booth. Our society needs legal and political policies aimed at alleviating the struggles of those most in need. It also needs us working at College Church outreach, St. Patrick's Center, the Red Cross, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, etc.

Catholic social teaching recognizes the complexity of the 21<sup>st</sup> century. We are to engage in all aspects of our society because we are all in this together. This is especially important to remember when so many are saying otherwise.

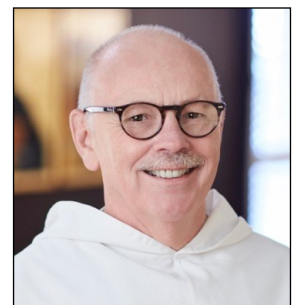
**Health Care, Eschatology  
and the Happy Death**

**Sunday November 18<sup>th</sup>**

**from 9:15 am to 10:15 am in the ballroom**

Statistics tell us that the vast majority of us will know that we are dying...sometimes years in advance. While certain practical things – such as legal matters and advance directives – are important, what about the spiritual dimension of death? Is there a way to prepare for death? What would a "happy death", an idea deeply etched in Catholic spirituality and devotion to St. Joseph, look like in the midst of many high-tech treatment options? Is the Church helping us to die well? What will the next life be like? Can the happy death be an answer to assisted suicide and euthanasia?

Fr. Bouchard will describe some of the history of the happy death and lead a discussion about how to prepare for one today.

## November is Black Catholic History Month



In 1990 the National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus of the United States designated November as Black Catholic History Month to recognize the long history and proud heritage of black Catholics. We are provided an opportunity to reflect on the contributions of many black saints and leaders who served our church from its earliest days. This year, we invite you to consider the lives and contributions of African American Catholics who are currently under consideration for sainthood. Reflect on blessings they shared with their communities and the inspiration they offer to us today.

### **Julia Greeley**

Julia Greeley was born in Hannibal, Missouri sometime between 1835 and 1855. She suffered from blindness in one eye due to a beating she received. Julia could not read nor write, but upon emancipation from slavery in 1865, she was employed as a housekeeper, nanny, and/or cook for families in Denver, St. Louis, and Laramie. She loved children and spent many years in service of the Gilpin family in Denver. Julia was baptized a Catholic in 1880, and spent her life afterward begging for the poor, attending daily Mass and caring for others. She was especially remembered wearing a black floppy hat, and pulling a red wagon to deliver food, clothing, and other goods to those in need at night, so as not to embarrass them during the daylight hours where others would see a black woman providing the charity.



Julia was also well known for distributing Sacred Heart League leaflets to firehouses where she would offer encouragements and prayers for the firemen, prompting the Jesuit fathers at the Sacred Heart Parish to call her the most zealous apostle of the Sacred Heart they had ever known. Her charity to the poor was known by all, and her love of children was known to the convents, especially the Sisters at the Sacred Heart Rectory who sent her referrals of those who needed help. In 1818, at the age of approximately 76-80, she died in St. Joseph Hospital. Her funeral was attended by more than one thousand people, from all walks of life, who knew her from her charitable works. Many people asked that her cause be considered for canonization, a request granted in 2016. As part of the cause for canonization, her remains were exhumed and placed in Denver's Cathedral Basilica of the Immaculate Conception on June 7, 2017 where the faithful may bring prayers for her intercession there.

A prayer approved on June 29, 2017 by Archbishop Samuel Aquila  
 Heavenly Father, your servant Julia Greeley dedicated her life to honoring the Sacred Heart of Your Son and to the humble service of the poor. Grant to me a generous heart like Your Son's, and if it be in accordance with your holy will, please grant this favor I now ask through Julia's intercession (*add your intention*)....I pray this through Christ our Lord. Amen

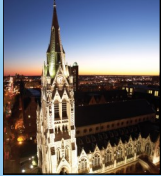

### “Divine Images and Human Imaginations: On the Utility of Racialized Images of God”

Sunday, November 4th at 12:00 pm in the College Church Ballroom



Dr. Leonard McKinnis, Assistant Professor of Constructive Theology and African American Religions at Saint Louis University, will lead a conversation on the power of imagination and human agency in relation to racialized images of God. Dominant portraits of God in the Christian tradition overwhelmingly point to an image of a white Jesus as the symbol of God. Indeed, what might be called “Divine Whiteness.” That is, white images announce as much about “whiteness” as they do about God. Why does this matter? What’s at stake in images of a white God? How might images of a non-white Jesus challenge dominant narratives of whiteness as a normative category for truth, beauty, and justice. Dr. McKinnis, working within a Black theological context, will discuss the utility and liberative function of a Black messiah in the struggle for racial justice.
