FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

his Sunday at the 10:30 liturgy we will celebrate First Communion with

our children. It is one of our most joyful events in the parish year. What began in baptism is now deepened for our second graders as they receive the Bread of Life

By a happy coincidence, the Gospel we hear is the story of the Good Shepherd. Many of our children began their faith formation here at College Church through the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. Their very first understanding of Jesus began with this image, and now they will be truly fed through the Eucharist provided by the Good Shepherd.

Jesus says in today's Gospel, "I know mine and mine know me." What a great gift to be truly and ultimately known! The Good Shepherd protects the sheep from harm, and provides for them in every way. Unlike the hired man, he does this because he knows and cares for the sheep. Who we are at our deepest core is beloved by Jesus.

This relationship is not simply one way, however. The sheep know the Good Shepherd. Jesus opens himself to us. We believe in the incredible truth that God is made vulnerable on our behalf. This is what Jesus refers to elsewhere in St. John's Gospel as "abiding" or "remaining" in him. That is the source not just of 1st Communion, but all communion.





THE OFFERTORY PROCESSION: WHAT IS IT THAT WE BRING TO THE ALTAR?

What is it that we bring to the altar? In preparation for First Communion this year, we have spent significant time with the children reflecting on this question. The "simple" answer is bread and wine. And yet, when we begin to ponder the bread and wine, the richness of these gifts unfolds.

One of the insights that we have come to this year in our preparation is that all of creation is a gift from God to us, but that creation is not finished yet. It is a part of God's plan that the human beings have a special role in the ongoing work of creation, in the transformation of creation. By the work of our hands, we take the gift of wheat and make bread; we take grapes and make wine. Our work brings the creation of the earth to a new place. It represents all the gifts that we've received from God that we transform "by the work of our hands" - our cooking, our cleaning, our drawing, our skating, our playing sports, our befriending, our reading, our studying, our loving. We present our whole lives to God at the altar and ask God to transform them, to fill them - that God's presence may shine through them.

As part of today's celebration, the children who are making their First Communion will bring up in the Presentation of the Gifts symbols of the "work of their hands." They will lay them at the foot of the altar as a visible image of what the offering of the bread and wine represent to them: the offering of their daily lives on behalf of God's gifts.

On Tuesday, April 3, an audience of 40 gathered in the ballroom of College Church to commemorate the life of former parishioner and Just Faith advocate at College Church - Tony McDonald. The evening also happened to be the final meeting for a group of thirteen people who were finishing the 24 session "Just Faith" program. Beginning in September, participants with hopes to put their Catholic faith towards local justice initiatives met weekly to discuss and act together towards this goal. Throughout the year, the group read several memoirs recounting the lives of people involved in counteracting injustices in our community, America and other parts of the world. We also read detailed accounts of poverty and its relationship to injustice in the United States, and Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato Si, among various other articles. We met not only to discuss readings but also to hear from a myriad of guest speakers who visited us to introduce their efforts to promote justice in St. Louis. From local farming initiatives, to homeless outreach, to English language training for refugees, there was ample opportunity to learn about what St. Louisans are doing to improve their city. What this writer gained from the program cannot be separated from the friendships fostered within the group itself. For a transplant to St. Louis, Just Faith proffered a unique, meaningful and memorable introduction to the city.


