FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Nativity story is beautiful and holy, but it is far from cute. Mary and Joseph are forced to travel because the Emperor wants a census.



There is no room available so they are forced to lodge with the livestock. The

first visitors to the new baby are a raggedy band of shepherds, hardly the cream of society. Next come some odd foreigners bearing gifts. Finally, the family is forced to flee the country due to the violent acts of the king, and become refugees in a foreign land.

Despite our best attempts to suffocate Christmas in schmaltz and sentimentality, the hard truth remains: salvation is revealed in the midst of suffering. Struggle and pain lie at the heart of Christ's birth. God comes among us poor and vulnerable. The light shines in the darkness. Peace on earth confronts division and violence.

Christmas brings comfort, joy and hope. But this great feast acknowledges our failing, too. The Word made flesh dwells among us in the midst of our brokenness. This appreciation allows us to cut through the cultural nonsense that has built up around Christmas. Our faith in the Incarnation is what we celebrate. That is the Truth that sets us free. Free to welcome with happiness and awe the child born to Mary.









OPENINGS ON THE SFX PASTORAL COUNCIL:

he St. Francis Xavier (College) Church Pastoral Council is a group composed of the pastor and twelve active, adult parishioners who meet regularly to deliberate, reflect, and make decisions on a variety of issues related to the operations, programming, and spiritual life of the parish. The Pastoral Council provides support and direction to the various parish Commissions and Committees, and is generally charged with making sure that all activities support the parish's Mission. There will be at least two openings on the Pastoral Council starting in January 2018. Council members serve for a three-year term with the option to serve a second term. The group meets one Saturday morning per month, and also participates actively in various special events throughout the year. A parishioner may nominate another parishioner, or nominate himself/herself.

Nominees will be asked to submit a short statement explaining their interest in serving on the Council answering the following three questions: (I) What has drawn you to SFX College Church, and what are your hopes for the future of the parish? (2) What background and experience, either professional, personal, or as a parishioner, would you bring to the Council and how would you apply it? (3) Can you commit to regular attendance and participation at Council meetings and, from time to time, assisting with special projects or events?
