FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This time of year lends itself to all manner of traditions. How could it be December without non-stop showings of The Grinch, Miracle on 34th Street, A Charlie Brown Christmas, and It's a Wonderful Life? Old family traditions concerning everything from the correct foods to eat to the proper and fitting way to decorate a Christmas tree are followed scrupulously.

It is odd because we Americans have little affinity for the past the other eleven months of the year. However, at Christmas time we become deeply conservative curators of tradition and family customs. It is understandable, perhaps, given the constant flux of contemporary life. We cling tightly to holiday's past so to cope with the transience that marks our culture.

The Advent scriptures speak of just the opposite. Over and over we encounter upheaval, change, and newness. The very earth is being re-created according to Baruch. Mountains are leveled and valleys filled; the dispersed return home in glory. The power of God is revealed in light and justice. Advent reveals the inauguration of a radical re-forming of the world.

There is much that is comforting in decorating our homes for Christmas the way we always have. Our faith, however, should liberate, not bind us. We smother the radical message of the prophets, John the Baptist, and Mary the God-Bearer at our own risk. Change is at the heart of this season. These long, cold weeks of December reveal the presence of Emmanuel, God with us. Everything is about to be different.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

A communal celebration of the sacrament will be held on Thursday, December 13 at 7:00 pm. A communal service is a wonderful way to remind ourselves that our sin affects all of us in the Body of Christ, and that we need one another to live as better disciples of Christ. We sing, hear the Scriptures, reflect on God's call to conversion, and express our sorrow and our desire to be better; then several confessors will be available for individual confessions.

Fr. Tom Cwik, SJ, our associate pastor, continues his recovery at the infirmary across the street at Jesuit Hall. He has begun rehab after his cardiac arrest in late October. His progress has gone very well. Fr. Tom is most grateful for the prayers you have sent his way. Keep them coming.



Social Ministry Annual Christmas Appeal This Weekend **December 8-9, 15-16**

Today at Mass, you will hear about the work of College Church Social Ministry and an opportunity to financially support our programming through the Annual Christmas Appeal. The proceeds from this year's Christmas Appeal will go directly to our Outreach Program, which is the only program in the region providing ongoing and large-scale assistance with State ID cards and birth certificates.



This year, we have a special announcement and request for support. We are pleased to announce that the Outreach Program has received a challenge grant from the Brown Sisters Foundation to move from our current paper record system to electronic records over the next year. This will be an important move for our program in order to improve our data reporting and security, make best use of our volunteers' time, and be able to access data more readily. As we move toward a long term goal of expanding outside of our twiceweekly walk-in hours, computerizing our data will be a crucial step.

The Brown Sisters gift is a challenge grant, meaning that your The Brown Sisters new or increased donation to our Christmas Appeal this year will have an even greater impact. If we can raise \$15,000 in



new and increased donations from supporters in the next year, the Brown Sisters Foundation will provide an additional \$9,000 toward computerizing our data and expanding our program.

The second collections on 12/8-12/9 and 12/15-12/16 will go directly to Social Ministry Christmas Appeal. Xavier Winter Inn—Volunteers Needed!

If you are a new volunteer who missed the training dates, it's not too late! Volunteer positions include Setup, Greeters/ Hosts, Innkeepers, Cleaners, Dinner Cooks and Laundry Drivers. We have a particular need for innkeepers to stay overnight on nights our shelter is open. Innkeepers are typically men over the age of 20 or women with social work experience. 
