#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The rose vestments are the clear sign of Gaudete Sunday. The third Sunday of the Advent season calls us to rejoice in the coming of the Lord.



Christian joy is a difficult notion to convey. It is not a feeling, mood, or emotion. It does not pretend everything is wonderful. Yet the prophet Zephaniah tells us, "Fear not, O Zion, Do not be discouraged." How is this possible given our world, our Church and our own selves?

Alfred Delp was a German Jesuit imprisoned by the Nazis. Before his execution, he wrote in Advent of 1944: We may ask why God has sent us into this time, why he has sent this whirlwind over the Earth, why he keeps us in this chaos where all appears hopeless and dark and why there seems to be no end to this in sight. The answer to this question is perhaps that we were living on Earth in an utterly false and counterfeit security. And now God strikes the Earth till it resounds, now he shakes and shatters. Here is the message of Advent: faced with him who is the Last, the world will begin to shake.

Delp lived and died amidst the greatest horrors of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. His joy was founded on the belief that God was shaking us out of our lethargy, and waking us up to a new reality. Joy comes from God's rousing us from our slumbers, and freeing us from fear.

### Social Ministry Annual Christmas Appeal Continues This Weekend: 12/15-16

Last weekend at Mass, you heard about the work of College Church Social Ministry and an opportunity to financially support our programming through the Annual Christmas Appeal. The Christmas Appeal continues this weekend, and proceeds from this year's appeal will go directly to our Outreach Program, which is the only program in the region providing ongoing and large-scale assistance with State ID cards and birth certificates.



This year, we have a special announcement and request for support. We are pleased to announce that the Outreach Program has The Brown Sisters received a challenge grant from the Brown Sisters Foundation to



move from our current paper record system to electronic records over the next year. This will be an important move for our program in order to improve our data reporting and security, make best use of our volunteers' time, and be able to access data more readily. As we move toward a long term goal of expanding outside of our twice-weekly walk-in hours, computerizing our data will be a crucial step.

The Brown Sisters gift is a challenge grant, meaning that your new or increased donation to our Christmas Appeal this year will have an even greater impact. If we can raise \$15,000 in new and increased donations from supporters in the next year, the Brown Sisters Foundation will provide an additional \$9,000 toward computerizing our data and expanding our program.

The second collections last and this weekend will go directly to Social Ministry Christmas Appeal. If you prefer, you can also send a check to the parish center made out to "St. Francis Xavier" with "Social Ministry Christmas Appeal" in the memo. #### Xavier Winter Inn—Volunteers Needed!

Every winter, College Church hosts a Winter Inn, offering emergency shelter to homeless men on Wednesday and Thursday nights from Dec.-Feb. The Winter Inn is run entirely by volunteers and provides hospitality on nights when temperatures drop below 20 degrees.

If you are a new volunteer who missed the training dates, it's not too late! Volunteer positions include Setup, Greeters/ Hosts, Innkeepers, Cleaners, Dinner Cooks and Laundry Drivers. We have a particular need for innkeepers to stay overnight on nights our shelter is open. Innkeepers are typically men over the age of 20 or women with social work experience. # Spotlight on Social Ministry

**First a bit of history...** College Church's Social Ministry began in 1975 with a goal of expanding the parish's reach to serve members of our community experiencing poverty, homelessness, and contact with the legal system. Our cornerstone program, the Documentation Assistance (Outreach) Program, began in 1993 to assist with Missouri State ID cards and birth certificates for people with low incomes. The Outreach Program began because assistance with IDs and birth certificates was a largely unmet community need. Today our Outreach Program provides the only consistent, large scale identification assistance in the region.

#### Some facts...

- •The Outreach Program provides twice-weekly assistance with Missouri State ID cards and birth certificates from any state to people experiencing poverty and homelessness, with a special focus on people who were previously incarcerated. In FY 2017-18, our program served 3,462 clients, assisting with 2,249 Missouri State ID cards and 2,560 birth certificates.
- •Xavier Winter Inn is part of a network of emergency winter shelters in St. Louis, providing shelter, food, and fellowship to 14 men a night on Wednesdays and Thursdays when the weather is projected to be dangerously cold. This past winter we served 112 homeless men over the course of 8 nights.
- •Other direct assistance programs we provide include: St. Vincent DePaul Society, Casseroles to the St. Patrick Center, Sandwiches for Karen House.
- •Social Ministry includes an anti-racism committee, environmental justice committee, and fair trade committee, membership in Metropolitan Congregations United.

**Somethings we are very proud of!** Director of Social Ministry Christine Dragonette was a witness on behalf of St. Francis Xavier in the case against Missouri's photo ID law for voting. Not only did the judge in that case essentially block the photo ID law in order to make it easier and less confusing for Missourian's to vote, he also specifically sited the impressive work of our Outreach Program.

"Of the 177 Department of Revenue license offices in Missouri, 83 have not issued any nondriver licenses for voting; 30 offices have only issued one, 17 offices only two, and 13 offices only three. The Downtown DOR license office in St. Louis stands out as the singular exception as it has issued 863 free nondriver licenses for voting, which accounts for 62% of the total number of free nondriver licenses issued statewide. The credit for the St. Louis office's numbers belongs to a local Social Ministry group that has been proactive in assisting voters to obtain the necessary documentation."

Thanks to the parish's financial support of social ministry and an outstanding team of parishioners who volunteer to write grants with Christine, our Outreach Program is actually expanding! In 2019 we will digitize our processes in order to make providing services more efficient. That will also allow us to consider expanding to new locations to provide this incredibly important service to even more people.

### Impressive Staff and Amazing Volunteers!

**Emily Edwards** coordinates our Outreach Program and Winter Inn. She is an MSW student that we are able to have on staff part-time for 2 years thanks to a partnership with the School of Social Work.

Christine Dragonette is the Director of Social Ministry who started as the coordinator of the Outreach Program in 2013 and then transitioned to director when she graduated from SLU's MSW program in 2015. We are incredibly lucky to have this talented, dedicated staff team. And of course social ministry would not function without the passionate commitment of 37 parishioners who work with Outreach guests on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, 87 volunteers who help with Winter Inn, 11 parishioners on the Social Ministry Commission and many others who run our other services and committees.
