#### **LENTEN DIRECTIVES**

Jesus said, "Whoever wishes to be my follower must deny his very self, take up his cross each day and follow in my steps." (Lk 9:23)

The Church consistently helps us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing penitential practices for all Catholics. The American Bishops have called us to fast and abstinence during Lent.

Fasting is a sign of our complete dependence upon God. God is the source of our life; fasting helps us show our reliance upon God rather than food and ourselves. Ash Wednesday (Feb. 14) and Good Friday (March 30) are days of fasting for those ages 18-59. Fasting means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). Our common fasting manifests our collective commitment to place God first in our lives.

Abstinence from meat invites us to join the poor of the world in eating simply. As Jesus emptied himself and shared in the poverty of the human condition, we are asked to embrace the poverty of those who have only subsistence diets. Ash Wednesday and all Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat. All who are 14 years of age and older, unless there is a serious health problem, asked to share in this discipline.

In addition to these shared practices, everyone is encouraged to find ways during Lent to draw closer to God through prayer and spiritual practices. Consider being part of one of our Lenten book discussion groups, and embracing the daily practice of praying the Examen as ways to deepen your relationship with God and with others in Christ's Body.



# BICENTENNIAL LECTURE SERIES OPENS FEBRUARY 26

With Jesuit Thibodeaux Speaking on Discernment

The Saint Louis University Bicentennial Lecture Series, "The Jesuit Influence in American Spirituality, Education and Society," will open the 2018 bicentennial year with a presentation by Mark Thibodeaux, SJ. "Discerning Our Role in Creating a Society of Justice and Love" will be held Monday, Feb. 26, 7-8:30 pm at St. Francis Xavier College Church, Grand and Lindell boulevards.

Thibodeaux is novice director for the Central Southern Province of the Society of Jesus in Grand Couteau, La. He has served on the board of directors for Company magazine, a national Jesuit

magazine. A former high school teacher, counselor, retreat director and spiritual director, he has drawn from his wealth of experience and is author of four books on prayer, including Armchair Mystic: Easing into Contemplative Prayer, and God's Voice Within, The Ignatian Way to Discover God's Will. The native Louisianan holds degrees in psychology and theology from Loyola University New Orleans and Weston Jesuit School of Theology in Cambridge, Massachusetts.

The series lectures are held on Mondays, 7-8:30 pm in College Church. Other lectures in the series are: April 16, Lessons from Pope Francis on American Politics and Civic Life, with Matt Malone, SJ, editor-in-Chief of America Magazine; September 24, Reimagining Health Care: Ignatian Insights for Achieving the Greater Good with Michael Rozier, SJ, a researcher and practitioner of health policy and public health ethics; and November 5: Jesuit Education: Do We Need a New Paradigm?, with Michael Garanzini, SJ, Secretary of Higher Education, Society of Jesus in Rome, and Visiting Professor of Research in the Graduate School of Education at Fordham University.

# NOTICE: UPCOMING SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION PERIOD Elementary & High School Scholarships 2018-19 School Year

2018-19 Scholarship Application available on January 29th, 2018!

Alive! In Christ is first-come, first-served for all new awards and younger siblings that may be eligible, so we encourage you to apply as early as possible.

Approximately 500 new awards will be available.

The application deadline for Beyond Sunday, SOAR!, Catholic Families Tuition Assistance (CFTA), and the Parish Employees Endowment Fund (PEEF) is February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2018. Any family who would like to be considered for these programs, even if you are applying for requalification, must apply between January 29<sup>th</sup> and February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2018.

Up to 60 new elementary school awards and 35 new high school awards will be available in Beyond Sunday.

Siblings attending the same school are not eligible in this program.

St. Louis City residents applying for elementary schools in the City should also apply as early as possible to be considered for Help for Today, Hope for Tomorrow.

Approximately 350 new awards will be available.

- Individual students may not receive more than one scholarship if awarded. However, Catholic Families Tuition Assistance and
  Parish Employees Endowment Fund are tuition aid programs that may be awarded in addition to another scholarship. Families
  may have multiple children receiving scholarships.
- Documents needed to complete applications include:
  - Proof of Income: Adjusted gross income (taxes or W2) and any other assistance you may receive (including but not limited to Child Support, Food Stamps, and Social Security)
  - High School Students are required to submit responses to two short-answer questions and contact information for two references at the time of application to be considered for the Beyond Sunday Fellows Program.
