# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The painting on the cover of the bulletin is Caravaggio's

John the Baptist in the Wilderness. It hangs in the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art in Kansas City. If you need a reason to visit K.C. besides the barbeque, this is it.

The artist depicts John as a teenager alone in the wild. There is little to indicate who he is besides a reed staff. The Baptist is caught in a moment of deep introspection. There is a brooding quality, or even melancholy, that permeates the painting. This is not the wild-eyed prophet with the strange clothes and even stranger diet so familiar to us. This is different.

I think this is the John we encounter in today's Gospel. The selection is from chapter II of St. Matthew. The scene takes place well into the public ministry Jesus after John has been imprisoned. He asks Jesus a simple question, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we wait for another?"

Israel had been plagued for so long by fake messiahs and false prophets. John by his words and as Caravaggio paints him is wondering if Jesus is more of the same. I see in the painting a person struggling with doubt, and yearning to not be disappointed.

Jesus does not answer John's question but simply reports what is taking place. He encourages John by pointing to the work of the Kingdom. This is the Good News that is being enacted. Not a king or judge but rather the Messiah of God's compassion, mercy and justice

### **Candlelight Procession**

All children are invited to create a paper candle to carry in the opening procession for the liturgy. Paper towels work well as the basis of the candle. All children and parents who want to process should gather at the Baptismal Font at 4:25. They will process in before the celebrant and stand at the foot of the altar. Once the celebrant is on the altar they will return to their pews. No rehearsal is necessary, but children must bring their own paper candles.

#### Christmas Tableau

Our children will participate in a dramatization of the Gospel. During the reading of the Gospel the children will come to the altar and present a moving depiction of the beautiful words of St. Luke.




# Coming Soon! JustFaith Module: Faith and Racial Equality

Faith and Racial Equality: Exploring Power and Privilege is an 8-wk module that awakens groups to the economic systems, public policies, cultural norms and hidden bases that empower some and oppress others. The second segment explores issues of power and privilege, including affirmative action, the school-to-prison pipeline, and the criminal justice system.
