FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Christmas story is nothing if not resilient. Despite our best efforts to drown it in a sea of sentimentality, the story retains its hold upon us. It engages our imagination at the deepest level. The scripture, prayer, song and ritual of these days draws us in to encounter God .



Like all vibrant, living traditions the story of Christmas is elastic and inclusive. Though the basic outline comes from Luke's Gospel, we also borrow heavily from Matthew (The Magi and Flight into Egypt) as well as John's images of light and darkness. As the centuries have rolled on popular Christmas customs like the tree, the crèche and beloved carols have entered our consciousness. Perhaps more than any other season of the liturgical year Christmas is wonderfully participatory. It is our best reminder that custom, prayer, feasting, and worship act as an integrated whole in the life of the Christian community.

The Christmas story is beautiful and holy, but it is not cute. Perhaps the profound resonance it elicits comes from the awareness that the long-awaited Messiah comes to us in the most vulnerable way possible. The Nativity, rightly understood, shocks us to the core. It is a shock, however, rooted in joy. It is the wonder and awe that comes over us when we begin to comprehend the presence of Emmanuel, God with us.



Spotlight on Social Ministry

First a bit of history... College Church's Social Ministry began in 1975 with a goal of expanding the parish's reach to serve members of our community experiencing poverty, homelessness, and contact with the legal system. Our cornerstone program, the Documentation Assistance (Outreach) Program, began in 1993 to assist with Missouri State ID cards and birth certificates for people with low incomes. The Outreach Program began because assistance with IDs and birth certificates was a largely unmet community need. Today our Outreach Program provides the only consistent, large scale identification assistance in the region.

Some facts...

- The Outreach Program provides twice-weekly assistance with Missouri State ID cards and birth certificates from any state to people experiencing poverty and homelessness, with a special focus on people who were previously incarcerated. In FY 2017-18, our program served 3,462 clients, assisting with 2,249 Missouri State ID cards and 2,560 birth certificates.
- Xavier Winter Inn is part of a network of emergency winter shelters in St. Louis, providing shelter, food, and fellowship to 14 men a night on Wednesdays and Thursdays when the weather is projected to be dangerously cold. This past winter we served 112 homeless men over the course of 8 nights.
- Other direct assistance programs we provide include: St. Vincent DePaul Society, Casseroles to the St. Patrick Center, Sandwiches for Karen House.
- Social Ministry includes an anti-racism committee, environmental justice committee, and fair trade committee, membership in Metropolitan Congregations United.

Somethings we are very proud of! Director of Social Ministry Christine Dragonette was a witness on behalf of St. Francis Xavier in the case against Missouri's photo ID law for voting. Not only did the judge in that case essentially block the photo ID law in order to make it easier and less confusing for Missourian's to vote, he also specifically sited the impressive work of our Outreach Program.

"Of the 177 Department of Revenue license offices in Missouri, 83 have not issued any nondriver licenses for voting; 30 offices have only issued one, 17 offices only two, and 13 offices only three. The Downtown DOR license office in St. Louis stands out as the singular exception as it has issued 863 free nondriver licenses for voting, which accounts for 62% of the total number of free nondriver licenses issued statewide. The credit for the St. Louis office's numbers belongs to a local Social Ministry group that has been proactive in assisting voters to obtain the necessary documentation."

Thanks to the parish's financial support of social ministry and an outstanding team of parishioners who volunteer to write grants with Christine, our Outreach Program is actually expanding! In 2019 we will digitize our processes in order to make providing services more efficient. That will also allow us to consider expanding to new locations to provide this incredibly important service to even more people.

Impressive Staff and Amazing Volunteers!

Emily Edwards coordinates our Outreach Program and Winter Inn. She is an MSW student that we are able to have on staff part-time for 2 years thanks to a partnership with the School of Social Work.

Christine Dragonette is the Director of Social Ministry who started as the coordinator of the Outreach Program in 2013 and then transitioned to director when she graduated from SLU's MSW program in 2015.

We are incredibly lucky to have this talented, dedicated staff and team. And, of course, social ministry would not function without the passionate commitment of 37 parishioners who work with Outreach guests on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, 87 volunteers who help with Winter Inn, 11 parishioners on the Social Ministry Commission and many others who run our other services and committees.
