FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

hat do communism and St. Joseph share?

A "feast" day actually. Tuesday, May I is the feast of St. Joseph the Worker. It is also May Day, or International Workers Day. Socialists and communists in the late 19th century established that day to promote workers' rights. The emergence of the Soviet Union made this an especially significant day throughout the communist world.

It was only in 1955 that a counter-feast day was created by the Catholic Church in honor of St. Joseph the Worker. Pope Pius XII celebrated St. Joseph as a "model worker" in his labors as a carpenter. He was dedicated to work and providing for his family. Fun fact: my parish growing up was the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Worker.

Today, one of the few things people across the political spectrum can agree on is the need for good jobs with good wages and benefits. There is a great fear that the widening gap of income among workers will become a permanent fixture. Such anxiety and concern needs to be addressed by people of faith.

There is no divinely ordained way to structure a labor force or run an economy. However, the dignity of the person, a just wage, a concern for the impact on the environment, and special care for those at the margins are all elements of our Catholic vision of work. This week provides a good reminder of those values.
