ne of my favorite pop culture characters as a young Jesuit in the 1990's was Reverend Lovejoy the long-suffering pastor in *The Simpsons*. A favorite episode was his attempt to co-opt

the influence of the Super Bowl on his

Lenten Gathering Rite

Lent is a season of preparation for the great feast of Easter, in which we are invited to pause and ponder the quality of our relationship with God and others...to celebrate the good we find there and to seek forgiveness and reconciliation for what is lacking. The traditional Lenten disciplines – prayer, fasting and almsgiving – provide us the contours and practices for the conversion we seek.

During this penitential season the Gathering Rite we will sing gently implores, "Gather us in mercy, Lord. From the depths we cry to you." The presider will invite the assembly to either kneel or bow our heads during the penitential rite. Either posture is a way of helping us bodily recognize and acknowledge our need for God's mercy. Doing this together further underlines the communal nature of our Lenten journey of conversion and of our need for one another. **Our bodies, our voices, our hearts unite in humility and**

Parish Lenten Book - Signs: Seven Words of Hope, by Jean Varnier

Signs

Jean Vanier founded the first L'Arche community over fifty years ago. These are now part of a worldwide network of small group homes where people with learning disabilities share their life with others who help each other live in freedom and dignity. A number of our parishioners are actively involved in three L'Arche homes in the St. Louis area.

Out of the wisdom Vanier brings from his experience at L'Arche, he suggests seven paths of hope for both our own personal transformation, and a transformation of our often ailing Church: a path from humiliation to humility; from conformity to conscience; from exclusion to encounter; from power to authority; from isolation to community; from strength to vulnerability; from secret to mystery. With seven short chapters full of wisdom and experience, it is a perfect book for reflection during Lent.

The book is available in the ballroom on Sunday mornings for \$10. Books may also be purchased on Amazon, and e-book versions may be purchased on Amazon and ibooks.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atria Open House

Join us Sunday, Feb. 25 after 10:30 Mass for a tour of our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atria. This is a Montessori based program for the young child that helps them fall in love with God. Come to the Mary altar in the front of Church immediately following Mass and a catechist will direct you to the atria.

LENTEN DIRECTIVES

Jesus said, "Whoever wishes to be my follower must deny his very self, take up his cross each day and follow in my steps." (Lk 9:23)

The Church helps us fulfill these words by prescribing penitential practices for all Catholics. The American Bishops have called us to fast and abstinence during Lent. Fasting is a sign of our complete dependence upon God. Ash Wednesday (Feb. 14) and Good Friday (March 30) are days of fasting for those ages 18-59. Fasting means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). Abstinence from meat invites us to join the poor of the world in eating simply. Ash Wednesday and all Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat. All who are 14 years of age and older, unless there is a serious health problem, are asked to share in this discipline. In addition, everyone is encouraged to find ways during Lent to draw closer to God though prayer and spiritual practices. Consider being part of one of our Lenten book discussion groups, and embracing the daily practice of praying the Examen as ways to deepen your relationship with God and with others in Christ's Body.
