### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Edward Hicks was an early American folk artist.

Born in colonial Pennsylvania, he became a devout Quaker. He was drawn to both painting and ministry. However, Hicks realized quickly his work painting coaches, household items, and even tavern signs paid far better than preaching. He dedicated his life to creating decorative art and pastoral scenes for people.

There was one theme that Hicks returned to over and over in his work. It the scene described in today's first reading Isaiah 10:1-11. The description of the change fascinated Hicks. He painted versions of what he called The Peaceable Kingdom over 60 times. It was for him the inspiration of both his artistic and spiritual life.

You might say Hicks was obsessed with Isaiah's vision. If so, that is a pretty worthwhile obsession. The prophet pictures a world turned upside down where enemies in the animal kingdom are at peace and justice is the norm. We are intended to imagine how God's action changes everything.

Advent asks us to consider the limits of what we believe is possible. Do we really think that the power of God can radically change us and our world? Edward Hicks did, and he spent his life painting that belief. Wolves and lambs can co-exist, and babies can play near poisonous snakes. As the angel Gabriel will tell Mary of Nazareth, "Nothing will be impossible for God."

## Lenten Gathering Rite

Lent is a season of preparation for the great feast of Easter, in which we are invited to pause and ponder the quality of our relationship with God and others...to celebrate the good we find there and to seek forgiveness and reconciliation for what is lacking. The traditional Lenten disciplines – prayer, fasting and almsgiving – provide us the contours and practices for the conversion we seek.

During this penitential season the Gathering Rite we sing gently implores, "Gather us in mercy, Lord. From the depths we cry to you." The presider will invite the assembly to either kneel or bow our heads during the penitential rite. Either posture is a way of helping us bodily recognize and acknowledge our need for God's mercy. Doing this together further underlines the communal nature of our Lenten journey of conversion and of our need for one another. Our bodies, our voices, our hearts unite in humility and trust as we enter into the great prayer of the mass.

## Coming Soon! JustFaith Module: Faith and Racial Equality

Faith and Racial Equality: Exploring Power and Privilege is an 8-wk module that awakens groups to the economic systems, public policies, cultural norms and hidden bases that empower some and oppress others. The first half uses a framework for understanding and recognizing racial disparities in power and privilege. The second segment explores issues of power and privilege, including affirmative action, the school-to-prison pipeline, and the criminal justice system.

College Church will offer this program on **Tuesday evenings from 6:30-9:00 pm beginning January 14.** It involves readings, videos, prayer, group discussion, one Saturday retreat and an immersion experience. The cost is \$50.

The season of Advent started last Sunday. It is a time of reflection and preparation for our celebration of God With Us. There are a number of books and booklets (most are \$2.00) to assist you or to send to family and friends including:



**Jesus:** The Savior Among Us offers a reflection from Pope Francis, a prayer and a scripture passage for each day.

Follow The Star presents reflections from various authors each day along with a scripture passage for seniors

**God Bless Us, Everyone** offers reflections based on themes from the Christmas Carol by Charles Dickens. **Advent With The Saints** introduces the reader to a saint each day and presents a short writing by or talk that the saint gave.

Other booklets have reflections from Henri Nouwen or Pope Francis and Henri Nouwen together. There are materials for children and teens as well

Larger books offer reflections on **Abundance** by Walter Brueggemann.; **Advent and Christmas Wisdom** From Pope Francis or from Henri Nouwen; or **Sacred Space for Advent and Christmas** which offers a way to pray with the mass scriptures each day.

There are a variety of **Advent Calendars** and **Cards** for young people along with sticker books and other materials to help them connect with Jesus during this season.


